- To uphold the principles of institutional control of, and responsibility for all collegiate sports conducted by the members of this organization in conformity with the Constitution and Bylaws hereof;
- To stimulate and improve intercollegiate athletic sports;
- To comply with satisfactory standards of scholarship and amateur standing and good sportsmanship;
- To preserve and maintain the collegiate athletic records of the members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference, and make them available upon request;
- To cooperate with other amateur athletic organizations in the promotion and conduct of intercollegiate athletic contests;
- To maintain fiscal management; and
- To legislate through Bylaws or Resolutions on subjects of general concern to the membership.

The members of the conference are committed to the philosophy of maintaining intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the overall educational program. To this end, the conference believes in and subscribes to the fundamental principles of amateurism, institutional control, sound academic standards, financial aid, recruiting, and ethical conduct that governs intercollegiate athletics, and the enforcement of rules and regulations as adopted by the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

HISTORY AT A GLANCE

In 1920, eight men representing six colleges from the state of Texas met to discuss collegiate athletics and the many challenges

that face their respective institutions. By the time the session in Houston had concluded, they had founded an athletic league that has slowly become one of the leading sports associations in the world of collegiate athletics, the Southwestern Athletic Conference. The founding fathers of the original Super Six were:

- C.H. Fuller of Bishop College
- Red Randolph and C.H. Patterson of Paul Quinn
- E.G. Evans, H.J. Evans and H.J. Starns of Prairie View A&M
- D.C. Fuller of Texas College
- G. Whitte Jordan of Wiley College

CRICKET WIRELESS SWAC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP



The SWAC Football Championship Game began in 1999, with conference teams beginning play in an East-West divisional format, allowing division winners to meet on the field to decide a champion.

Through an agreement forged with the City of Birmingham, Ala. the Southwestern Athletic Conference staged its first championship game at historic Legion Field. On December 11, 1999, Jackson State (East champion) and Southern University (West champion) kicked off the inaugural SWAC Football Championship game. Southern came from behind for a 31-30 win.

In the 22 championship games since 1999, nine of the 12 conference schools have earned a berth to play for the title.

From the Western Division, Grambling State has earned a trip to the championship ten times — the most of any SWAC school — and posts a 8-2 record. Southern has played in the title game seven times with a 3-4 record, while Arkansas-Pine Bluff has made two appearances capturing its first outright league title in football in 2012. Prairie View A&M and Texas Southern have each won a title.

Alcorn State is 4-2 in the title game, winning back-to-back championships in 2014 and 2015 and again in 2018 and 2019. Alabama A&M has represented the Eastern Division seven times and posted a 2-5 record in the championship game, winning its championships in 2006 and the spring of 2020. Alabama State is 1-3 in its four appearances, winning in 2004, while Jackson State is 2-4 in six championship games as it won in 2007 and 2021.

Mississippi Valley State, Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M are the only schools that still await their first appearance in the SWAC Championship Game.

The football championship game was held at NRG Stadium, home of the NFL's Houston Texans, from 2013 to 2017.

Beginning in 2018, the SWAC Football Championship game has been played at the home field of the highest-ranked finalist. This past season's game was played at Veterans Memorial Stadium in Jackson, Mississippi with the Jackson State Tigers defeating Prairie View A&M 27-10.

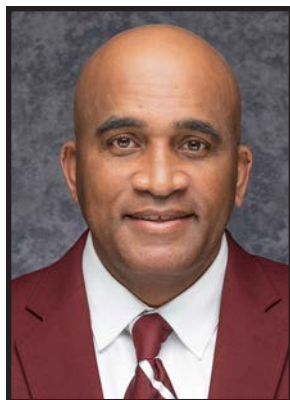

CONNELL MAYNOR, HEAD COACH

One of the most successful coaches over the past two decades, Maynor was named head coach at Alabama A&M on January 16, 2018, bringing with him an extensive background at both the collegiate and professional levels as a player and coach, including being part of 10 championship teams with six rings coming as a player and four as a coach. He currently enters the 2022 season with a 90-44 (.672) overall record as a head coach in 12 years at three institutions.

ALABAMA A&M (2018-PRESENT, HEAD COACH)

Since taking the reins of the Bulldogs in 2018 Maynor has compiled a 25-13 overall record, 17-8 mark in the Southwestern Athletic Conference and accomplished things no other coach has at A&M. The Spring 2021 season saw him add to not only his personal championship ring collection but to that of his players as he guided Alabama A&M to a perfect 5-0 record and 3-0 league mark, accomplishing three impressive milestones in one fell swoop on May 1. That day would see a thrilling 40-33 victory over No. 25 Arkansas-Pine Bluff that delivered the first SWAC Championship in 15 years (and second in program history), the first undefeated season since the 1966 season 53 seasons prior and the first ever Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) National Championship for the program. Those accomplishments earned him a spot as one of 16 national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award as the nation's top FCS coach but were fueled by the efforts of the players he recruited. The accolades from that championship season also included a Division I Era program record 11 All-SWAC selections with seven on the First-Team.

It was also a season marked by 12 All-Americans between postseason and preseason honors, headlined by the first American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) honoree as sophomore wide out Abdul-Fatai Ibrahim (Miramar, Fla.) was named to the Second-Team. That honor made him just the fourth in program history, second in the DI Era and first since 2007. Additionally, junior defensive end Marcus Cushine (Broward County, Fla.) became the first player in 29 years to earn College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District and All-America recognition for his work on the field and in the classroom. Ibrahim would join those ranks in Fall 2021 as he became just the fourth football player to earn CoSIDA Academic All-District honors, doing so out of a district that features schools from Alabama, South Carolina, Georgia and Florida. The Spring 2021 season marked a steady improvement for the program from a 6-5 overall record and 5-2 mark in the SWAC in 2018 and 7-5 and 4-3 records, respectively, in 2019. The 2018 campaign also represented the first winning season for the program since 2012.

Most recently, the Fall 2021 campaign would see the Bulldogs go 7-3 overall, see the team earn AFCA Minority Offensive Staff of the Year and offensive coordinator Duane Taylor be named to that role for the National Football League Player's Association (NFLPA) Collegiate Bowl at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California. In just four seasons at the helm, Maynor has delivered 31 All-SWAC honors with 17 of those being First-Team selections. A total of 21 of those came in 2020 and Spring 2021 with five, including four First-Team, in Fall 2021.

HAMPTON (2014-17, HEAD COACH)

In four seasons as head coach at Hampton, Maynor posted a 20-25 overall record that included a pair of winning seasons, the program's first since 2011. The first of those was a 2015 campaign that saw a 6-5 overall record and 5-3 mark in the MEAC and those records would be repeated in his final season with the Pirates in 2017. He would pick up his first victory as a Division I head coach with a 34-30 decision over Miles on September 20, 2014 and also delivered the program's first shutout in five years, and his first at the DI level, with a 23-0 win over Delaware State that first season.

WINSTON-SALEM STATE (2010-13, HEAD COACH)

Maynor inherited a program that went 1-10 and immediately turned things around. His first season would see the Rams deliver a sterling 8-2 record that would be the beginning of a 45-6 stretch over that four-year span. In 2011 Maynor lead WSSU to a 13-1 overall record, a CIAA Championship with a perfect 8-0 record and a berth in the NCAA Division II semifinals. The next year would see them earn a second straight league championship with a 14-1 record before falling in the national championship game. The 2013 season saw a third consecutive CIAA title and a third straight NCAA appearance.

FAYETTEVILLE STATE (2000-09, OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR, QUARTERBACKS COACH)

Maynor spent a decade in the league as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Division II Fayetteville State, helping FSU to four CIAA title game appearances, three of them resulting in championships (2002, 2003 and 2009).

PROFESSIONAL PLAYING CAREER (1995-2006, ARENA FOOTBALL LEAGUE)

A veteran of 12 seasons in the AFL, Maynor played for seven teams and threw for 9,285 yards and 160 touchdowns against just 33 interceptions. He concluded his AFL career as the only individual to play quarterback, wide receiver, linebacker and serve as a kick return specialist and is the only player to throw for more than 5,000 yards, accumulate at least 500 yards receiving (795), 400 rushing yards (642) and 400 yards in kick returns (465).

PROFESSIONAL COACHING CAREER (2006-08, PHILADELPHIA SOUL, ARENA FOOTBALL LEAGUE)

Following his prolific playing career, Maynor transitioned into the professional ranks for coaching, moving up stairs to the offensive coordinator role with his final team, the Philadelphia Soul, guiding the team to first place rankings in scoring offense (62.0 ppg), touchdowns (132), touchdown passes (102) and red zone efficiency (85-percent) in 2008. That effort led to Philadelphia claiming Arena Bowl XXII as they held off the San Jose SaberCats for a 59-56 victory.

COLLEGIATE PLAYING CAREER (1987, WINSTON-SALEM STATE, 1989-91 NORTH CAROLINA A&T)

Maynor starred at quarterback at Winston-Salem State in 1987 under William "Bill" Hayes, leading the team to a CIAA Championship and earning All-CIAA honors. He would then follow Hayes to North Carolina A&T where he would proceed to become the first Aggie to be named MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, doing so in back-to-back years in 1990 and 1991. Maynor holds a Bachelor of Arts in Recreation Administration earned from North Carolina A&T in 1995.

EDDIE ROBINSON, JR., HEAD COACH

Eddie Robinson, Jr. was named the 30th head coach in Alabama State University on November 26, 2021, returning to his alma mater. A native of Louisiana, Robinson was born and raised in New Orleans. He attended Brother Martin High School, graduating in 1988. He furthered his education attending Alabama State University on an academic scholarship. He earned a Bachelor's of Science Degree in Chemistry in 1994.

He lettered in football all four years and earned All-SWAC honors and SWAC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1990 and 1991, Sheridan Broadcasting Network All-America honors in 1990 and 1991, as well as Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1991 as a linebacker for the Hornets. Robinson also achieved academic All-Conference honors and was recognized as The Toyota Leadership Award recipient in 1990. In 1998, he became the youngest individual to be inducted into the SWAC Hall of Fame at 28 years old, and in 2012 he was recognized as a MEAC/SWAC Challenge Legend.

Robinson was the Houston Oilers' second round pick in the 1992 NFL draft, the 50th player selected.

He was a stalwart in the community during his 11-year NFL career, playing with the Houston Oilers (1992–1995), Jacksonville Jaguars (1996–1997), Tennessee Titans (1998–2001) and Buffalo Bills (2002); appearing in Super Bowl XXXIV with the Titans in 2000. He finished his career with 850, 23 sacks and six interceptions. Robinson received the Titans Unsung Hero award for the Tennessee Titans during his career. He was the ultimate professional and obtained the nick name "Steady Eddie" for his methodical preparation and on field knowledge of the game, receiving accolades from his coaching staff and teammates for his leadership skills and attention to detail.

Robinson retired from the NFL following the 2002 season and entered the business world, and is currently the owner/manager of Magnolia River LLC Real Estate Investment Company.

He was a college football analyst for Fox Sports South, ESPNU, ESPN3 and Comcast Sports South from 2005 until 2014. In addition, he was a co-host on a regionally televised weekly sports show INSIDE SWAC from 2006 to 2009, and continues to broadcast collegiate football games on the radio and appears on sports podcast as a featured guest.

Robinson possesses more than 30 plus years of experience at various levels of Football. He is a stellar ASU Alumnus and a man of vision who has a proven record of success. He assisted ASU in establishing its Football Hall of Fame and has been a consistent supporter of ASU athletic programs financially and by supporting athletic administrations and coaches. He has worked to support the mission of HBCU's academically and athletically.

He has hosted Youth Football camps at Alabama State University, Texas Southern University and in his Houston Third Ward community. Robinson regularly speaks to high school students and young athletes promoting life skills and planning for success. He is an NFL Ambassador for USA Football helping to promote the game of football to parents and young football players. He mentored and coached an inner-city baseball league in the Sunnyside neighborhood of Houston, and incorporated a program to help young African-American baseball players achieve youth and high school success in baseball with a goal of playing baseball in college and professionally. Two of his players have signed college scholarships to play college baseball with others expected to follow this path and all have plans to attend college. He volunteers his time with the Houston school districts' Real Men Read program, reading to elementary school kids, and sharing his keys to success.

Robinson is a member of the SWAC Alumni Association and a life member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and resides in Houston (Texas). He is the father of three sons who participate in high school and college athletics.

FRED McNAIR, HEAD COACH

In just five seasons at the helm in Lorman, Mississippi, Fred “Air” McNair has coached the Braves to four Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) East Division titles and a pair of SWAC Championships. The two-time SWAC Coach of the Year helped take the Braves to the Celebration Bowl in both 2018 and 2019, respectively. He is the original “Air McNair”, and the older brother of the late Tennessee Titans quarterback and 2003 National Football League (NFL) Co-Most Valuable Player – Steve “Air II” McNair.

McNair currently holds a 28-11 SWAC record after five seasons on the Alcorn State sidelines, while posting an overall record of 36-24. He became Alcorn State's first SWAC Coach of the Year winner since Cardell Jones achieved the feat in 1992. All this while enduring the cancellation of the 2020 fall playing season due to the COVID global pandemic. In 2019, Alcorn played in their second consecutive Celebration Bowl, and the school's third in the five-year history of the bowl. Alcorn's 44 points scored in a losing effort in the 2019 edition of the Celebration Bowl were the most the school has scored in a postseason bowl or playoff game to date. The program's previous high was 36 points in the 1968 edition of the Orange Blossom Classic. The Braves posted their first 7-0 record at home inside Jack Spinks-Marino Casem Stadium history during the 2019 campaign. In fact, Alcorn enters the 2022 season having won its last 13 games consecutively in the friendly confines of Jack Spinks-Marino Casem Stadium.

At the end of the 2019 season, McNair saw his quarterback Felix Harper earn his second consecutive SWAC Offensive Player of the Year award. He developed Harper who ranked fourth in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in passing touchdowns (33), fifth in points responsible for (19.7 points/game), seventh in passing efficiency (160.7), eighth in yards per completion (14.5) and ninth in yards per pass attempt (8.7). McNair's defense led the nation in both interceptions (21) and turnovers gained (36) in that same SWAC title-winning season.

In 2018, McNair's squad earned 12 All-Conference selections, including 10 on the First Team, six HBCU All-Americans, a STATS FCS Third-Team All-American and a HERO Sports Sophomore All-American. Additionally, he coached Noah Johnson to the SWAC Offensive Player of the Year honor and De'Shawn Waller to SWAC Newcomer of the Year accolade. McNair's defense ranked first in the FCS in both sacks per game (4.0) and tackles for a loss per game (9.5). The defense was also third in the country in rushing (91.2 ypg), eighth in total defense (291.4 ypg), 10th in red zone defense (.714), 18th in scoring defense (21.5 ppg), 22nd in third down percentage defense (.324) and 24th in interceptions (14). Alcorn led the SWAC in total offense (473.3 yards/game), total defense (291.4 yards/game), scoring defense (21.5 points/game), rushing (285.8 yards/game), rushing defense (91.2 yards/game), interceptions (14), sacks (4.0 per game), tackles for a loss (9.5 per game), first downs (23.2 per game), fewest first downs allowed (16.2 per game) and time of possession (32:42).

McNair was named as the 21st head football coach of Alcorn State University on Feb. 2, 2016. Prior to that, he worked at Alcorn as the quarterbacks coach for three seasons under former head coach Jay Hopson. McNair began his collegiate football career as a wide receiver at Alcorn in 1986, before moving to quarterback his junior season. After making the move under center, McNair went on to finish fifth in the FCS (formerly Division I-AA) in passing efficiency during his senior year, and was named to the SWAC all-conference second team following the 1989 campaign. He received his bachelor's degree from Alcorn State in 1992, before going on to earn his master's in education in 1996.

McNair is responsible for turning Alcorn quarterback John Gibbs Jr. into a force on the field. Under the tutelage of McNair, Gibbs passed for 2,482 yards, 21 touchdowns and rushed for 1,006 yards in 2014. In 2013, Gibbs passed for 2,567 yards and 21 touchdowns. He also rushed for 455 yards that same season. After Gibbs was forced to sit midway through the 2014 season following an injury, Lenorris Footman stepped in and found success, thanks in part to McNair's coaching methods. Footman rushed for 1,023 yards and 11 touchdowns, while also passing for 1,106 yards and 14 scores through the air.

Prior to his time on the sidelines at his alma mater, McNair was hired as head football coach, athletic director and teacher at Collins High school in April 2011. The CHS Tigers made it to the second round of the 2011 3-A football playoffs. In addition, McNair coached at Millsaps College in Jackson, Mississippi for four years. During his tenure at Millsaps, they won two Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) championships. In June 2009, McNair was hired as a teacher and coach at Mt. Olive High School. He was the offensive coordinator for the Mt. Olive Pirates.

Upon McNair's retirement from the Arena Football League (AFL), he held various records at the time. He is a seasoned AFL veteran (Albany 1993-95); Florida (1996-00); Carolina (2000-01). He holds almost all passing records, including passing yards in a season (3,269 – 1999), passing touchdowns in a season (60 – 1998), passing touchdowns in a game (8, four times) and passing yards in a game (362 – 2000). McNair also holds all of the now-defunct Carolina Cobras passing records, and became the 13th quarterback in AFL history to surpass the 10,000-yard career passing mark (vs. Carolina in 2000).

Before the league was disbanded in 2019, McNair was ranked in the top eight in the AFL in all-time passes attempted, passes completed and passing yards. Over his eight-year career, McNair completed over 57 percent of his passes, while throwing for 16,591 yards and 291 touchdowns. McNair had a career season in 2001, setting career-highs with 3,271 yards, 63 touchdowns, 434 attempts, 282 completions and a 118.16 quarterback rating.

McNair and his wife, Barbara, reside in Collins with their son, Ahkeem.

TERRY SIMS, HEAD COACH

Entering his seventh season as the head ball coach of Bethune-Cookman University, Terry Sims has experienced very few things that his predecessors endured before him. From taking his Wildcat team to a first-ever visit to a Big 10 stadium when BCU faced Nebraska in 2018 to unprecedented success in the Florida Blue Florida Classic – A 31-27 victory marked BCU's ninth consecutive triumph over Florida A&M and his fifth straight in as many tries, Sims has been a guiding force for a program that has enjoyed success on the field and molds the character of young men off it.

Sims is 36-30 as Head Coach, with winning campaigns in four of his six years. His 2018 team finished on a three-game winning streak. Post-season honors saw Defensive lineman Marques Ford earned First Team All-Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference honors, joined by offensive lineman Dwayne Brown, defensive back Trevor Merritt and return specialist Jimmie Robinson on the second and offensive center L'Dre Barnes and defensive back Tydarius Peters on the third.

In 2017, the Wildcats completed a "resurge" by winning their last four and six of their final seven games. BCU finished 6-2 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, and was just a combined six points away in two road setbacks from an undefeated conference record. The 'Cats defeated rival Florida A&M for the seventh consecutive season, remained undefeated at North Carolina Central with a SportsCenter Top 10 win, and became the first MEAC program to win on the road against a Southland Conference opponent with a Sept. 11 victory at Southeastern Louisiana. The Wildcats put together a perfect 4-0 mark at home with victories over Savannah State, South Carolina State, Hampton, and Morgan State. BCU saw eight different

Wildcats earn postseason All-MEAC honors including three First Team spots with safety Diquan Richardson, offensive lineman Dwayne Brown, and placekicker Uriel Hernandez. Following the season, wide receiver Jawill Davis signed as an undrafted free agent with the New York Giants, while quarterback Larry Brihm and offensive lineman Phillip Norman signed with Calgary and British Columbia, respectively, of the Canadian Football League.

His sophomore season of 2016 saw the Jessup, Georgia native face difficulties that not even he could imagine. Injuries plagued the Wildcats, while weather forced three games to either be delayed significantly, cancelled or moved to another date altogether. Sims saw a total of 16 starters out of the rotation – all through the first five games of the campaign. Despite all of those setbacks, the Wildcats of Bethune-Cookman were able to bounce back to win four consecutive games down the stretch, including the Florida Blue Florida Classic contest in Orlando at newly-renovated Camping World Stadium. The win over rival Florida A&M was the sixth of its kind consecutively. BCU concluded the season with a 4-6 overall mark, but collected three of those wins away from Municipal Stadium for a 2-3 overall mark on the year – with one loss coming at FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision) opponent North Texas.

During his rookie season as a head coach in 2015, Sims led Bethune-Cookman to its fourth consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference title, earning a 9-2 record in his first season. Sims, 45, has been a part of BCU's unprecedented run of five conference titles in six years, joining the staff in spring of 2010. While 2015 marked his first year as head coach, it was his sixth season overall with the program. Sims was introduced as the 15th head coach at Bethune-Cookman on December 22, 2014. He took over the program after spending the previous five years as an assistant coach. Under his guise in 2015, Sims was named MEAC Coach of the Year after matching South Carolina State (1980-83) for the second-longest streak in MEAC history with the run of four MEAC crowns.

The Wildcats were victorious over in-state rival Florida A&M, 35-14 in Sims' debut at the helm in the annual Florida Blue Florida Classic, securing their stake in the conference title. BCU led the MEAC in several statistical categories, including scoring offense (31.4 avg/g), total offense (445.0 avg/g), rushing offense (191.8 yds/g), pass offense (253.2 avg/g), and pass efficiency (164.1 efficiency). The Wildcats also held top 10 positions statistically in the FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) in passing yards per completion (6th) and team passing efficiency (3rd). BCU entered the STATS FCS Top 25 poll in the final ranking of the season (25th), slowly climbing the FCS Coaches Poll to reach 21st nationally following the last game of the regular season against FAMU.

In his five years prior to accepting the head coaching position, Sims oversaw a variety of the day-to-day duties of the BCU program, as well as working extensively with the safeties, and serving as special teams coordinator. He helped to coach a number of MEAC all-league performers, in addition to 2013 All-America safety Nick Addison. In 2014, BCU again captured no less than a share of the school's seventh MEAC crown, as well as the fourth title in the last five seasons. Once again, the defensive side of the ball was a huge part of that success, as they finished in the top three of several categories in the league, as well as nationally.

An experienced coach with ties to Texas and the Mid-Atlantic region, Sims previously served in the secondary at Prairie View A&M. While working with the Panthers, Sims coached the defensive backs, in addition to kick returners. He was also in charge of breaking down film and preparing opponent scouting reports. Additionally, he was active in the planning of recruiting weekends, organizing on-and-off campus recruiting, while serving the role of academic and compliance liaison.

Prior to joining the PVAMU staff in 2004, Sims was the defensive backs coach at Texas Southern University, also serving as the assistant head coach for three seasons. Before coaching at TSU, Sims worked with the running backs at Austin Peay for three seasons. He produced the 1997 Offensive MVP, Chris Black, and DeAunta McAfee, who tied the school touchdown record.

Sims began his coaching career as a student assistant in 1994, working with the linebackers at his alma mater, Knoxville College. His next stop was at the University of Louisville, where he assisted the defensive backs as a graduate assistant in 1995 and had the opportunity to work with Sam Madison, who set the school record for interceptions (16) and passes defended (44), going on to be a four-time Pro Bowl selection with the Miami Dolphins and tie the NFL interception record (21).

Sims is a 1994 graduate of Knoxville College, where he was a team captain as a defensive back on the gridiron, while also patrolling center field in baseball. He would go on to earn his Master's Degree from Louisville in 1997. Sims is married to Joyce. The couple has two children: daughter Sierra, and son Xavier.

WILLIE SIMMONS, HEAD COACH

Willie Simmons was named the 18th full-time head football coach in the history of the Florida A&M University storied program on December 12th, 2017. Simmons enters his fifth season with the Rattlers (24-10, 19-4) in 2022 (the 2020 season was canceled due to COVID-19).

Simmons, a native of Quincy, was a phenomenal prep athlete at Shanks High School, before embarking on a stellar collegiate football playing career that featured stints at Clemson University and The Citadel (S.C.). Simmons comes to Florida A&M University from Prairie View A&M (Tex.) University of the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC), where he spent three seasons (2015-2017) as head football coach. Simmons is considered one of the most creative and innovative offensive minds in the collegiate game.

In 2021, Simmons led the Rattlers to another nine-win season as they finished with a 9-3 record and made the FCS Playoffs for the first time since 2001. The Rattlers finished the season ranked as the number one HBCU in the final NCAA Power Rankings. The biggest win of the season came in the regular-season finale when the Rattlers dominated the Wildcats 46-21 in the Florida Classic. Simmons coached Isaiah Land, who led the nation in sacks and tackles for loss and won several honors, including the Buck Buchanan Award (National Defensive Player of the Year) and SWAC Defensive Player of the Year. Simmons coached nine

players to the All-SWAC Team, six BOXTOROW All-Americans, four FCS Stats Perform All-Americans, and three HERO Sports All-Americans. Simmons also coached safety Markquese Bell, who participated in the NFL Scouting Combine. In 2021, Simmons led the Rattlers to 22 national top-25 statistical rankings.

In 2019, Simmons brought the Rattlers back to national prominence, leading them to a 9-2 record (6th best winning percentage in the nation) and winning the 2019 HBCU National Championship. They finished the season ranked No. 24 in the country (STATS and Coaches' Poll) and ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation (STATS Poll, week 12). The biggest win of the season came against North Carolina A&T (ranked No. 10 in the nation at the time of playing).

The Rattlers' air attack was unstoppable in 2019, as their passing offense ranked No. 17 in the nation (291.1 YPG) and the scoring offense ranked No. 26 (32.7 PPG). In addition, the Rattlers were among the best when it came to turnovers (No. 21 for turnover margin), converting 3rd downs (No. 13), and keeping the quarterback upright (No. 4). Defensively, the Rattlers were ranked No. 21 in team passing efficiency defense (118.7), No. 25 in rushing defense, No. 42 in total defense, and No. 16 in passes intercepted. Simmons coached a six student-athletes to the All-MEAC First Team and quarterback Ryan Stanley was named MEAC Offensive Player of the Year. In Simmons' first season as head coach, the Rattlers saw an improvement in conference wins (from 2-6 to 5-2), total offense (No. 74 / 345.5 YPG to No. 57 / 391.2 YPG), total defense (No. 60 / 365 YPG to No. 34 / 354.8 YPG), and scoring defense (No. 81/28.1 PPG to No. 23 / 22.1 PPG).

During his tenure at Prairie View A&M, Simmons elevated the Panthers to prime contender status in the SWAC Western Division. Simmons fashioned a 21-11 overall record and a 19-6 league record, highlighted by an 8-2 debut campaign in 2015, which included an 8-1 runner up finish in the division to eventual division champion Grambling State, after dropping a sizzling 70-54 wild west shootout in the State Fair Classic in Dallas, Texas. Simmons worked three seasons at Alcorn State (2012-14) under Jay Hopson and helped initiate a meteoric revival of a proud Braves gridiron program, which had won just (2) games the previous season.

The 2014 campaign was an even better year for Simmons and the Braves, as they won the Southwestern Athletic Conference Championship over Southern University and were named Black College National Champions. Before his successful run at Alcorn, Simmons' first full-time work as an assistant coach on the college level came at Middle Tennessee State University in Murfreesboro (2007-11), under head coach Rick Stockstill, who recruited Simmons to Clemson. After three seasons as the running backs coach at MTSU, Simmons was promoted to Pass Game Coordinator. The following season, he was promoted to Offensive Coordinator. By the age of 30, he was one of the youngest coordinators at the FBS level.

Simmons began his coaching career in 2005 at Lincoln High School in Tallahassee, Fla., where he coached the quarterbacks and was also the Passing Game Coordinator. After one season, he was brought back to his alma mater Clemson as a Graduate Assistant working with the quarterbacks in 2006. Simmons had a distinguished prep career at Quincy's James Shanks High School, earning All-American honors as a quarterback (ranked No. 10 quarterback nationally). Simmons led the Tigers to their first district championship in 22 years and named Big Bend Offensive Player of the Year after throwing for 2,505 yards and 32 touchdowns.

He received over 25 scholarship offers, signing with Clemson, where he lettered three years (2000-2002), participating in four bowl games (Peach, Gator, Humanitarian, and Tangerine). Simmons earned a bachelor's degree in Services (Sports) Marketing from Clemson in the spring of 2002. Simmons initially transferred to Florida A&M University for his senior season. After being deemed ineligible to compete because FAMU was in provisional status as a Division I-A (now FBS) program, he enrolled at The Citadel (S.C.), where he garnered All-Southern Conference First Team honors after leading the Bulldogs to a 6-6 record. After Simmons' college career, he played one season of Arena Football in the United Indoor Football League for the Sioux City Bandits. Simmons is married to the former Shaia Rene Beckwith, a two-time graduate of Florida A&M. They have six children, Louis III, Amerie, Raven, Shailoh, Wraylon, and Truth.

HUE JACKSON, HEAD COACH

Hue Jackson became the 14th head coach in the Grambling State University football program on December 10, 2021. Jackson comes to Grambling State after spending the past year as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Tennessee State University.

Jackson, who has more than 30 years of coaching experience at both the collegiate and professional levels, began his coaching career in 1987 at the University of the Pacific, his alma mater, and spent a majority of the next 13 years in the college ranks. He then moved to the professional ranks in 2001 and remained in the National Football League until 2019.

Jackson spent three years as a graduate assistant at Pacific from 1987-1989 before spending two seasons as the running backs coach and special team's coordinator at Cal State Fullerton. In the spring of 1991, Jackson experienced the professional level for the first time, coaching the running backs, wide receivers and special teams for the World League's London Monarchs.

Jackson returned to the collegiate level in 1992 where he spent four years (1992-1995) at Arizona State University. He coached the running backs for his first three seasons at ASU and worked with the quarterbacks in his fourth year. Jackson was appointed offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at California in 1996, leading the Bears to the Aloha Bowl. The following year, Jackson began a four-year stint as the offensive coordinator at the University of Southern California (USC). While at USC, Jackson helped guide the Trojans in 2000 to the top of the Pac 10 in total offense. In addition, he was responsible for recruiting two Heisman Trophy-winning quarterbacks to USC – Carson Palmer (2002) and Matt Leinart (2004).

The first opportunity in the NFL for Jackson came with the Washington Redskins (now the Washington Football Team). He handled the running back corps for two seasons before being named offensive coordinator in 2003. In 2004, Jackson began a three-year stretch coaching the wide receivers with the Cincinnati Bengals. Under Jackson's tutelage, Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh combined for 175 receptions for 2,388 yards in 2005, helping the Bengals secure the AFC North title and a playoff berth for the first time in 15 years. The following year, Johnson (1,369 yards) and Houshmandzadeh (1,081 yards) became the first pair of Bengals to eclipse the 1,000-yard receiving mark in a single season.

Jackson left Cincinnati to become the offensive coordinator with the Atlanta Falcons in 2007 before spending two seasons as the quarterback coach with the Baltimore Ravens. In 2010, Jackson became the offensive coordinator for the Oakland Raiders. After leading the Raiders to a top five finish in scoring (25.6 points/game), Jackson was named head coach for the 2011 season. Oakland finished the year at 8-8.

Jackson started his second tour with the Bengals in 2012 as a secondary assistant and special teams coach. In 2013, he moved back to the offensive side of the ball, handling the running backs coach. A year later, Jackson was promoted to offensive coordinator. In 2016, Jackson was hired as the head coach of the Cleveland Browns, where he held the position into the 2018 season. After his time in Cleveland, Jackson returned to Cincinnati as a special assistant to head coach, Marvin Lewis.

Collegiately, Jackson played quarterback at Pacific after transferring from Glendale Community College. During his career at UOP, he amassed over 3,400 yards in total offense and 19 touchdowns in two seasons. Jackson also earned a letter in basketball as a senior.

Jackson earned a degree in Physical Education from the University of Pacific in 1986.

DEION SANDERS, HEAD COACH

Deion Sanders has always been a game-changer. In his tenure as Head Football Coach of Jackson State University, Sanders has again changed the game for the Tiger Football, the Department of Athletics, the University as a whole, the Southwestern Athletic Conference, College Football, and the Nation. An unprecedented calendar year of 2021 showed the power of the influence of Sanders and the brand of Jackson State University coming together as one, seemingly in perfect alignment.

As the Southwestern Athletic Conference played a spring 2021 football season due to the coronavirus, the number 21 Sanders donned on his way to a Pro Football Hall of Fame career became immersed at JSU. Sanders, named as the 21st head coach in the proud history of JSU football on September 21, 2020, led the Tigers in his first game as head coach on February 21, 2021. A 53-0 win began the "Coach Prime" era that was a touch point of the elevation of JSU football and the University into becoming one of the most impactful and recognizable brands nationwide. With viewership for the first two games surpassing more than 200,000 online views on ESPN3, the power of Coach Prime and JSU transformed the network and led to the final four contested games of the spring season televised on linear television on ESPN or ESPN2 as JSU posted a 4-3 record.

In Fall 2021, Sanders led Jackson State back to championship glory with a school-record 11-win season and the first Southwestern Athletic Conference football championship since 2007. JSU went undefeated in conference play (8-0) and won nine consecutive games to complete the regular season en route to the SWAC Championship and the program's first-ever berth in the Celebration Bowl. Jackson State set an FCS record for attendance in Fall 2021, averaging more than 42,000 fans per home game. Coach Prime was named SWAC Coach of the Year and the FCS Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year. Freshman QB Shedeur Sanders shone brightly in the national spotlight as his father, as he was named as the FCS Jerry Rice Freshman of the Year after passing for 3,231 yards and 30 touchdowns with only eight interceptions.

A fierce advocate for additional exposure and a level playing field for all Historically Black Colleges and Universities, Sanders has continued to push for opportunities to highlight talent in the SWAC and across the culture. In March 2022, Sanders held a Pro Day featuring athletes from four other schools in the state of Mississippi to provide a platform in front of 22 NFL teams and the Canadian Football League. In April 2022, Jackson State became the first HBCU to have its spring football game televised live nationally on ESPN.

The influence of Coach Prime has directly impacted Jackson State football, as several of the nation's best players have made their way into the program. University of Florida transfer James Houston IV was a dominant player for JSU in 2021, earning All-SWAC and All-America accolades as he ranked second in the nation in both sacks (16.5) and tackles for loss (24.5). In Spring 2022, Houston became the 100th NFL Draft selection in the illustrious history of the Jackson State University football program, selected in the sixth round by the Detroit Lions.

Houston was one of seven Tigers to earn a professional football opportunity in the NFL, CFL, or USFL. CB C.J. Holmes and TE Kyland Richey (New Orleans Saints), WR Keith Corbin (Buffalo Bills), CB Al Young (New York Giants), WR Warren Newman (Montreal Alouettes), and DE Antwan Owens (Philadelphia Stars) all signed pro contracts. In December 2021, wide receiver / cornerback Travis Hunter, the top high school prospect in the nation, signed a national letter of intent with Jackson State football and enrolled at JSU in spring 2022.

An eight-time Pro Bowler, nine-time All Pro, and two-time Super Bowl champion, Sanders played 14 NFL seasons for the Atlanta Falcons, San Francisco 49ers, Dallas Cowboys, Washington Redskins, and Baltimore Ravens. Sanders, who also played nine seasons of Major League Baseball with the New York Yankees, Atlanta Braves, San Francisco Giants, and Cincinnati Reds, is the only athlete to play in both a Super Bowl and a World Series.

Among his accolades, Sanders set an NFL record with 19 return touchdowns in his career and was the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year in 1994. A two-time football All-American at Florida State whom also played baseball and ran track, Sanders was a first-round draft choice (5th overall) of the Atlanta Falcons in 1989. In 2020, for the NFL's 100th Season, Sanders was named to the NFL All-Time Team. In 2011, Sanders was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. In that same year, Sanders was also inducted into the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame.

Prior to leading Jackson State, Sanders had been coaching for over a decade. Sanders was the offensive coordinator at Trinity Christian School in Cedar Hill, Texas, leading the Tigers to three-straight Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS) titles and a 42-3 record. In February 2022, Sanders was named as an HBCU legacy coach for NFL Pro Bowl.

Following through on a long-standing goal, in 2020, Sanders graduated from Talladega College with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration with an emphasis in Organizational Management. He is the proud father of five children: sons Deion Jr., Shilo, and Shedeur, and daughters Deiondra and Shelomi. Jackson State is a family affair for Coach Prime, as sons Shilo (safety) and Shedeur are both starters on the JSU football team, while Deion Jr. oversees the social media engagement. His youngest daughter Shelomi is an incoming freshman on the JSU women's basketball team.

VINCENT DANCY, HEAD COACH

Vincent Dancy took over the helm of Mississippi Valley State University's football program January 2018. He is 17th head football coach to lead the Delta Devils. Prior to assuming his new role, he served as MVSU football's defensive coordinator since Feb. 2015 before being appointed to the interim head coach role in November 2017. "I remain committed to building a championship program for the players, alumni, faculty, staff and fans of Mississippi Valley State University," said Dancy. "We have recruited quite a few football athletes from the state of Mississippi and the surrounding corridors of the state. My staff and I are filling the gaps in those areas that we were missing as it relates to player personnel, and meeting with our alumni chapters and community stakeholders to reconnect and assist us in restoring our brand from the glory days of Delta Devil football."

Under Dancy's tutelage, several Delta Devils have earned recognition on the gridiron. Jerry Garner, a Spring 2021 Preseason All-SWAC Defensive Lineman, was recognized in the fall of 2020 as a first team member of the Phil Steetle & draftscout.com FCS Preseason All-Conference Team along with teammate defensive lineman Eric Powell (Coaling, CA) receiving second team honors.

Spring 2020 saw Valley senior defensive lineman Bryant Jones (Riverside, CA) being offered an invitation to The Los Angeles Rams rookie minicamp. Jones played four seasons for the Delta Devils, beginning in 2015. In his college career he registered 164 tackles, 21 for loss and three sacks. Jones was listed on the Rams' active roster as a defensive tackle for the 2020 NFL season.

SWAC All-Conference linebacker Tracy Thompkins (Miami, FL) led Mississippi Valley State defense recording 107 tackles, 12.5 tackles for a loss, three forced fumbles and pass breakups, two fumble recovery, one sack and an interception in 2019. The senior from Miami, Florida led the SWAC in three categories; tackles (9.7), forced fumbles (.30), and solo tackles (6.1). He was third in fumbles recovered and fourth in tackles for a loss. Amongst the NCAA FCS Thompkins was sixth in solo tackles and 15th in the nation in total tackles. He was a finalist for The C Spire Conerly Trophy awarded to the most outstanding college football player in the state of Mississippi.

In 2018, through his first nine games, Booker Chambers (Greenwood, MS) averaged 8.6 yards per carry and ran for three touchdowns and 265 yards. He also caught 41 passes for 554 yards and four touchdowns, and averaged 23 yards per punt return and 25.3 yards on kickoff, with two punt returns for touchdowns. Chambers earned a spot on the All-SWAC First Team as a return specialist and earned Second Team honors as a receiver to end his career at the Valley. Chambers, the former SWAC Freshman of the Year, was also a finalist for The C Spire Conerly Trophy Award in 2018.

Delta Devils wide receiver Quinn McElfresh (Brainerd, MN) finished his senior season in 2018 with 31 receptions for 246 yards and two touchdowns – bringing his MVSU career total to 88 receptions, 1,135 total yards, and seven touchdowns. The former SWAC Newcomer of the Year and All-SWAC Conference wide receiver, McElfresh completed his Valley career by accepting invitations to The FCS National Bowl and the 2019 SPIRAL Tropical Bowl.

In 2014, Dancy was the defensive coordinator for Paine College in Augusta, Georgia. The Lions defense finished 9th in Division II National Ranking in pass defense in the school's first year of football in 50 years. Prior to his one-year stint at Paine, Dancy spent four years at Jackson State (2009-2013) coaching the outside linebackers as a graduate assistant before he became the fulltime safeties coach. In 2012 Jackson State's secondary led the conference in takeaways. They were also ranked #1 in total defense several years.

Dancy graduated from Jackson State, where he was also a standout student-athlete. A four year letterman in football, Dancy was an All-SWAC performer at linebacker and safety. Dancy obtained his bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 2006, and then earned a master's in 2008 from West Alabama in Livingston, Alabama, in Counseling and Psychology and as graduate assistant (Jackson State) he earned a second master's in Physical Education.

He is a native of Shuqualak, Mississippi and the son of Mississippi Valley State University alumnus Willie Dancy '74 and Evelyn Murray.

BUBBA McDOWELL, HEAD COACH

McDowell was named the head football coach of Prairie View A&M on January 4 of 2022. The former NFL defensive standout is in his 11th season as a part of the Prairie View A&M coaching staff to include four seasons as an assistant head coach. He also coached the Panther cornerbacks in the last three seasons.

During the 2019 season, Jaylen Harris asserted himself as one of the most disruptive cornerbacks in the nation, leading the SWAC in total passes defended and ranking among the top 10 nationally in the category on his way to first-team All-SWAC honors. In 2018, Ju'Anthony Parker earned first-team All-SWAC and BOXTOROW All-America honors for the second straight year while Harris had a career high in interceptions, and both players had interception returns for touchdowns. While coaching safeties in 2017, Reggie Stubblefield emerged as the fourth leading tackler on the team (51 stops) while tying for second in interceptions (two), and leading the team in pass breakups (10).

In 2016, Marquice O'Leary was fourth on the team in tackles and third in passes defense. Running back turned nickel back Arthur Lockett was sixth in tackles, tied for the team lead in interceptions, returning one for touchdown, and ranked second on the team in pass defense.

In 2015, O'Leary earned second-team All-SWAC honors after ranking third on the team in both tackles (51) and pass defense (five) and second in interceptions (two). In 2014, true freshman defensive back Damond Jackson flourished under McDowell's guidance as he earned a spot on the All-SWAC second team. Jackson finished third on the team with 80 tackles and 5.5 tackles for loss. He also broke up five passes and forced a fumble with one interception.

McDowell was challenged with working with one of the youngest units on the team entering the 2013 season as the majority of players in his unit had limited NCAA playing experience. At the end of the season, a pair of redshirt freshmen cornerbacks in Joshua Holley and Foster Brown II finished fourth and fifth, respectively, on the team in tackles while also combining for 10 pass breakups. McDowell played a big part in the career performance from safety Brian Medlock in 2012 as he earned All-SWAC Second Team Honors at safety during his senior campaign. Medlock led the Panthers with four interceptions in 2012 and finished tied for second in SWAC play in addition to defending a total of eight passes. Under McDowell's watch, safety Korey Alston also had a big season as he completed his inaugural season at Prairie View A&M with 41 tackles and three pass breakups.

In his first year at PVAMU in 2011, McDowell inherited the youngest unit on the defensive side of the ball as only one player had made a start in a collegiate game. Despite the lack of experience, the Panthers received career highs from all of its safeties as Medlock led the way after finishing fifth on the team in tackles along with four pass breakups.

Born in Georgia and raised in Florida, McDowell was a four-year letterman at the University of Miami and earned a National Championship ring as a starter on the undefeated 1987 squad under former head coach Jimmy Johnson. McDowell was also recognized by ESPN for his play on the gridiron that season as his knock down of a two-point attempt against longtime rival Florida State was featured as the 11th-best play that defined college football. He graduated with a degree in business management in 1989. McDowell was drafted by the NFL's Houston Oilers in 1989 and immediately became a starter en route to earning First Team All-Rookie Accolades from Pro Football Weekly and Football News. After a solid rookie year, McDowell played a big part in the Oilers' success on the field as they posted five consecutive winning seasons and five AFC Playoff berths from 1989 to 1993. In 1991, McDowell earned NFL All-Pro Honors and was honored by the Oilers with the "Ed Block Memorial Courage Award" which acknowledged his courage in the pursuit of professional excellence.

During his final season with the Oilers in 1994, McDowell was selected as the Houston Oilers' NFL Man of the Year for his work in the community. McDowell moved to the state of North Carolina prior to the 1995 season and helped usher in a new era as he played on the inaugural roster of the Carolina Panthers before retiring the next season. Despite concluding his career in North Carolina, McDowell remained popular in the city of Houston for his work in both the business and community sectors. In 1995, he became one of the first two professional athletes to receive the Human Enrichment of Life "Young African American Achiever" award. During the same year, he became the first athlete ever to receive the Friends of Friends "Positive Influential African American Male" award. In 1996, McDowell earned the first "Warren Moon Athletic and Community Service Award" by Houston's United Negro College Fund which recognized former professional athletes who have excelled in their particular sport while improving the lives of others.

McDowell remained active in a variety of athletic ventures across the Houston area in addition to coaching on the high school level for several years. He has also completed NFL Minority Coaching Internships with the Green Bay Packers, Miami Dolphins and Houston Texans. McDowell has two sons, Trey and Myles.

ERIC DOOLEY, HEAD COACH

Eric Dooley named as the 20th Head Coach of the Jaguar Football program on December 7, 2021. Coach Dooley is no stranger to Southern as he was on legendary Coach Pete Richardson staff at SU from 1997-2010. As a part of that staff, he helped guide the Jags to the 1997 and 2003 HBCU National Championship and 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2003 SWAC Championships.

Coach Dooley returns to "The Bluff" after spending the previous four seasons at the helm of the Prairie View A&M football program. He most recently led Prairie View to the 2021 SWAC Championship game and won the SWAC Western Division Championship, finishing with an 7-5(6-2 SWAC) record. Four Panthers earned all-conference honors during the 2021 campaign. Under Coach Dooley Prairie View finished third in both team total offense and defensive categories in 2021. Coach Dooley and the Panthers concluded the Spring 2021 campaign with a 2-1 record, with a pair of conference wins.

Coach Dooley guided one of the nation's most explosive and productive offenses in the country in 2019. During that campaign the Panthers posted a 6-5 record, including another State Fair Classic win over Grambling and continued dominance over Texas Southern in the Labor Day Classic. The Panthers ranked No. 4 nationally in total offense while garnering top 25 rankings in passing offense, rushing offense, scoring offense, passing efficiency, passing defensive efficiency and sacks allowed. The Panthers led the SWAC in total offense and ranked second — 35th nationally — in total defense. Seven players earned all-conference honors during that season.

In his first season at PV, the Panthers became the first team in program history to have three 60-point scoring games in one season. PVAMU ended the season with back-to-back 60-point games against Alabama St. (66-13) and Texas Southern (60-14) while recording the largest margin of victory over the archrival Tigers in program history. PVAMU set a school record with 815 yards total offense in a win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on September 22, 2018 tallying a total of nine touchdowns.

Prior to PV Coach Dooley spent the previous four seasons at Grambling State University as offensive coordinator (2014-17), including one year as quarterbacks coach (2014) and two years as receivers coach (2016-17). Dooley helped the Tigers to three consecutive Southwestern Athletic Conference Western Division titles (2015-17), two SWAC Championships (2016-17), and an HBCU National Championship (2016). While at GSU, his offenses averaged at least 31 points per game in all four seasons and ranked first or second in the SWAC in scoring offense each of the last three seasons. In 2016, he was named American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Assistant Coach of the Year.

Under Dooley's guidance in 2015, Grambling ranked fourth in the nation in scoring (41.3 points per game), scored 65 touchdowns, and averaged 470.0 yards per game. The Tigers produced the SWAC Offensive Player of the Year during 2015-2017. A pair of players during Dooley's tenure made NFL rosters in 2016 free agent WR Chester Rogers – Indianapolis Colts and 2017 third-round draft pick Chad Williams – Arizona Cardinals.

In three seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Arkansas-Pine Bluff (2011-13), the Golden Lions offense improved each year under his direction. In 2011, QB Ben Anderson earned SWAC Freshman of the Year accolades while ranking second in the league in passing offense. In 2012, UAPB set a school record for wins (10) and won its first outright SWAC Championship since 1966 and were crowned HBCU National Champions. During Dooley's tenure, tackle Terron Armstead became a third-round pick by the New Orleans Saints in the 2013 NFL Draft.

Those seven seasons as offensive coordinator was preceded by 14 years as an assistant coach at Southern University (1997-2010). In his one season as running backs coach (1997), he helped to produce a pair of All-SWAC rushers, including SWAC Player of the Year, Steve Wofford. As receivers coach at Southern (1997-2010), he developed the two most prolific receivers in school history (Michael Hayes, Juamorris Stewart).

Coach Dooley played wide receiver at Grambling under legendary coach Eddie Robinson (1985 – 1988), winning two SWAC Championships. He earned his bachelor's degree from Southern University New Orleans (1999), and his master's degree from Southern University Baton Rouge (2005).

His professional playing experience includes earning a free agent contract with the Canadian Football League's Calgary Stampeders, one year with the AFL's Arizona Rattlers and one year with the World League's Taipei Dragons (China). He also spent time coaching at his alma mater, Alcee Fortier Senior High, as the wide receiver coach, and as offensive coordinator at McMain High School, both in New Orleans, La.

Some of his off-field activities include being a member of the American Football Coaches Association as well as being a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated. Dooley and his wife, Alicia, enjoy the gift of three children, Taajah, Kattera, and Dy'mond.

CLARENCE MCKINNEY, HEAD COACH

Clarence McKinney was named Head Football Coach at Texas Southern University on Dec. 3, 2018 and begins his fourth season. Faced with a major rebuilding job in his first season at TSU, McKinney quickly went to work in building a foundation for future success. On the field, the TSU offense finished fourth overall in the SWAC in total offense with 416.6 yards per game and nearly 3,000 total yards as it marked one of the top offensive finishes in university history and the highest offensive output since 2010. The offense boasted a 1,000-yard receiver in Donnie Corley in addition to one of the top kickers in the SWAC in freshman Richard Garcia III as both earned All-SWAC honors. The Tigers also showed SWAC opponents what to expect in the future as several of their games came down to the wire despite fielding a youthful roster with true freshmen in key roles.

McKinney also displayed his leadership in the spring of 2021 after leading the Tigers in their historic spring season. Senior defensive lineman Michael Badejo earned second team All-SWAC honors while also navigating the team through the challenges of COVID-19. In addition, defensive linebacker Tim Walton made history as a draft pick of the United States Football League (USFL).

McKinney's rebuilding efforts began to bear fruit in the fall of 2021 as TSU began to turn the corner with its play on the field. The Tiger offense finished second in the SWAC as the unit averaged 29 points per game while also averaging 429 yards per contest. The Tigers also ranked second in rush offense (188.1), third in passing (241.2) and first downs (20.1) and fourth in red zone offense (83.7 percent). On special teams, the Tigers finished second in PATs (38-of-39), third in punt returns (11.8) and kickoffs (39.1) as the team won a pair of SWAC contests.

TSU also defeated Southern University for the first time since 2011 and had several games decided in the closing minutes which displayed a full team effort for nearly 60 minutes. Four Tigers were rewarded for their efforts on the gridiron with a spot on the 2021 All-SWAC Football Team as it marked the most Tigers to earn all-conference postseason honors since 2010. Individually, freshman quarterback Andrew Body exploded on the scene in 2021 as one of the top players in the SWAC after ranking top 10 in both passing and rushing in addition to second in total offense. Senior wide receiver Ke'Lenn Davis finished third in the SWAC in receiving yards. Kick returner LaDarius Owens finished fifth in kick return average and second in all-purpose yardage. The TSU offensive line also made a complete turnaround from his first season as the unit finished third in the SWAC in sacks allowed. Defensively, linebacker Tarik Cooper finished 14th in the SWAC in tackles while cornerback Isaiah Hamilton finished 14th with nine pass deflections and seventh in fumble recoveries.

Off the field, McKinney and his coaching staff has worked tirelessly in spreading the TSU football brand in the Houston area and state of Texas. On the recruiting front, McKinney has begun to restock the roster with quality high school talent from across the state which will pay dividends in the future while also having three student-athletes during his watch earn an opportunity to play professional football. In the classroom, McKinney has also handled business as 50-plus student-athletes have graduated under his watch after two seasons while the team continues to place many its student-athletes on the SWAC Commissioner's Honor Roll on a yearly basis.

McKinney arrived to Texas Southern after spending the 2018 season as Associate Head Coach/Running Backs at Arizona. Prior to his stint with the Wildcats, McKinney spent six seasons at Texas A&M serving as Running Backs coach (2012-17) as well as Offensive Coordinator (2013). In 2016 the Aggies produced one of the greatest rushing seasons in the last 20 years at Texas A&M. Trayveon Williams surpassed the 1,000-yard mark with 1,057 yards, while Keith Ford chipped in 669 yards as the Aggies' rushing attack averaged 5.7 yards per carry and produced 211.8 yards per game.

In 2015, the Aggies' running back corps produced its first 1,000-yard rusher of the McKinney era when Tra Carson rushed for 1,165 yards, which included seven 100-yard rushing games. Using a balanced rotation of running backs in 2014, the Aggies' trio of runners averaged over five yards per carry while combining for 1,520 rushing yards and 15 rushing touchdowns. In addition to his running back coach duties, McKinney served as the Aggies' offensive coordinator and play-caller for the 2013 Cotton Bowl and the 2013 regular season. Under his direction, the Aggies led the SEC in passing, scoring and total offense, while setting school records for passing yards, touchdowns and completion percentage. Under McKinney's direction in 2012, the Aggies' top three running backs combined for more than 1,600 yards while averaging 5.5 yards per carry. Combined with quarterback Johnny Manziel, A&M's rushing attack was the best in the SEC and was the school's most productive ground game in more than 20 seasons.

Prior to coming to Texas A&M, McKinney served as Houston's recruiting coordinator, in addition to overseeing the Cougar running backs. During his four-year stay, the Cougars compiled a 36-17 record and played in three bowl games. Prior to joining the staff at UH, McKinney served as head football coach at Jack Yates High School, compiling a winning record of 30-8 in three seasons. While at Yates he received several accolades, including being named a 2006 Gordon Wood 4A Coach of the Year Finalist and a 2007 Texans Coach of the Year Finalist.

McKinney also served as an assistant football coach at North Shore High School (2003-05) and Booker T. Washington High School (1997-2003) where he was named the 2003 Houston Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Under his leadership as head and assistant coach, McKinney helped many young men to receive scholarships to NCAA Division I schools and pursue their dreams of playing in the NFL.

DOC GAMBLE, HEAD COACH

Doc Gamble was named Arkansas at Pine Bluff head football coach in April 2020, and, in the historic 2021 spring season of Southwestern Athletic Conference football, has guided the Golden Lions to the SWAC Western Division championship since 2012 and a berth in today's Cricket Wireless SWAC Championship Game presented by Pepsi Zero Sugar. The 21st head coach in program history is in his third season with UAPB, having joined the staff as assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach in the spring of 2018.

In 2019, UAPB ranked second in the SWAC in passing yards with 3,105. Using a two-quarterback system most of the year, Shannon Patrick (2,250 yards, 19 TDs) and Skyler Perry (784 yards, 8 TD) along with Taylor Holston combined for the third-highest passing TDs total in the league with 28. Patrick had a three-game stretch in contests against Lane, Miss. Valley St. and Grambling where he threw for nearly 900 yards and nine touchdowns.

In Gamble's first season at UAPB, he guided a pair of first-year quarterbacks to solid seasons. Junior college transfer Patrick got off to an explosive start in throwing for 700 yards with six touchdowns and no interceptions in two games before an injury to his throwing hand sidelined him for the rest of the season. True freshman Perry started the final eight

games, passing for nearly 1,800 yards and eight touchdowns.

In Gamble second season, UAPB had three student-athletes earned All-SWAC honors — linebacker Monroe Beard III, offensive lineman Mark Evans II, and punter Josh Sanchez. Evans is a two-time First Team All-Conference, BoxtoRow All-American, HBCU Classic All-American, and Rated top-10 HBCU player by Pro Football Network. Evans started in all 11 games and tagged on several NFL scouts' draft boards as players to watch. He played a significant role in helping UAPB finish in the top 6 (SWAC) in total yards per game (1,383), and ranked in the top in the conference in knockdowns. Beard ranked in the top-10 in several categories in the conference, 5th in total tackles (78), 5th tackles average per game (7.1), 6th in the conference in solo tackles (44), 9th in the conference in sacks (5). Sanchez started in all 11 games for the Golden Lions and ranked one of the top punters in the conference, averaging (40.2) yards per punt, ranking 6th in the conference. Sanchez tied for first in the conference (SWAC) with punts landed inside the 20 with (21), ranks 5th in the conference with punts over 50+ (8).

Prior to UAPB, Gamble spent five seasons at Kent State University as wide receivers coach. In Gamble's first season with the Flashes (2013), Dri Archer earned All-MAC honors as a slot receiver. Wideout Chris Humphrey doubled his output from the previous season, catching 51 passes for 613 yards and three touchdowns, the most yards by a Kent State receiver since 2010. In 2014, Humphrey matched his 51 catches and topped his receiving yard total (635) in 11 games. He was also named to the Academic All-MAC Team. Sophomore receiver Ernest Calhoun had a breakout season with 33 catches for 319 yards, while redshirt freshman Kris White totaled 25 catches for 270 yards.

In 2015, Gamble helped develop a pair of freshman receivers (Antwan Dixon & Johnny Woods), who combined for 47 catches and 521 receiving yards. At season's end, Connor Arlia and Luke Grandjean each earned Academic All-MAC honors. Three true freshmen (Kavious Price, Trey Harrell & Mike Carrigan) worked their way into the receiver rotation in 2016 under Gamble's guidance. Senior Ernest Calhoun caught a career-high four touchdowns.

Prior to Kent State, Gamble coached running backs and tight ends and served as the recruiting coordinator at Alcorn State University in 2012. Prior to Alcorn State, Gamble spent one season as an offensive assistant at the University of Cincinnati. The Bearcats went 10-3 in 2011 and won a share of the Big East title. From 2003-07, and from 2009-11, Gamble coached at his alma mater, Withrow High School in Cincinnati, Ohio. He posted a 53-19 record and a pair of playoff appearances. He also served as the head football coach at Fairfield High School for one year (2008). During his time at Withrow and Fairfield, 120 of his student-athletes went on to play college football at various levels. In 2004 he received the Paul Brown Excellence in Coaching Award, while at Withrow. Coach Gamble began his coaching career as a student-assistant coaching quarterbacks at the University of Tennessee at Martin in 1995. He then returned to Withrow as an assistant coach for four seasons.

Returning to the college ranks in 2000, Gamble was an assistant at Mount St. Joseph University for two seasons. He was also a graduate assistant and linebackers coach at East Carolina University in 2002. While a student at Withrow, Gamble was the quarterback for three seasons, including one undefeated year. He then went on to play quarterback at North Dakota State College of Science and at the University of Tennessee at Martin. He graduated from the University of Tennessee at Martin in 1995 with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education and health with a concentration in sports management.
