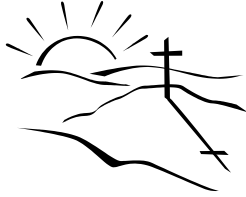

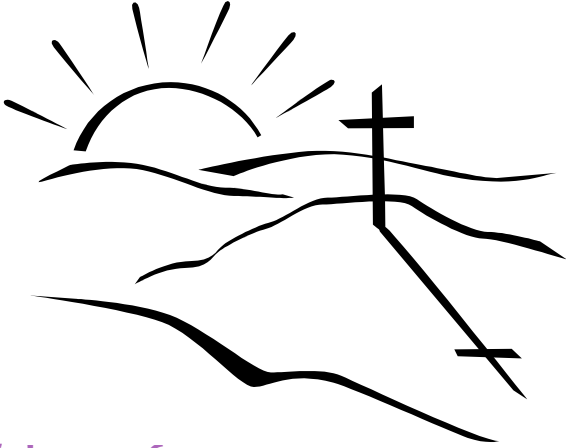

A Thankful Attitude in Christ

As Christians, thankfulness is not merely a seasonal feeling; it is a daily attitude rooted in the grace of God. The Bible tells us, “give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you” (1 Thessalonians 5:18, ESV). We may not be thankful for every hardship itself, but we can be thankful in every circumstance because our Lord is faithful, His promises are sure, and His presence never leaves us.

A thankful heart helps us remember what we have received in Christ. We have forgiveness of sins, the comfort of prayer, the fellowship of the church, and the peace of knowing that God is working for our good. Paul wrote, “And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts... And be thankful” (Colossians 3:15, ESV). Gratitude keeps our eyes on the Lord instead of our troubles, and it turns our hearts from complaining to worship.

Of all people, Christians have the most to be thankful for because our hope reaches beyond this life. Some sweet day, by the mercy of God, we will spend eternity in heaven with the Lord. Peter reminds us that God has caused us to be born again “to a living hope... to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you” (1 Peter 1:3–4, ESV). Until that day, may we live with grateful hearts, giving thanks to God for His goodness, His salvation, and the everlasting home He has prepared for His people.

When we choose thankfulness, we also become an example to those around us. A grateful Christian shows the world that our joy is not based on perfect circumstances, but on a perfect Savior. Hebrews 13:15 says, “Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name” (ESV). May our words, our worship, and our daily attitude point others to the Lord who has blessed us far beyond what we deserve.
