Saturday's program will feature lots of dinosaur-themed games and activities as well as opportunities for fishing and shooting sports.

## What is Family Camp?

Family camp is an outdoor experience for the entire family to enjoy. The purpose is to have fun! Camping is available, but not mandatory. If you do choose to camp, we will assign you a campsite based on the size of your unit attending with you, but you will need to provide your own camping equipment and food. We provide the facilities and program materials.

## Medical Forms

Everyone attending camp must complete the Scouting America Annual Health and Medical Record Part A and B. Part B is two pages, so you should have a total of three pages for each person. You don't need to turn these forms in at check-in, but should instead keep them with you in case something were to happen. Forms can be found by following this link:

## Each Cub Scout should attend with at least one of their parents/guardians 18 years or older.

Like in other Cub Scout programs, Lions and Tigers **must** attend with a parent or guardian. For other ranks, if a parent or guardian is unable to attend, a Cub Scout may participate under the supervision of another registered adult member in Scouting who is a parent of a Cub Scout who is also attending. The unit leader and a parent or legal guardian must agree to the arrangement, and all Youth Protection policies apply. At no time may another adult accept responsibility for more than one additional “nonfamily member” youth.

## Campsites

Based on pre-registration, participants from the same pack will be placed together in a campsite. Each site has a shelter and campfire ring. There is no electricity in any of the sites. Please let us know if there are any special needs regarding campsites via the ‘Notes’ field in the online registration and we will do our best to accommodate.

## Campfires

Campfires may only be built in existing fire rings or in an above-ground fire pit. Use only dead and downed wood collected around your site, or wood purchased within 50 miles of camp. Do not burn any other materials like trash. Do not leave your lit campfire unattended. Try to burn all wood to ashes and remove any unburned debris from the ring when you break camp. Do not dispose of hot or warm ashes in the woods or in your trash bag. Put out your fire with water and stir the ashes around until cool to the touch.

## Shower House

There is a shower house with restrooms next to the pool. Each room is single user, so there are no designated male/female, adult/youth facilities. Campers are asked to be respectful of others and try to leave these as clean as possible for the next user. The showers and wash basins have hot water. There will be a porta-john at each campsite. Please keep

## Vehicles

No vehicles are permitted to stay at campsites unless prearranged for those with medical conditions. You may unload your vehicle at your campsite, but you must return it to the parking lot. Trailers are allowed to remain at the campsite. Please exercise extreme caution driving around camp. Roads must remain clear and open for emergency vehicles at all times.

## Camp Rules

- Live by the Scout Oath and Law and follow the Guide to Safe Scouting.
- Practice Leave No Trace camping.
- All campers must use the buddy system. Don't just know where your buddy is, be with your buddy.
- No alcoholic beverages are allowed on camp property.
- No smoking near Scouts, around or in buildings, tents or on property.
- No vehicles are allowed to stay at campsites unless cleared for medical purposes.
- No youth may use or carry axes or pocket knives. No sheath knives at all.
- No cutting live trees or marking camp property.
- Shoes must always be worn. No open-toed shoes or flipflops.
- If you need to leave camp, check out at Meacham. Check back in at Meacham upon your return.
- Fishing is catch and release. No license is needed.
- Do not throw rocks into the lakes and do not leave fishing poles on the ground.
- Range officers have final say of when a person can shoot. Listen to them.
- Pets are not part of Scouting activities. Please make other arrangements for your pets. Please advise if someone in your group requires a service animal.

## Directions to Camp Arrowhead

Directions to Camp Arrowhead: The address is 4200 Boy Scout Camp Rd, Ona, WV. From I-64, take Exit 20 (Huntington Mall), proceed south to US Rt 60 and turn East at the light. Go 1.4 miles East on US Rt 60 to the second traffic light and turn left onto Blue Sulphur Road. Proceed 1.6 miles to Scout Camp Rd. (It is marked with a green Camp Arrowhead sign on the right.) Turn right onto Scout Camp Rd and follow it to the camp entrance. At the entrance bear to the right, following the gravel road into the parking lot. Check-in is located at Meacham Lodge which is beside the parking lot.
