Course	Course Description	
B00	The purpose of the Life to Eagle Seminar to help clear up any confusion Scouts, Parents and Leaders might have about the process of earning Eagle. Topics covered are: "How to pick an Eagle Project and what makes a good Eagle Project", "Skills for how to lead your Eagle Project.", "Project Workbook and the Eagle Rank Application."	
B01	All of the secret ingredients for a Perfect Troop Campout. Opportunities to share ideas with fellow Scouters.	
B02	How to help the Patrol Leaders plan fun and effective troop meetings.	
B03	Tips and techniques for developing skills for this critical role and a bit of myth-busting concerning the Scoutmaster conference.	
B04	The goal of this course is to introduce the concept of Outdoor Ethics in a fun and engaging way to a group with little experience in outdoor ethics. This course focuses on the seven principles of Leave No Trace and how to apply them in the BSA outdoor program. The course will also help leaders assess youth understanding and skills when signing off on scout rank requirements or Venturing award requirements. This course is ideal for Outdoor Ethics Guides and Scouters. *This course will also fulfill the requirement for the Outdoor Ethics Awareness award.	
B08	This class is intended for District Advancement Reps and adult coaches/mentors that coach Life scouts who are navigating their way to the rank of Eagle Scout. We will review some of the common pitfalls that can result in delays and even denial of the rank. After this class you will be able to guide scouts through the project, application, and board of review phases, resulting in successful advancement to the rank of Eagle Scout.	
B13	This course will introduce the Scout/Venture Catholic Religious Emblems and provide information to prospective Emblem Counselors/Facilitators regarding ways to work with the young people and cover the Youth Protection Requirements of the Catholic Church. The Ad Altari Dei and Pope Pius XII Emblems are available for Scouts and all Venture Crew members, both male and female. Additional training will be required to become certified by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.	
B14	Learn how to have a successful Patrol Leaders' Council meeting - the beginning of a successful program.	
B15	Learn from the best of the best. How to make that Board of Review less stressful for the Scout and more effective.	
B18	A good SPL and strong PLC do not happen by accident. Make sure you are supporting the training progression of your youth to ensure your Unit has the best in Youth Leadership.	
C01	Proven methods and tips for great Pack campouts. Ideas for where to go, and programming in the outdoors.	
C03	(Cub Focus) The goal of this course is to introduce the concept of Outdoor Ethics in a fun and engaging way to a group with little experience in outdoor ethics. This course focuses on the seven principles of Leave No Trace and how to apply them in the BSA outdoor program. We will introduce tools and engaging games for cubs. This course is ideal for Den Leaders and Cubmasters. *This course will also fulfill the requirement for the Outdoor Ethics Awareness award.	
C04	Moving from Cub Scouts to Scouts BSA- what do I need to know? Are all troops the same? How do I pick a troop?	
C05	Helping leaders with children who have adhd. How to keep their attention, help them grow, use adhd as a strength in scouting. After the small presentation, there's time for discussion on questions.	
C07	Using the National Program, learn different delivery methods, explore the Den and Pack resource guide, and discover how to make this program meet the needs of your Cubs.	
C11	Learn how a Scouts BSA troop functions - the similarities and differences compared to Cub Scouts. Ideal for Cubmasters and Den Leaders to understand the progression of the Scouting program as the youth advance, and how to be better able to prepare Arrow of Light Scouts for the Scouts BSA program. (Recommended to also take C14, Arrow of Light to Scouts BSA Transition)	
C13	Did you know there are other kit style derbies that your Pack can run? Learn about Space Derby, Rain gutter Regatta as well as Pinewood Derby.	
C14	Discuss ways to promote troops to Arrow of Lights and to help Arrow of Light Scouts find a troop that's a good fit for them; ways to help prepare Arrow of Light Scouts for Scouts BSA; and ideas for Arrow of Light and Crossing Over. (Assumes some prior knowledge of Scouts BSA or have taken Intro to Scouts BSA for Cub Leaders, C11.)	

C15	Cub Leaders, want to use Den Chiefs, but aren't sure how? Want to have a better experience versus last time? Come learn about the ways to maximize the effectiveness of a Den Chief in your Pack or Den.	
C17	These Emblems are a joint activity between the Cub Scout and his parents. This one-hour introduction course covers Religious Emblem Coordinator responsibilities and Roman Catholic Youth Protection Requirements. Additional training will be required to become certified by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.	
E01	Adult Religious Awards are a relatively unknown way of recognizing those who help Scouts with the 12th Point of the Scout Law.	
E02	Practical tips for girl only and co-ed Packs, Troops, Ships and Crews	
E03	Millions of young people participate in one or more shooting sports annually—archery, rifle shooting, shotgun activities, etc.—guided by adult volunteers who have the skills and knowledge to provide quality programs in a safe and effective way. Learn about DBC's shooting sports facilities and adult certification trainings.	
E07	This class will focus on working with scouts with special needs and disabilities. We will cover resources as well as how it affects a unit's program and advancement. This class will cover all age groups from Cub Scouting to Venturing.	
E09	This class will cover all age groups from Cub Scouting to Venturing.	
E10	Keep it relevant. We will discuss ways to meet your youth where they are and support their growth in their Duty to God as a Scouting leader or Unit Chaplain	
E11	Having trouble using Scout Book? This open forum will be designed to answer any and all questions you may have and may even teach you a thing or two about Scout Book. The forum is open to Scout Book users of all different leadership backgrounds and experience levels!	
E13	Most of us are familiar with recognizing Scouts as they advance in rank. Some of are also familiar with religious awards and the training awards that Scouters receive to recognize their achievements as they are trained to better serve Scouts. On the other hand, many of us aren't aware of the many ways Scouting can recognize accomplishments by Scouts and Scouters. This presentation will discuss some of the less known awards in the Scouting program that recognize accomplishments that help deliver our program.	
E14	Adult responsibilities in promoting religious emblems, coaching and conducting BSA Interfaith services, and more.	
E15	This class will teach you the basics of fishing. BSA has just added fishing as an elective to all Cub Scout ranks. This class will prepare you to help your scouts when they go fishing.	
E17	Learn how to plan and execute successful high adventure trips for your unit. We will cover youth involvement in the planning process, program selection, recruiting, training, financial management	
E19	STEM skills, knowledge and experience are important to developing productive citizens and leaders. We will discuss current and future forces and how we can support STEM development in the youth we serve.
