- JSU will make its fifth appearance in the Southwestern Athletic Conference football championship game. The Tigers hold a 1-3 record suffering a 24-21 overtime loss to Arkansas-Pine Bluff in 2012 in their last appearance.

- JSU won its first championship game crown in 2007 with a 42-31 win over Grambling State

- Prior to the SWAC Football Championship game, JSU captured the SWAC football title in 1961 and 1962 before sharing the crown with Grambling State in 1972 and 1973. The Tigers grabbed the crown again in 1981, 1982, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1990, 1995, and 1996

- Jackson State ended the season leading the conference with 37.6 net / punt and ranks first in 4th-Down conversions with 13, averaging 86.7 per game

**TALE OF THE TAPE**



• The largest crowd ever to watch the SWAC Football Championship was in 1999. In the first ever football championship game, a crowd of 47, 621 witnessed Southern defeat Jackson State at Legion Field

• Grambling State has appeared in the football championship game more than any other team in the SWAC. The Tigers have made seven appearances posting a 6-1 record. Alabama A&M follows with six appearances

• Legion Field was home to the SWAC Football Championship from 1999 to 2012.

• Only two schools in the SWAC have not made a trip to the championship game. Mississippi Valley State and Alcorn State are the only teams with an appearance in the title game

• With a 45-6 win over Alabama A&M in 2005, Grambling State recorded the most points scored and largest margin of victory in the SWAC Football Championship game

• In Southern and Alabama State's match-up in 2004, both teams combined for a championship record, 75 points. Alabama State defeated Southern, 40-35

• There are only two schools with unbeaten records in the SWAC Football Championship game. Both SWAC schools from the Lone Star State, Texas Southern and Prairie View A&M, hold a 1-0 record

• The Western Division holds a commanding 11-3 lead over the Eastern Division in the SWAC Football Championship. Jackson State was the last Eastern Division squad to capture the title. The Tigers won their first championship game in 2007 with a 42-31 win over Grambling State. It was GSU's first loss in the title match

• Grambling State, Southern, Alabama State, and Jackson State are the only teams to make back-to-back appearances in the championship game. Grambling State made three consecutive championship appearances from 2000-2002. GSU and JSU both played each other in back-to-back games in 2007 and 2008. ASU and SU matched up in consecutive years in 2004-2005. The 2013 championship will also feature JSU for a consecutive season.

**SWAC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME HISTORY**

The SWAC Football Championship Game began in 1999, with conference teams beginning play in an East-West divisional format, allowing division winners to meet on the field to decide a champion.

Through an agreement forged with the City of Birmingham, Ala. the Southwestern Athletic Conference staged its first championship game at historic Legion Field.

On Saturday, December 11, 1999, the Jackson State University Tigers (East Champion) and the Southern University Jaguars (West Champion) kicked off the inaugural Southwestern Athletic Conference Football Championship game.

In a thriller, Southern came from behind for a 31-30 win. In 13 years of the SWAC Championship Game, eight of the 10 conference schools have earned a berth to play for the title, with the last two SWAC champions being first-time participants in Prairie View A&M and Texas Southern.

From the Western Division, Grambling State has earned a trip to the championship six times – the most of any SWAC school – and posts a 6-1 record.

Southern has played in the title game three times with a 2-1 record, while Arkansas-Pine Bluff has made two appearances capturing its first outright league title in football in 2012. Prairie View A&M and Texas Southern have each made an appearance.

Alabama A&M has represented the Eastern Division five times and posted a 1-4 record in the championship game.

Alabama State is 1-3 in its four appearances, while Jackson State is 1-3 in four championship games. Mississippi Valley State and Alcorn State have never appeared in the SWAC Championship Game.

In all, the Western Division is 10-3 over the Eastern Division and has won five straight in the 14-year history of the event.

Last season, the game experienced its first overtime with UAPB defeating JSU, 24-21.

In May of 2013, The Southwestern Athletic Conference Council of Presidents and Chancellors voted unanimously to relocate the 2013 Toyota SWAC Football Championship to Houston, Texas.

The football championship game will be held at Reliant Stadium which is home of the NFL Houston Texans. It will mark the first time the football championship event will be held in a professional sports venue.

• On Thursday, the SWAC added seven new members to its Hall of Fame. Reggie Barlow (Alabama State), Bob Hopkins (Grambling State), James Jones (Grambling State), Carol Cummings (Prairie View A&M) John Osborne (Southern), Richard Myles (Alcorn State) and Charles Ruth (Mississippi Valley State) were enshrined in the SWAC HALL of Fame

• To close out the 2013 season, the final SWAC game will be televised on national television. Jackson State and Southern will face-off on ESPN2 in the 2013 Toyota SWAC Football Championship on Dec. 7

• Alabama A&M announced early this week that Anthony Jones will not return as football head coach.

• Grambling State University announced the selection of Gramblinite legacy Broderick Lee Fobbs as the next head coach of the university football team. A news conference is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. Monday in the Doris Robinson Room of the Eddie G. Robinson Museum on the campus.

• For the season, Johntha' Hebert (Prairie View A&M - 250) became the fourth running back in the league to rush for 200 or more yards on the year. He joins Malcolm Cyrus (Alabama State - 246), Courtney Brown (Prairie View A&M - 224) and Tommy Gooden (Jackson State - 214) recording the leagues' top rushing performances on the season

• Jackson State and Southern will meet for the second time in the SWAC Football Championship game on Dec. 7 at Reliant Stadium in Houston, Texas. Both teams played in the first ever SWAC Football Championship game on Dec. 11, 1999. SU defeated JSU 31-30 in Birmingham, Ala. at Legion Field. To date, it has drawn the largest crowd with 47, 621 attending

• The Sports Network announced on Nov. 19 its finalists for the coveted Eddie Robinson Award with Alcorn State head coach Jay Hopson making the list of 21 coaches of all 13 FCS conferences. In his second season, he led a five-win improvement from 2012 giving ALC its first winning season since 2006 and nine-win campaign since 1984. The Braves handed Jackson State its only conference loss and also defeated Southern on the road

 • Deandre Cooper captured Prairie View A&M's single season receiving yards record after a 104 yard performance last week. His 1,042 yards on the season surpasses SWAC Hall of Famer Otis Taylor 1,015

• JSU clinched the East Division after defeating Alabama A&M, 26-20, while SU captured the regular season after Prairie View A&M's 50-35 loss to Alcorn State. Two days later, SU defeated Alabama State 31-28 to cap its West Division title

• Texas Southern's loss to Howard handed the SWAC and 0-5 mark to the MEAC dating back to Sept. 11, 2010. The last time a SWAC school defeated a MEAC team was on Sept. 5, 2011 when Southern pulled off a 37-27 win over Delaware State in the MEAC/SWAC Challenge
