

Seeing the Church in the Minor Prophets-Part II

Before examining specific prophecies, it is important to establish two very important facts. The first is that the church and the kingdom are one and the same. This is crucial in order to prove that when the prophets refer to the coming kingdom, they are referring to the church rather than a still future earthly reign. Premillennialists seek to distinguish between the church and the kingdom to suit their theory, but Jesus demonstrates otherwise.

In Matthew 16:18-19, in His exchange with Peter, the Lord uses the terms "church" and "kingdom" interchangeably: "And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it. And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." These words followed Peter's confession that Jesus is the Christ. The Lord commended Peter for the confession and then uttered the promise to build His church.

Notice the interchangeable use of the words "church" and "kingdom" in verses 18 and 19. The Lord's use of the two words clearly demonstrates a dual description of one institution. Therefore, when the prophets of old predict anything about the nature of the coming kingdom, they are speaking of the church. The Lord's synonymous use of the two terms proves this to be the case.

A second important preliminary consideration involves Old Testament prophecies concerning the crucifixion of Christ. If premillennialism is true, the cross was not anticipated by the prophets, and their writings should contain no Messianic material relating to the Lord's betrayal and death. Remember the premise of Premillennialism is that the Lord intended to establish an earthly kingdom in His first appearance. However, that effort was supposedly thwarted by the Jews when they rejected and crucified Him. However, if there are predictive statements about this matter in the prophets, how could the Lord have been surprised by the rejection?

Jesus' Growth into Maturity

We are certain He was not surprised by the Jews' rejection of Him. He spoke of his impending suffering on more than one occasion. Mathew 17:22-23 records: "Now while they were staying in Galilee, Jesus said to them, 'the Son of Man is about to be betrayed into the hands of men, and they will kill Him, and the third day He will be raised up'. And they were exceedingly sorrowful." Then, as the betrayal was near at hand, the Lord spoke these words to the twelve: "The Son of Man indeed goes just as it is written of Him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been good for that man if he had not been born" (Mt 26:24).



In the passage just noted, Jesus declares that His betrayal and crucifixion had been written beforehand. But where had it been written? It had been written in the prophets that the Son of God, the Messiah, would suffer and die for the sins of mankind. Therefore, his rejection was predicted, anticipated by the Christ as He lived among men, and accomplished in accordance with the writings of the prophets.

In Matthew 16:18-19, the passage cited earlier, Jesus not only uses the words "church" and "kingdom" interchangeably, He also assures His apostles that the gates of Hades would not prevent its establishment. This is an obvious reference to His death, at which time His spirit would reside for a short time in the Hadean realm, specifically in Paradise. Therefore, the Lord knew His death was imminent and essential to the accomplishment of His mission—the building of His church—the establishment of His kingdom. It is difficult to imagine how any objective observer could conclude the Lord's initial purpose in coming to earth was to establish an earthly kingdom and that He did not anticipate His rejection by the Jews.

We now examine a few key prophetic statements from the Minor Prophets that clearly refer to the Messiah's mission to give His life a ramson for many. In doing so, He fulfilled the many prophecies in the Old Testament pointing to the crucifixion and to the church as the institution in which the manifold wisdom of God finally is made known. Indeed, one can see the church in the Minor Prophets. For His Glory
