GOAL: The Sunflower District welcomes Webelos, Arrow of Light, and Scouts from the Jayhawk Area Council to experience the Scouting patrol method. Webelos and Arrow of Light scouts will work alongside Troop Level BSA scouts to complete outdoor adventures and better prepare themselves for a successful crossover.

The fee for Cub Scouts is \$25. The fee for adults and Youth BSA Staff is \$15.
\$5 dollars will be added to each registration received after September 4th, 2026.

CHECK-IN: All units check in at the office upon arrival. BSA Health Forms A&B are required for **all individuals**.

Shooting Sports Waivers are required for individuals utilizing the ranges.

Troops: Check in / set up 6:00–8pm on Friday, September 25th.

Packs: Check in / set up 7:30–9am on Saturday, September 26. The event starts 9:00am.

PACKS: All Webelo and Arrow of Light Scouts will work on requirements for multiple adventures. ***Activity Completion Maps*** for both Webelos and AOL activities will be online under the “resources link” for this event in the same place where you registered. Cub Scouts will complete all of the activities offered for their current scout rank by following those guides.

TROOPS: Scouting America troops will support and guide an assigned Patrol through activities Saturday. Please come prepared to review the BSA Ten Essentials and to help coordinate a patrol skit for the campfire program.

Troop volunteers are the backbone of this event to make the activities fun and meaningful for the Webelos and AOLs. Troops will run stations for the scouts to rotate through as they complete requirements for their outdoor adventures. Please see the schedule for station options and notify patrickashsw@gmail.com of your top preferences. Stations will be assigned first come, first served.

MEAL PLANNING: This event will cover BOTH Lunch and Dinner for Saturday! Yay! This plan leaves only Friday dinner and Saturday breakfast for Troops to cover. Troops should make their own plans regarding these two meals.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Fire Barrels are going to be utilized within stations and will be in short supply. Bring your fire barrel!!!

Saturday Dinner: Patrols will work together for dinner to complete their “Chef’s Knife” activity. Adult Supervision and Troop member involvement will be needed immediately prior to the meal as dinner is being prepared/finished by the patrols.

CAMPING: All scouts will use the Camp Delaware activity field location to set up their tents. All space is first come, first served. Full restroom facilities are located within the area.

Troops: will stake tents on the **WEST** side of the field.

Packs: will stake tents on the **EAST** side of the field.

RESPECT AND BEHAVIOR: Please respect the privacy of neighboring campers. All participants are expected to conduct themselves as Scouts. Every individual at camp is to follow the Scout Oath and Scout Law regarding their neighbors and themselves. Nighttime activities should be supervised and are at the discretion of the Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, or Senior Patrol Leader. To help everyone get plenty of rest, we will be observing the following evening schedule:

10:00 PM Lights Out - Scouts should be settled into their tents and lights should be turned off.

11:00 PM Quiet Camp - By 11:00 PM, we ask that all movement around camp has stopped and that everyone remains in their sleeping areas. Please keep conversations and activity to an absolute minimum so that those who are sleeping are not disturbed.

These quiet hours are required for the event, and we appreciate everyone helping us make sure they are followed. We know evenings at camp can be a lot of fun, but getting enough rest is important for everyone to have a safe and enjoyable weekend.

Thank you for helping us make this a great experience for our younger Scouts!

PARKING: ALL Parking at Camp Delaware is DROP OFF ONLY.

All Motor Vehicles MUST be moved back to the Welcome Center Parking Center near registration. Vehicles MUST be moved following Tent set up UNLESS the vehicle has a clearly visible disability placard/plate.

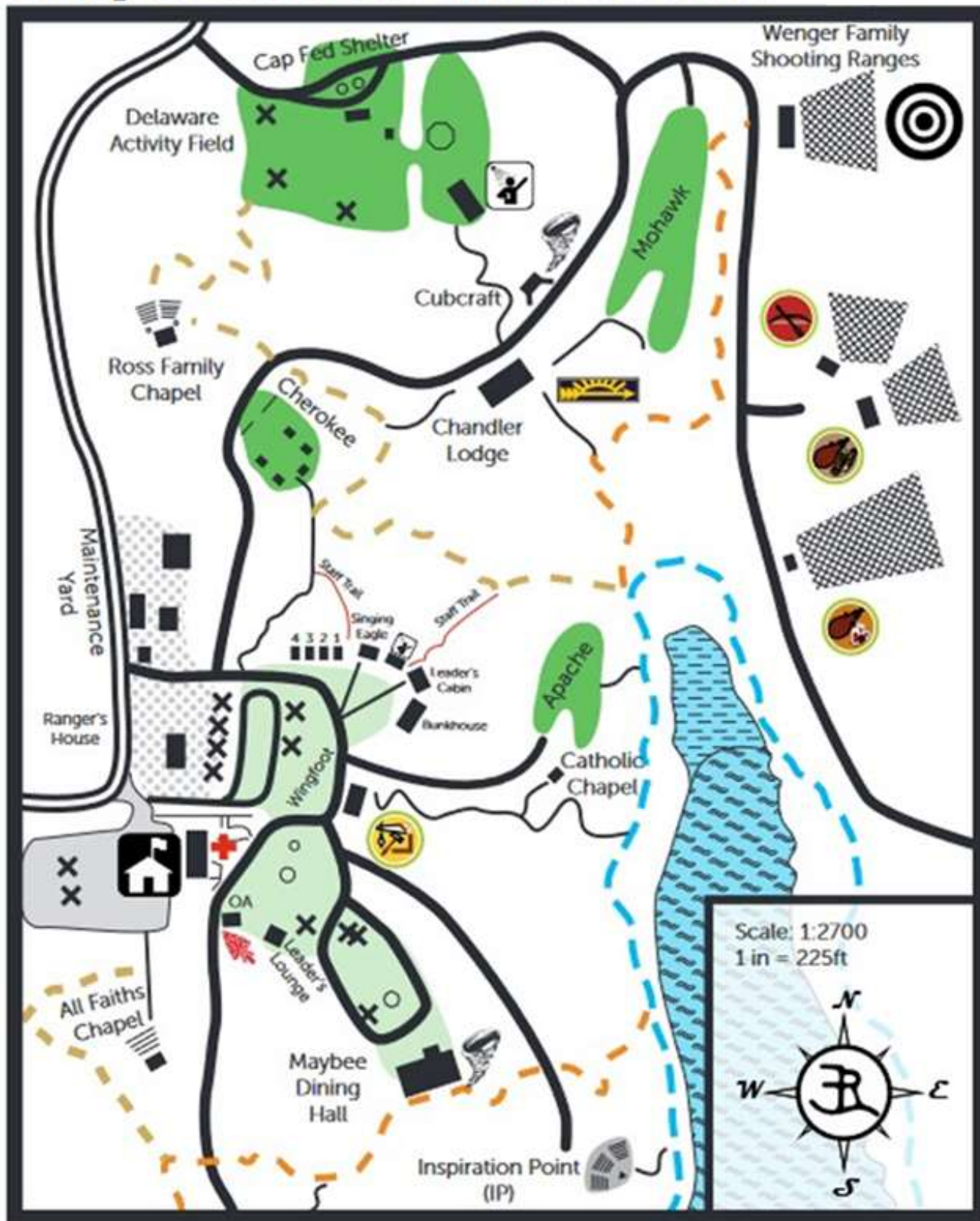

Camp Delaware & Parade Grounds

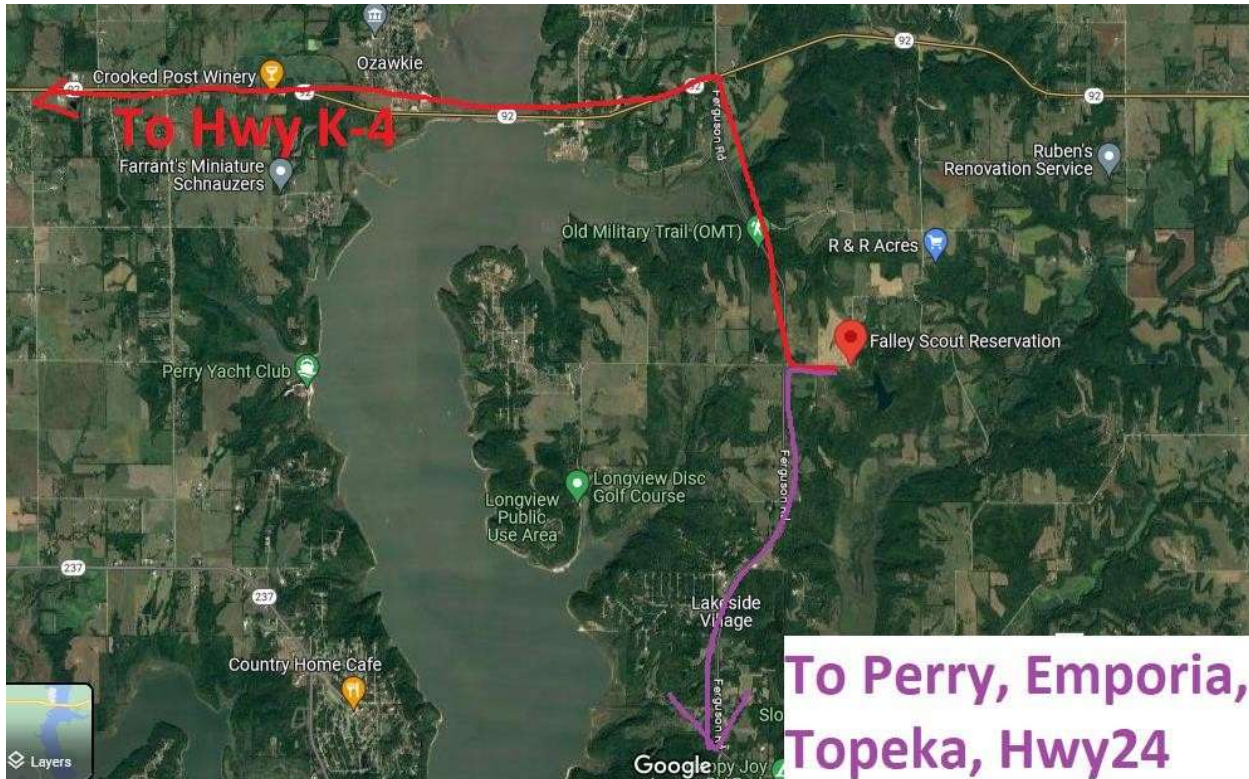


GETTING THERE:
