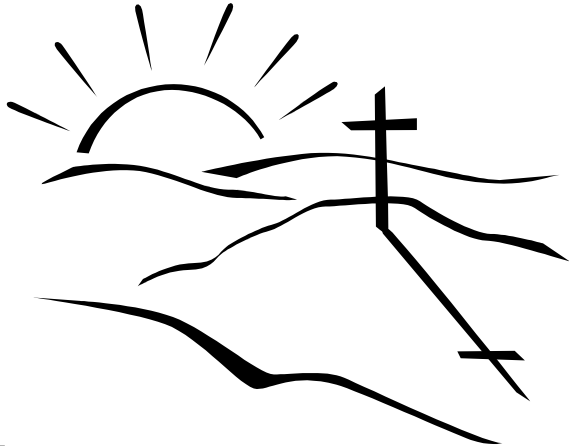

Our God is Good



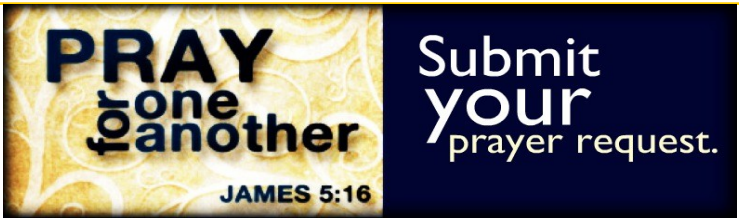
We all know that God is Good to us! We know He has always provided for His people. But what does it mean to say, “God is good”? For one thing, it means that he meets the standards of excellence, he is absolutely perfect in every way. Also, it means he is morally good. Third, it means that he is desirable, the proper object of desire (“O taste and see that the Lord is good,” Ps. 34:8). But mostly, that God is good means that his basic attitude toward His creation is one of benevolence, kindness, and good will. He is kind and friendly toward His creatures; He wills and desires to bless them and to do good for them. He is good to us. He has a generous spirit, a spirit of giving and sharing and blessing, a spirit of affection and good will. He cares for the welfare of his creatures.

God’s goodness (kindness, benevolence) is directed not just toward human beings but toward the whole of creation. He supplies rain just “for His world” (Job 37:13; 38:25-27). “The Lord is good to all, and His mercies are over all His works... The eyes of all look to You and give them their food in due time. You open your hand and satisfy the desire of every living thing” (Ps. 145:9, 15-16). God cares for birds and flowers, says Jesus (Mt. 6:26, 28; 10:29).

The whole universe basks in the goodness of God, the bulk of His kindness and caring is poured out upon mankind. When directed toward human beings, it is called love. In His love the Father sends sunshine and rain on both good and evil men (Mt. 5:42-45).

Without this confidence in the goodness of God, it would be exceedingly difficult to love him and trust him. If God were not good, his attitudes and actions toward us would be characterized either by cruelty or by indifference. But our God is always good to us! He has provided everything we need for life and godliness (2 Peter 1:3). It is wonderful to know that our God is Good, All the time!
