Degree Program Overview

The Samoset Council University of Scouting (UoS) degree program offers adult Scouters the knowledge and skills to build a high-quality Scouting program through interactive classes led by experienced "Professors." Participation is completely voluntary.

Beginning this year, students may submit prior course participation for consideration toward a higher degree. New attendees may apply for the Associate degree if requirements are met. All higher-degree requests will be reviewed by the UoS 2026 Chancellor and a select committee.

Associate Degree (Black Patch)

1. It is recommended that you are fully trained in your registered leader position.
2. Complete 6 classes as an Associate's degree candidate.

Bachelor's Degree (Green Patch)

1. It is recommended that you are fully trained in your registered leader position.
2. Hold an Associate's degree prior to registering for classes.
3. Complete a minimum of 6 classes as a Bachelor's degree candidate.
4. Attendance at the "Earning an Advanced Degree" pre-requisite is recommended.

Master's Degree (Purple Patch)

Pre-requisite: Complete "Earning an Advanced Degree" session.

1. Be fully trained in your registered leader position.
2. Hold a Bachelor's degree prior to registering for classes.
3. Enroll in the UoS Master's Degree program & teach a qualified session at the UoS that year.
4. Complete a minimum of three classes as a Master's degree candidate (in addition to the three earned for teaching a course).
5. With agreement from your advisor, complete ONE of the following:
 - a. Teach BSA training at a district or council training event approved by your advisor (in addition to requirement #3).
 - b. Attend Wood Badge.

Doctoral Degree (Blue Patch)

1. Be fully trained in your registered leader position.
2. Hold a Master's Degree prior to registering for classes.
3. Enroll in the UoS Doctoral Degree program and teach a qualified session at UoS that year.
4. Complete a minimum of three classes as a doctoral candidate.
5. With agreement from your advisor, complete ONE of the following:
 - a. Staff a council leadership training course (such as Wood Badge or NYLT).
 - b. Actively serve on the council training committee for a full year.
 - c. Serve in the role as University of Scouting Dean or Chancellor.
 - d. Staff a national training course (such as Philmont Training Center or National Camp School, WB/NYLT/PH Course Dir. Conf.).
 - e. Staff and teach a national training event (such as a National Jamboree, OA National Leadership Seminar, or OA National Order of the Arrow Conference).
