The 2014 SWAC Basketball Tournament will be held at the Toyota Center from March 11-15. The Southwestern Athletic Conference will host the 2014 Championship for the first time in Houston, Texas

- What happens if an ineligible team wins the championship game of the tournament? The eligible team that advances

furthest in the conference tournament will receive the automatic berth to the NCAA championships. In the event of a tie (for example, all tournament-eligible teams are eliminated in the same round), the automatic berths will go to the highest-seeded team

- On March 9, the league voted Kendra Coleman (SUBR) as this week's SWAC Women's Basketball Player of the Week

- Six student athletes within the conference completed the regular season averaging over 15 points per game. The list includes: Jazzmin Parker (TXSO) with 19.2, Jeanette Jackson (PVAM) with 19.2, Joanna Miller (GRAM) with 18.4, Tierro Frost (ALCN) averaging 18.0, Kendra Coleman (SUBR) with 18.0, and Brittney Strickland (AAMU) registered 16.8 ppg

- Jackson State currently holds a league best seven tournament championships while Grambling State is next in line with six

- Joanna Miller (GRAM) and Quentori Alford (ALST) earned a spot on the SWAC All-Conference teams for the second consecutive year

- Under the leadership of Head Coach Sandy Pugh, Southern won the 2013-14 regular season title for the third time in the last five years

Points - Jazzmin Parker (TXSO) - 19.2 / game

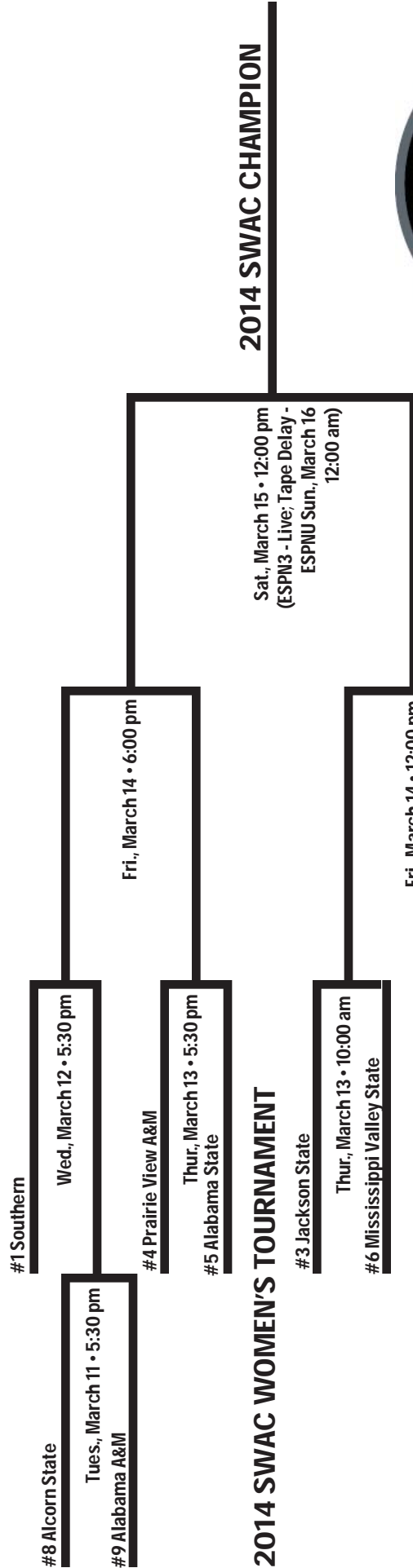
Assists - Joncyee Sanders (MVSU) - 5.8 / game

- Jazzmin Parker finished her first year as a TSU Lady Tiger averaging 19.2 points per game as she led the league in scoring all season

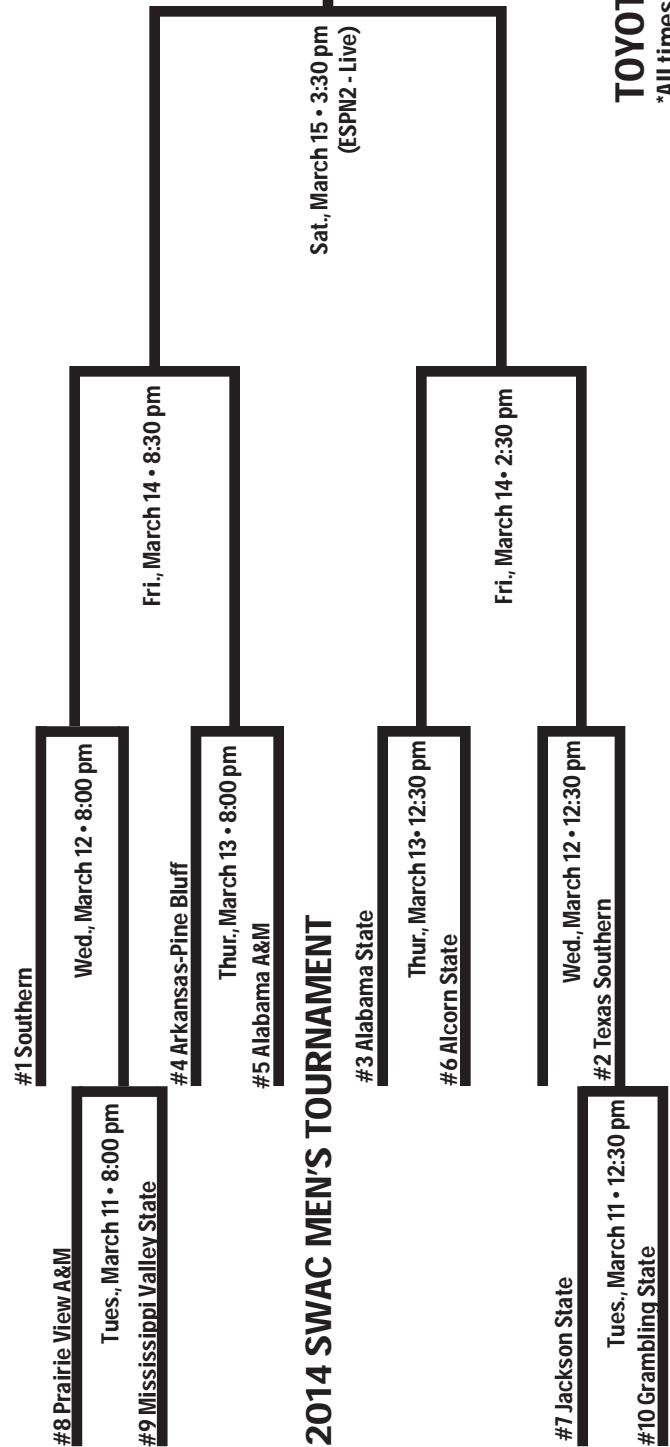

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Kendra Coleman of Southern University was named the SWAC Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the first time this season, the conference announced on March 10.

Kendra Coleman Southern

5'7 • Guard • Donaldsonville, La.

Coleman, a native of Donaldsonville, Fla, concluded the regular season tallying one double-double, scoring over 20 points in 10 games on the year. She currently leads the Lady Jaguars in scoring, averaging 18.0 points per game.

Against Prairie View A&M on March 6, the junior guard posted 13 points, shooting perfectly from the line. Coleman also grabbed eight rebounds and one block in SU's 69-59 victory. In a winner takes all match against Texas Southern on March 8, Coleman scored a team high 20 points on 6-of-17 shooting while also recording 3 rebounds, one steal and one block on her way to helping the Lady Jaguars clinch the regular season championship title.

For the week, Coleman averaged 16.5 points and 5.5 rebounds, shooting 31 percent from the field and 87 percent from the line.

- Alabama State finished the regular season leading the conference in 9 statistical categories including scoring defense (62.7), rebounding offense (17.5) and defense (29.4), blocked shots (5.2) with the highest offensive rebounding percentage (.404)

- Mississippi Valley State's gymnasium (HPER Complex) will start renovations soon. These are the first changes made to the arena since 1977. The Devilletes will continue their home matches at the Leflore Country Civic Center in Greenwood, Miss. until renovations are complete

- Texas Southern holds the best record in SWAC play on the road with an 8-2 mark

- The SWAC has a host of sisterly duos in the conference. Alabama A&M (Brittney Strickland / Alyssa Strickland), Alcorn State (Tierro Frost / Kierro Frost) and Mississippi Valley State (Jasmine Sanders / Joncyee Sanders)

- Texas Southern currently ranks first in the league in assists with 14.6 per game, averaging the most 3 pointers per game (4.8) and the highest field goal shooting percentage (.436)

- Tierro Frost (ALCN) stands as the conference leader in points scored in a game with her career high 41 in ALCN's 78-77 over Grambling State on Feb. 10

• Jazzmin Parker finished her first year as a TSU Lady Tiger averaging 19.2 points per game as she led the league in scoring all season

• Grambling State and Southern are the only schools within the SWAC to have four players average double figures in scoring

• Texas Southern's Jazzmin Parker has lead the SWAC in scoring so far this season. She currently averages 19.6 points per game

• Mississippi Valley State, Prairie View A&M, Texas Southern and Alcorn State have each participated in a tournament this year. Mississippi Valley is the only school to have walked away with a win. MVSU beat Eastern Kentucky 68-58 during the Southern Miss Thanksgiving Tournament

• Arkansas-Pine Bluff and Alabama State have the only husband/wife duo in the league. Nate Kilbert is the head women's coach and Alyse Wells-Kilbert is an active assistant. ASU's head women's basketball coach Freda-Freeman Jackson and husband Lewis Jackson sit at the helm of ASU's basketball program

• On Nov. 10, Alcorn State captured a win to open the season with a 50-45 victory over Omaha. The Lady Braves have not earned a win this early in the year since 2006-07 when they topped Jacksonville State 74-63

• Grambling State joined Texas Southern and Alabama State in being the only schools to earn a victory during week 5. The Lady Tigers topped New Orleans 76-52 in their third home game of the season

• Tennessee Lady Vols Connection: Semeka Randall (Alabama A&M) and Tonya Edwards (Alcorn State) are both former players at the University of Tennessee. Randall played at UT from (1998 -2001) and Edwards played from (1986-1990) both winning National Championships. Edwards earned the honor of Most Outstanding Player in the 1987 Final Four

• Southern, Texas Southern and Arkansas-Pine Bluff each picked up a win during their season openers. The last time the SWAC opened the regular season with three or more victories was at the start of the 2011-12 season

• From 2009-2012 Arkansas-Pine Bluff recorded 10 wins during the regular season. Last year, the Lady Lions won 13 games under Nate Kilbert during his first year at UAPB

• Joanna Miller (Grambling State) returns this year after finishing first in the conference in points last season. Miller, last year's SWAC Player of the Year and this season's pre-season player of the year averaged 16.5 ppg in 2012-13

• Southern University opened the season with two consecutive victories. The last time the Lady Jaguars started a season with two or more wins was during the 2011-12 season

• Texas Southern enters the season as the defending regular season champions. The Lady Tigers won a league leading 16 games and suffered only two losses last year. TSU opened the 2013-14 season with a 88-80 win over Tulsa

• Arkansas-Pine Bluff is the only school within the conference with an international player. Molly Campbell joins the team as a freshman from Manchester, London

2014 TOYOTA SWAC TOURNAMENT



The Southwestern Athletic Conference Council of Presidents and Chancellors voted unanimously to hold the 2014 Toyota SWAC Basketball Tournament in Houston, Texas for the next three seasons.

The basketball tournament is slated for March 11-15 and will be held inside the Toyota Center.

The Toyota Center, located in downtown Houston, has 18,000 seats. Home to the NBA Houston Rockets, it too has hosted major events including two NBA All-Star

games (2006 and 2013).

Tad Brown, CEO of the Rockets expressed his excitement about hosting the SWAC tournament. "We are very proud to be hosting the SWAC basketball championships at Toyota Center," said Brown. "We know that the conference and its member institutions will find Toyota Center, our organization and the City of Houston tremendous hosts. We also look forward to elevating the SWAC tournament to become one of the premier events on the Houston sports calendar each year."

Since opening in October 2003, Toyota Center has set a new standard for sports and entertainment, becoming one of the premier live entertainment venues in the nation. Laid over the span of six city blocks, Toyota Center is home to the NBA's Houston Rockets. Toyota Center also plays host to the nation's top concerts and touring shows.



Construction began in July 2001, and the new arena was officially opened in September 2003.

The arena's first event was a Fleetwood Mac concert on October 6, 2003, and the first Rockets game at the Toyota Center was against the Denver Nuggets on October 30.

In its first year, the total attendance for events at the arena exceeded 1.5 million. The arena was also the winner of the Allen Award for Civic Enhancement by Central Houston, the "Rookie of the Year" award by the Harlem Globetrotters, and a finalist for Pollstar Magazine's "Best New Concert Venue" award according to online sources.
