TOP NEWS AND NOTES

- The 2015 SWAC Soccer Tournament will be November 5-8 at the John Hunt Soccer Complex in Huntsville, Ala.
- Mississippi Valley State won the regular season crown after defeating Alcorn State, 10-0. The Devilettes enter the 2015 tournament as the top seed, led by Nykosi Simmons who is first in the nation in goals by the NCAA with 24
- The complete regular season finish is as follow: MVSU, Jackson State, Alabama State, Howard, Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Texas Southern, Prairie View A&M, Alabama A&M
- Simmons (offensive), Kyleigh Io of JKST (defensive), Toennies of JKST (freshman and goalie) and Karrisa Fenwick of UAPB (freshman) received individual, postseason accolades
- JKST claimed the most postseason award positions with eight. MVSU followed with seven

- Brent Leiba is one win away from registering his 50th career victory. The Bison face UAPB in the first round of the soccer tournament
- Kailand Thompson (TXSO), Kyleigh Io (JKST) and Marrissa Oehler (AAMU) were named week 10 players of the week
- JKST closed the regular season on a five-game winning streak, defeating PVAM, TXSO, GRAM, UAPB, SUBR
- Marlyn Campa set a record for most career goals at Texas Southern in the match against Southern- 22. She's also 2 assists away from another milestone
- Alicia Cooper of PVAM earned her third hat trick of the season during a 10-0 victory over Alcorn State
- First year, coaches include ALCN's head coach Sam Nwaneri and UAPB's head coach Jamie Hutchison
 - Hutchison earned his first career win when the Golden Lions defeated Lyon College, 2-1
- PVAMU's head coach Abe Garcia recorded his 50th career win in the game against Incarnate Word, 3-2.
- Howard set a new program record in its win over Hampton, August 23. The Bison scored 17 goals the most since the team netted 13 against Delaware State on November 5, 2004
- Alcorn State is the only team without a win this season 0-10-0, 0-13-0
- \bullet PVAMU made history this season after collecting a 1-1-1 record. This marks the best start for the Panthers in 10 years
- 118 student-athletes made the 2015 SWAC All-Academic Team: AAMU – 7, ALST – 18, ALCN – 11, GRAM -6, JKST – 24, MVSU – 14, PVAM – 12, SUBR-8, TXSO -6, UAPB -12
- Grambling State did not leave the state of Louisiana during its non-conference season playing Louisiana Tech, ULM and Louisiana-Lafayette
- Last season, Howard used Birmingham, Ala., when playing conference

games as its home location. This year, teams will travel to Washington, D.C. to face the Bison. Teams making the trip include Southern, Jackson State, Texas Southern, Prairie View A&M, Mississippi Valley State and Alcorn State

- Alcorn State will have the longest run on the road as its first eight games are away. The Braves will return home October 9 to face Arkansas-Pine Bluff in its third conference matchup
- There are a total of 21 international soccer student-athletes representing the SWAC this season: Alabama A&M 5, Alabama State 2, Mississippi Valley State 9, Southern 4, Arkansas-Pine Bluff 1



OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

• Nykosi Simmons - After finishing sixth in the conference last season with a 4-3-3 record, Simmons aided in the advancement of the Devilettes closing this regular season with an almost perfect SWAC record.

She earned her offensive title after being nationally ranked by the NCAA in many categories including goals per game (1.26), points per game (2.74), total points (52) and total goals (24). Simmons' play also improved the overall national standing of MVSU, bringing the Devilettes to a first-place position in scoring offence (3.79), assists per game (3.11), points per game (10.68), total assists (59), total points (203) and total goals (72). She tops the Conference in six categories after grabbing three hat tricks.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

• Kyleigh Io - Io raised a strong JKST defense, only accepting one conference loss on the year and one tie. She played and started in 16 of 16 matches for a total of 1238 minutes, recording two scores - one being a winning goal - for a .429 on target percentage

GOALIE OF THE YEAR & CO-FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

• Faith Toennies - Toennies was honored twice after starting in eight of the 11 games. She allowed a league low 13 goals and tops the SWAC in save percentage at .856 (29th in the nation) and shutouts at five. She also secured top-10 places in the Conference in total saves (eighth) and saves per game (ninth) and was named SWAC Player of the Week on four separate occasions - the most of any studentathlete in the league on the season

CO-FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

- Karrisa Fenwick Arkansas-Pine Bluff's Fenwick established an impressive freshman resume, leading the young, Lady Lions to a 7-9-1 regular season finish
- In her first collegiate season, Fenwick registered a team-high 10 goals and managed a .455 on goal percentage. She holds top-10 spots in some conference categories including shots (seventh with 44) and goals (tied at sixth with 10)
