Course Highlights

- Become recognized as a Scouting America Certified Angling Instructor and receive an Official Train the Trainer Certification CS-61 and a CAI patch.
- Learn basic fishing and fly-fishing skills including fly casting, fly tying, knots, and how to teach them. Receive the materials to assist you in delivering the program as well as online resource locations.
- As a CAI you will have the opportunity to get fishing and fly-fishing equipment at greatly reduced rates for teaching Scouts.

Participants will

- Understand available resources for unit angler education program development to inspire member recruitment and retention.
