





The Problem of Evil

The fact that both mankind and the cosmos as a whole lie under the corruption and condemnation of sin gives rise to what is commonly known as "the problem of evil." Even to the casual observer it is obvious that the world as it presently exists cannot be consistently called "very good" (Gen 1:31). There is still much beau-



ty and wonder in it, but it is also permeated with pain, ugliness, and disaster—collectively called "evil."

Two kinds of evil are usually distinguished: moral and natural. Moral evil is the sin or wickedness which originates in the hearts of free moral creatures (human beings and fallen angles) and which expresses itself in their sinful actions. Examples include greed, hatred, selfishness, deceit, stealing, lust, and envy. Natural evil (sometimes called physical evil) is that which originates from natural process or perversion thereof. Examples are genetic defects, diseases, insanity, famine, suffering, and death; also any natural event—flood, lightning, earthquake, tornado, hurricane—that results in suffering or death. Sometimes moral evil and natural evil may be combined into a single event. For example, an act of murder is a moral evil on the part of the murderer which results in a natural evil (i.e. death) for the victim.

The presence of such elements in the universe can be understood by those who accept the biblical teaching concerning sin, death, and the cosmic curse. But for those who do not view the world with this understanding, it is easy to see how evil can be a problem. Actually, there are two separate problems. One has to do with the cause of particular instance of evil, e.g., "why did my baby die?" or "Why did lighting strike my neighbor?" the other has to do with the origin of evil as such, e.g., "Why is there such a thing as human death in the first place?" "Why are there such things as birth defects at all?" "Why does any sort of weather disaster occur?" the latter are the more basic kinds of questions that constitute "the problem of evil.

The Original Structure of the Book of Acts



The original version of the fifth book of the New Testament was not neatly divided into chapters and verses as in our contemporary English Bibles. When Luke first penned this document, it appears to have been structured according to six general time periods, each of which ends with a summary statement of the gospel's progress:

- "The word of God kept spreading; and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were becoming obedient to the faith" (6:7).
- "So the church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria enjoyed peace, as it was being built up; and as it continued in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it kept increasing" (9:31).
- "But the word of the Lord continued to grow and to be multiplied" (12:24).
- "So the churches were being strengthened in the faith, and were increasing in number daily" (16:5).
- "So the word of the Lord was growing and prevailing mightily" (19:20).
- "Now Paul stayed two full years in his own rented lodging and welcomed all who came to him, preaching the kingdom of God and teaching things about the Lord Jesus Christ with all openness, unhindered" (28:30-31).

Accordingly, the historical record of the book of Acts is arranged in these six general blocks of time:

<u>Period</u>	<u>Reference</u>	Dates AD
Period I	1:1 – 6:7	30-33
Period II	6:8 - 9:31	33-36
Period III	9:32 - 12:24	36-44
Period IV	13:1 – 16:5	44-50
Period V	16:6 – 19:20	50-56
Period VI	19:21 – 28:31	56-62

Since the number seven symbolizes completeness, and the historical record of Acts covers only six general time periods, if this has any symbolic relevance, the book of Acts ends with the gospel story not yet completed. In other words, the narrative (of which we are a part) continues, even until the end of the age (Matt. 28:18-20).
