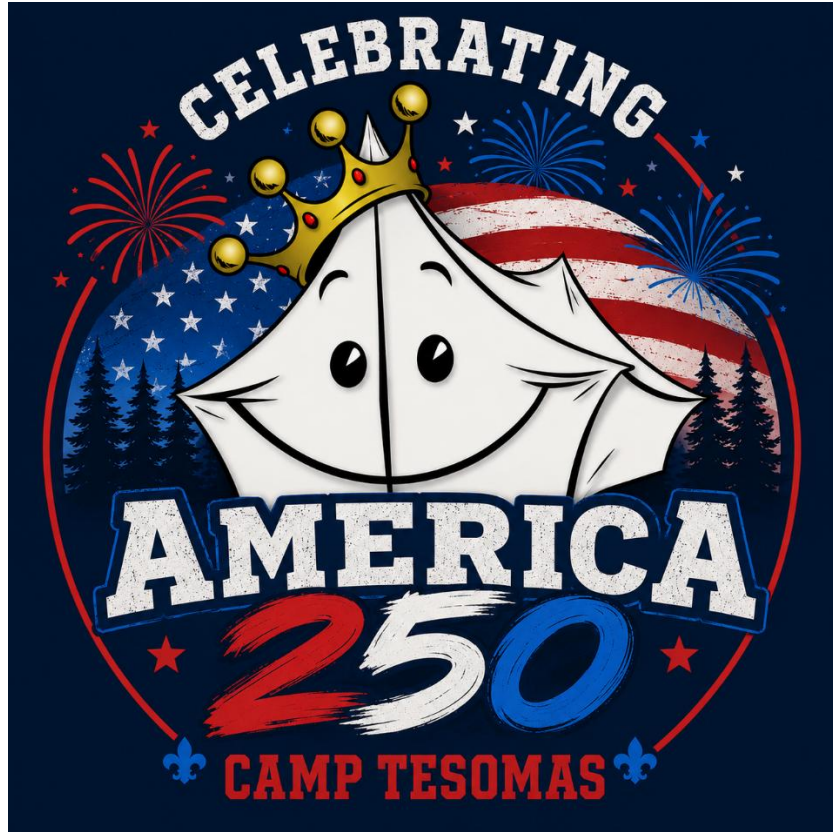

REGISTRATION

Registration for all youth and adults attending the Jamboree is handled at the unit level. Whether camping the whole weekend or just attending Saturday, the fee for each participant is \$25.00. This fee includes all the Jamboree activities on Saturday, lunch, dinner, a patch, as well as the special evening show.

Friends and family members who wish to visit the Jamboree for the day on Saturday should register with their unit. All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be currently registered as an adult volunteer or an adult program participant. Adult volunteers must register in the position(s) they are serving in. Limited exceptions for Cub Scout overnight programs.

Online registration is open on the Samoset website and will close September 15. Please visit www.samoset.org/events. Registration fees are transferable but not refundable.

The Jamboree is a rain or shine event. No refunds for inclement weather.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Medical

- Every participant must complete a Scouting Health form parts A & B. Troops will complete these online using the same portal as summer camp. Cub Scout packs should bring copies of completed forms to turn in at check-in.
- Units can keep medication in a locked container at their site and distribute to their scouts. Units choosing to do so will be provided with a medication log sheet to fill out and turn in at the end of the weekend. Units are welcome to turn their medications into the health office for us to distribute.
- Bee sting medication, inhalers, an insulin syringe, or other medication or device used in the event of life-threatening situations may be carried by a camper.

Inherent Dangers

- Campers should be prepared for conditions beyond the camp's control. Natural hazards such as rocks, roots, and branches require caution. To prevent animal visits, do not keep food, drinks, or scented items in or near tents.
- To avoid loss or theft, leave valuables at home or store them securely in vehicles.

Safeguarding Youth

- The safety of our youth is our top priority. Any form of child abuse is unacceptable. Scouting America is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for all and works every day to protect youth through required safety policies.
- One-on-one contact between adults and youth is prohibited.
- Youth privacy must be respected, especially in changing and shower areas.
- Cameras, drones, or recording devices are prohibited where privacy is expected.
- Separate tenting is required for male and female adults and youth. Youth sharing tents must be within two years of age. Spouses may share tents.
- The buddy system must be used at all times. Buddies should choose each other, be comfortable together, and be within two years of age with similar maturity.

- Hazing and initiations are prohibited.
- Bullying of any kind—verbal, physical, or cyber—is prohibited.
- All sexual activity and public displays of affection are prohibited.
- Appropriate attire is required for all activities.

Smoking

- Smoking is only allowed away from Scouts and other Leaders in the maintenance yard.
- This includes the use of electronic cigarettes, personal vaporizers, or electronic nicotine delivery systems that simulate tobacco smoking.

Privacy

- By participating in Samoset Council activities, you agree to allow Samoset Council to use your image in camp and council promotional materials.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Are you New to Tesomas?

- Bring your own tents; tents are not provided.
- All Scouts BSA adults must be registered Scouting members.
- Cell phone coverage is generally good for Verizon and AT&T users.

First Aid:

All injuries should be brought to the attention of the Jamboree Staff. The health office will be staffed through the entire camporee. The jamboree phone number is 715-490-2241.

Food:

Units will be responsible for their own breakfast for the weekend; you will need a breakfast for Saturday, and a breakfast for Sunday. To get the most out of the Jamboree has to offer, units camping at the event should plan simple meals to avoid having to spend a lot of time preparing, cooking and cleaning up. **Your fees include lunch and dinner for Saturday.**

Uniform:

Participants are encouraged to wear their activity uniform (Class B, scout related shirt) throughout the weekend. Scouts are requested to wear their field uniform (Class A) for the evening flag ceremony and show on Saturday.

Emergency Information:

If emergency contact must be made with a camping participant, the following information must be provided when the emergency number is called. **The phone number is 715-490-2241.**

Trading Post

- Here you will find all kinds of merchandise and collectibles. You will also be able to purchase additional toiletries, cooking supplies, and other camping necessities.
- You will be able to purchase candy, soda, slushies, and any other food items. Please have your Scouts clean up after themselves!

Showers

- Shower buildings are located on each side of camp. (Shower facilities in Hanna Venture Base are for staff use only).
- Campers need to bring all their own toiletries or purchase them at our Trading Post.

Pets

- No animals are allowed on camp properties except for guide dogs for the visually impaired or animals which are for a program/demonstration with the approval of the Reservation Director.
- Pets will be allowed in designated Family Camp areas but must be leashed at all times and the owner is responsible to clean up after the animal.

CHECK IN/OUT PROCEDURES

Check in:

We want the check in process to be as smooth as possible. To prepare for check-in, please complete the Unit Roster online indicating all Scouts and adults attending.

The Tesomas main entrance will open at 5:30 PM on Friday, September 25 for units camping the entire weekend. Please do not arrive before then. Please follow the signs to the registration station. You will receive your final event details, maps, etc. The unit will be given campsite assignments, and any required information.

Saturday (Cub Scouts) – Please park and check in at the registration table at Hanna Venture Base. Registration will open at 8:30 am. These activities begin at 9am and run through 11:30am.

Check Out:

You may check out any time on Sunday prior to 10:00 am. Your troop site has to be checked-out by a Camporee Staff member BEFORE you leave, visit the Program Center. All troops must be checked out by 10am.

Behavior:

Many people will observe the conduct and appearance of your Scouts while attending the Jamboree. The Scout Oath and Law are the standards of behavior for all participants. All participants and their unit leaders are responsible for proper conduct and behavior.

Quite Time:

Camp quite hours are from 11:00 pm to 6:00 am the next morning. We ask that no radios be brought to the Jamboree.

PROGRAMS

Program Scheduling:

Saturday morning (Cub Scouts Only)

Please park at Hanna Adventure Base and start by heading to the registration table. There will be 12-15 stations that the cub scouts and parents can attend at their leisure. These activities will run from 9am – 11:30am. A map and list of stations will be provided at the registration table.

Saturday morning – Service Stations (Troop Only)

In partnering with America250, the Saturday morning Troop activities focus on service in the area. Some activities will involve travel to areas around Rhinelander.

Troop scouts will participate in service activities around the Rhinelander area. Travel may be required in many instances. Troop leaders will be asked to help transport scouts.

A list of service options will be available to sign up for on Friday night / Saturday morning. Space at each service option will be limited.

Saturday Afternoon (Cub Scouts & Troop)

To make it possible for participants to enjoy as much of the afternoon Jamboree as possible, we have set up this event like a County Fair, where the various activities and exhibits are open all afternoon long. Participants can choose to spend as much time as they like at the ones that interest them the most. There are no set time blocks or required events.

Evening Show:

No noteworthy event is complete without a show, and we have an exciting evening planned for Saturday! The evening will feature a talented magician, patriotic songs, and a celebration of America as we commemorate the nation's 250th anniversary. Join us for an evening of fun, entertainment, music, and patriotic spirit as we celebrate the history, freedom, and traditions that make America special.
