

# My Role in the Church


Growing up in the church was pretty easy. My job was to be in attendance. For years, all that was expected of me was my presence in worship and Bible Study. It was not long after being baptized into Christ that they put more responsibilities on me. One of the men came to me and asked me to pass the communion trays. It was not a speaking role so that was a good thing. After consideration, I agreed to pass the communion trays. Yes, I was a little nervous to get out in front of the congregation (about 120 people). But it seemed to go as planned and others said that I did well. Over time I considered and accepted additional tasks that I could do to help the church. It was not long before the realization set in that we were all part of the church, and the church relied on all of us!

In First Corinthians 12 Paul answered a question (unseen by us) the Corinthian Christians had asked him about spiritual gifts. While spiritual gifts can be a touchy subject, there is still an important principle to be found in this chapter. That principle: God's church is a body of which each person is a part, and He has given each part a role to play. First Corinthians 12:7 is the key: "but the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all."

Every person has a part to play. "If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I am not of the body is it therefore not of the body? (I Cor. 12:15-16). Medically, it's a problem when a body has an ear that doesn't hear, or a hand that can't grab, or a foot that can't walk. The same is true of the church. We need members to be more of a part than just attendance. You are not at your strongest until you're exercising your gift for the good of the church. It's true that the church is for the individual, to help him or her grow and stay grounded. But God intended the individual for the church, too.

As members of the Lord's church there is plenty of work to do! I know that many may say well we cannot do very much because of age or health. There are many little opportunities that people can do in the Lord's church. The Bible makes it clear for us time and time again that God does not have a need for super-talented individuals to accomplish His purposes. He needs the submissive and the faithful. He delights in using the weak to show His strength. That's why He pared Gideon's army down to 300, why He chose David over his more physically qualified brothers, why He took on fishermen and a tax collector to start His church.

## I am praying for you!

These five words can mean so much to someone. It is a wonderful thing to know that someone is calling on God on your behalf. They are bringing your name and your concerns to the throne of the Holy Father. The first five verses of Isaiah chapter six shows us a depiction of the Holiness of God.

#### Isaiah 6:1-5 (ESV)

- <sup>1</sup> In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple.
- <sup>2</sup> Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew.
- <sup>3</sup> And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!"
- <sup>4</sup> And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke.
- <sup>5</sup> And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

We need to bring our problems, wants, desires, and our hearts to the throne of God. God wants to hear everything that we have for Him. He wants us to bring our friends and family to Him in prayer. He most of all wants us to pray for the lost. Lost family members, lost neighbors, and even lost people that we do not even know.

Jesus tells the Apostle Paul; he will send him to the Gentile nations to turn their hearts to God. Acts 26:18 (ESV) <sup>18</sup> to open their eyes, so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the power of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me.'

This should be our prayer to God for those that we know who are lost. First, that God will allow their eyes to be opened to the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Secondly, we should let them know that we are praying for them and that we love them. Thirdly, if we can do anything to encourage them, we should do what we can. Fourthly, remember God may have put us in their life to make a difference in their eternity.

It all starts with these five words, "I am praying for You!" Church, my heart's desire is that those who you are praying for might be saved coming to a faith, knowledge, and obedience in the Lord Jesus Christ!
