SIA Foundation awards grants to 13 Indiana nonprofits

Organizations from eight counties received funds totaling \$107,000

LAFAYETTE, Ind. – Subaru of Indiana Automotive (SIA) today announced 13 Indiana nonprofit organizations from eight counties were awarded capital grants totaling \$107,012.19 by the SIA Foundation.

Since its establishment in 1997, the SIA Foundation has awarded more than \$2 million to fund nonprofit projects across Indiana. Recipients at today's event represented Carroll, Cass, Hancock, LaPorte, Marion, Porter, Tippecanoe and White counties.
