Course Requirements: Completion of 10 additional courses of instruction (total of 24) at least five of the

courses at the Doctorate or Continuing Education program level. Courses may

not have previously been counted toward other college degrees.

Thesis or Project: It is recommended that the topic of a project or thesis be directly related to unit

service. There may be specific circumstances under which a topic related to another area of Scouting would be appropriate. Local councils have the authority to approve topics related to another area of Scouting when selecting one directly related to unit service isn't appropriate or practical. The council commissioner or designee may authorize an alternate topic. This can be on any topic related to

Commissioner Service.

The topic must be pre-approved by the college of commissioner science committee.

Complete the thesis/project using the approved format as determined by the college.

The topic and final paper must be approved by the doctoral review committee.

All segments (proposal, proposal acceptance, thesis/project completion, thesis acceptance) of the degree must be approved by the college of commissioner science

Commissioner Performance:

Serve for at least one year on the college of commissioner science staff (instructor or support staff), or work with training support for commissioners for at least one year.
