

You Are My People: The People of God

From the earliest chapters of the Bible, we find God initiating relationship and covenant. In Genesis, God calls Abraham to leave his country and promises, "I will make of you a great nation." This nation, Israel, is continually reminded of its special status: "I will take you as my own people, and I will be your God" (Exodus 6:7). The covenant was not only about promises and blessings, but also about belonging—a profound assurance that no matter the circumstances, God's people are held in the palm of His hand.

The prophets echo this theme again and again. Hosea, speaking to a wayward Israel, delivers a message of restoration: "I will say to those called 'Not my people,' 'You are my people'; and they will say, 'You are my God'" (Hosea 2:23). Here is the beauty of God's heart—He continually seeks, restores, and claims us as His own.

In the New Testament, the message widens. Through Christ, the invitation to become God's people extends to all nations. Peter writes, "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9). Our belonging is no longer limited by geography or heritage, but is defined by faith and grace.

To be the people of God is a gift, but also a responsibility. We are called to reflect God's character in the world—to be salt and light, to live lives marked by compassion, justice, and mercy. When we gather for worship, we do more than sing songs and listen to sermons. We remind one another that we are not alone—that God has made us as part of his family. We celebrate the diversity within the body, knowing that each person's story enriches the tapestry of God's people.

Today, many feel isolated, disconnected, and alone. The world tells us that identity is something we must earn or fabricate, but God offers something deeper—a belonging that is rooted in His love. In Christ, we are never strangers or outsiders. Ephesians proclaims, "So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God" (Ephesians 2:19).

As the people of God, we are invited to create communities where all can find welcome, acceptance, and purpose. Our churches should be places where anyone—no matter their background or brokenness—can hear God's words: "You are my people." This is radical hospitality. This is the love that changes lives.
