# LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

## **NATIONAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP TRAINING (NYLT)**

National Youth Leadership Training is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.

NYLT is a six-day course. Content is delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment. Interconnecting concepts and work processes are introduced early, built upon, and aided by the use of memory aids, which allows participants to understand and employ the leadership skills much faster.

Through activities, presentations, challenges, discussions, and audio-visual support, NYLT participants will be engaged in a unified approach to leadership that will give them the skill and confidence to lead well. Through a wide range of activities, games, and adventures, participants will work and play together as they put into action the best Scouting has to offer.

## SUMMER CAMP STAFF

Being a member of the Seven Ranges Camp Staff is not only a job but a preparation for life. This life-changing opportunity is a great, fun, and rewarding place to be. Imagine living at a camp for the summer and working, playing, and learning in the outdoors. You'll meet plenty of new friends, some that may stick with you for the rest of your life. You'll have great new experiences, too, as you challenge yourself.

Working on camp staff offers you the opportunity to learn new skills, while improving your public speaking, teaching classes, managing projects or becoming certified in a skill such as CPR, lifeguarding, or shooting sports.

### REQUIREMENTS FOR WORKING ON CAMP STAFF:

- Submit a staff application
- Include dates of availability; the summer season runs from the last week in May to the end of July.
- The minimum age for working at summer camp is 15 years old.
- Our staff also includes Counselors in Training (CITs), who can be 14 years old, and will volunteer for up to four weeks during the summer.
- Applicants must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America or agree to register prior to camp beginning.

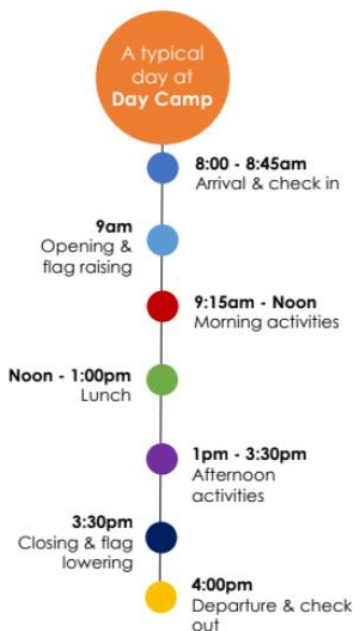
## CUB SCOUT DAY CAMP

This program is for Scouts who want to experience all the fun of camp and sleep in their own bed at night. Buckeye Council offers Day Camp programs in various communities throughout the council territory. Day Camp runs Monday through Friday OR Monday through Wednesday where Scouts will arrive at camp each morning and head home in the afternoon. Activities include shooting BB guns and bows and arrows, playing games, and exploring nature! Cub Scouts will earn various activity adventure loops and advancements while attending camp to kick start their upcoming program year. ## ABOUT THE CAMP

Camp Akela is home to the Buckeye Council's Cub Scout Summer Camp. The Akela pavilion provides dining facilities, indoor restrooms, and acts as the main gathering spot in camp. Camp Akela has a beautiful amphitheater overlooking the Schoolhouse Pond, three spacious camping areas, and a large activity field. A recently added field sports area gives Cub Scouts the opportunity to shoot BB guns and/or bows and arrows, under the supervision of a trained range officer.





# SCOUT SUMMER CAMP

— 7 days / 6 nights —

The Summer Camp Program at Seven Ranges is designed to provide the adventure, fun and activities that are promised to every youth that joins Scouting. Scout Summer Camp is open to all Scouts BSA youth who are ages 11 -17, or completed the 5th grade. While at camp, Scouts have the opportunity to put into action the skills that they have practiced year-round within their own troop. Summer Camp is the proving ground for the "preferred method" of Scout camping: a troop operating under its own leadership. Time will be given for each Scout to work on personal advancement. There will be troop and patrol time, as well as time for Scouts to explore a range of personal interests. Scouts will have the opportunity to earn approximately **three merit badges** while at camp!

If you're interested in attending Scout Summer Camp, talk with your unit leader as troops register as a group. For example, youth must pay their fees to the troop leadership, and then the troop registers and pays for the youth. Participants do not register directly with the Buckeye Council, unless they are a scout registering to be a part of the provisional troop.

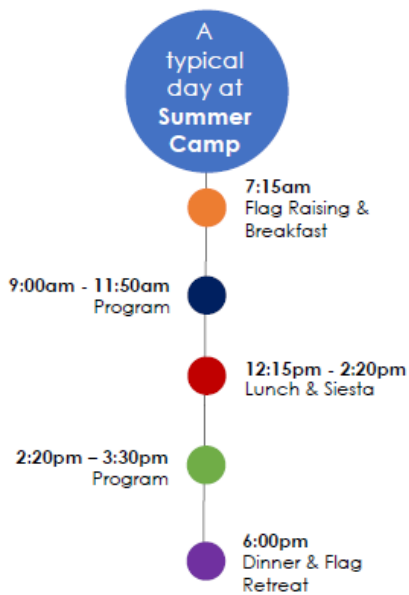

## WHAT IS THE JAMBOREE?

It's a gathering of approximately 45,000 Scouts, leaders, and staff that showcases everything that is great about the BSA and its members. Over the course of 10 summer days, once every four years, the Boy Scouts of America comes together at The Summit to have an experience of a lifetime. Located on a sprawling 10,600 acres, the Summit includes more than 5 miles of zip line and challenge courses, 36 miles of mountain bike trails, and 13 acres of shooting sports ranges, as well as venues for kayaking, rock climbing, bouldering, skateboarding, BMX, and various other activities. **Now is your opportunity to join in on the fun and attend the 2023 National Scout Jamboree!**

The Buckeye Council National Scout Jamboree Contingent will consist of Scouts and leaders from across the Council. **Hurry! There are limited spots left!**

## Youth qualifications to attend the National Scout Jamboree include:

- Registered member of a Scout Troop or Venture Crew, who is at least 12 years old by 7/19/2023, but who has not yet reached their 21st birthday by 7/28/2023.
- Must live and abide by the Scout Oath and Law.
- Must abide by the Jamboree Code of Conduct.

## Adult qualifications to attend the National Scout Jamboree include:

- Be willing and able to dedicate significant time and effort to recruit youth participants and prepare the contingent for the jamboree.
- **Time Commitment:** Monthly meetings and two Saturday orientation meetings ensure that the contingent is prepared for an experience of a lifetime.
- Be a currently registered member of a Scout Troop and be Youth Protection Trained within 6 months of the start of the Jamboree
- Have taken the following trainings: Hazardous Weather and Safety Afloat

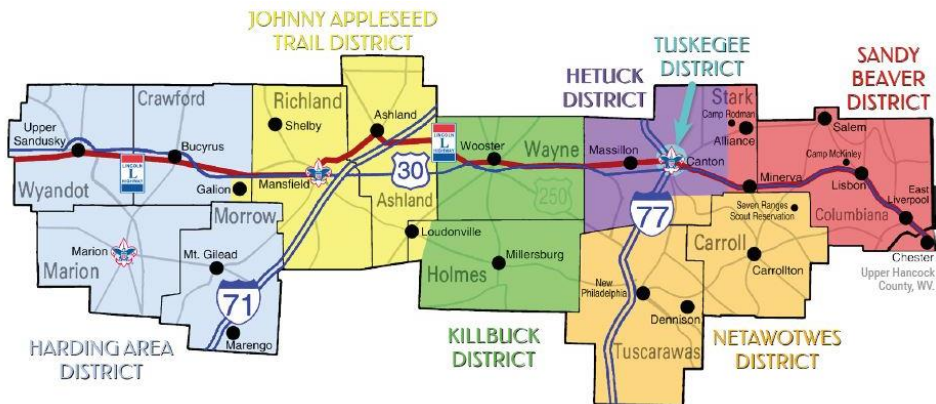
