9:30 am: Camp inspectors will be patrolling the camping areas to facilitate campsite inspections prior to check out.

All Units are expected to check out by 11 am. Health forms will be returned and patches will be provided upon successful check out, post campsite inspection.

Policies and Procedures: While on Camp Naish property, all campers are expected to follow camp policies to maintain the beauty of camp and to guarantee the safety of all.

Read below to understand the housekeeping and logistical details of the weekend. Following these points will ensure our 2025 Mini Camp Adventure goes as smooth as possible!

Registration: All attendees must be registered prior to attending. Units may substitute attendees prior to registration closing. Late Registration will be handled on a case-by-case basis by calling the HOAC Office. Check-in and collection of health forms will take place at the Camp Naish Dining Hall. One leader and the SPL should check in the Troop.

Camping: Unit Camping will be in the North Meadow and Clarks Fork.

Parking: Parking will be available in the Cub World parking, Cheyenne Parking lot, lower lot in Central Camp and Clarks fork lot.

Medical and First Aid: First aid will be at the Dining Hall. Individual units should handle minor injuries. Additional first aid assistance will be provided by the medical officer. Units Must provide Health Form A, B1 and B2 for each attendee. Staff will redistribute at the end of the event.

Wristbands: All attendees must wear the wristband that is given at check-in. If an individual is found not wearing a wristband, refer them to Staff.

Cooking and Fires: Unless there is a burn ban, fires must be contained in each unit's own barrel or grill, and have a filled water safety bucket at the fire. Some fire grill units are available at camp. Units will need to bring and cook their own food (dinner Friday, Breakfast/ Lunch/ Dinner Saturday, Breakfast Sunday).

Trash: All units should take their trash with them or deposit in a Camp

Naish dumpster(s), located at the Maintenance barn or behind the Central Camp Dining Hall.

Weather: If the weather at camp becomes a danger or heavy inconvenience to the activities or campers on reservation, the shelters around Naish will be put into use. Remember to pack appropriate clothing for Midwest weather, such as rain gear and jackets.

Driving on reservation MUST be kept to a minimum. When driving, please follow all speed limits. One Scout's life is worth all your time.

Carpooling is recommended for these large events, as it speeds up the time it takes to check everyone in, as well as takes up less space in the parking lot.
