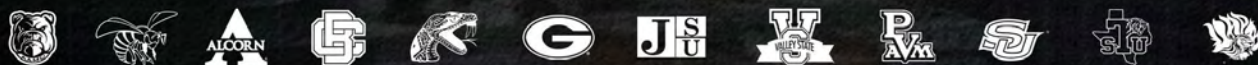

CONFERENCE MISSION

The Southwestern Athletic Conference is organized exclusively for the purpose of encouraging, promoting, advancing, and conducting intercollegiate sports activities and other recreational and not-for-profit activities among the members of the Conference. Its purposes are to:

- To uphold the principles of institutional control of, and responsibility for all collegiate sports conducted by the members of this organization in conformity with the Constitution and Bylaws hereof;
- To stimulate and improve intercollegiate athletic sports;
- To comply with satisfactory standards of scholarship and amateur standing and good sportsmanship;
- To preserve and maintain the collegiate athletic records of the members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference, and make them available upon request;
- To cooperate with other amateur athletic organizations in the promotion and conduct of intercollegiate athletic contests;
- To maintain fiscal management; and
- To legislate through Bylaws or Resolutions on subjects of general concern to the membership.

The members of the conference are committed to the philosophy of maintaining intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the overall educational program. To this end, the conference believes in and subscribes to the fundamental principles of amateurism, institutional control, sound academic standards, financial aid, recruiting, and ethical conduct that governs intercollegiate athletics, and the enforcement of rules and regulations as adopted by the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

HISTORY AT A GLANCE

In 1920, eight men representing six colleges from the state of Texas met to discuss collegiate athletics and the many challenges that face their respective institutions. By the time the session in Houston had concluded,

they had founded an athletic league that has slowly become one of the leading sports associations in the world of collegiate athletics, the Southwestern Athletic Conference. The founding fathers of the original Super Six were:

- C.H. Fuller of Bishop College
- Red Randolph and C.H. Patterson of Paul Quinn
- E.G. Evans, H.J. Evans and H.J. Starns of Prairie View A&M
- D.C. Fuller of Texas College
- G. Whitte Jordan of Wiley College

SAM SHADE, HEAD COACH

Sam Shade begins his first season as the head football coach at Alabama A&M University.

Before coming to The Hill, Shade spent three seasons as the head coach at Miles College where he compiled an 18-15 overall record and a 15-7 mark inside the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC). In addition, his 2024 team won the conference title and reached the second round of the NCAA Division II playoffs, falling to top-ranked Valdosta State in the second round.

In 2023, the Golden Bears finished 7-3 overall, 6-2 in the SIAC. The season included the program's first win over Division I FCS opponent Alabama State and a 9.2 average margin of victory. It was a marked improvement over his first season in Fairfield, where Miles went 1-9 overall, 1-5 in the SIAC Western Division.

Shade came to Miles after spending two years as head football coach at Pinson Valley High School, where he won an Alabama High School Athletic Association Class 6A state championship in his first season in 2020.

Prior to coaching, Shade played eight years in the NFL for the Cincinnati Bengals (1995-98) and Washington Redskins (1999-02). He was the Bengals' leading tackler in 1997 while ranking second on the team in 1998, and then he led the Redskins in 1999.

During his NFL career, his defensive coordinators included NFL Hall of Fame coach Dick LeBeau as well as Mike Nolan,

Ray Rhodes and Marvin Lewis. In April 2000, Shade received the Redskins' Unsung Hero Award for commitment and community service involvement.

Shade played collegiately at Alabama, where he was a member of the Crimson Tide's 1992 national championship team and was named a team captain as a senior in 1994. He was selected by the Bengals in the fourth round of the 1995 NFL Draft.

Following his retirement from the NFL, Shade began his coaching career as a volunteer coach at Briarwood Christian School in Birmingham, Ala., from 2004-08 before spending eight years at Samford, coaching the secondary and special teams. He would then move to Georgia State, where he coached cornerback. His career would send him back to the NFL as an assistant special teams coach for the Cleveland Browns before returning home to coach at Pinson Valley.

Shade is a Birmingham native who attended Wenonah High School, where he was the recipient of the prestigious Bryant Jordan Scholar Athlete Award, given to the state's top student-athlete. He earned his bachelor's degree from Alabama in business administration and finance.

He and his wife Jacquetta have four children: sons Justin and Jacoby, and daughters Jaila and Jamyia.

EDDIE ROBINSON, HEAD COACH

Eddie Robinson, Jr., who was named the 30th head coach in Alabama State University on Nov. 26, 2021, enters his fourth season as the Head Football Coach at Alabama State University.

ROBINSON AT 'BAMA STATE

Overall Record 20-14 | SWAC Record 14-10

ASU has ranked in the top 10 in FCS in total and average home attendance all three seasons.

ASU is 12-3 in Classics under Robinson (3-0 MCC | 2-0 PCC | 2-1 LDC | 2-1 LDC | 0-1 OBC | TDC 2-1)

ASU finished 4th in average attendance in the 2023 and 2024 and 6th in 2022.

ASU has drawn over 100,000-plus fans in two of three seasons.

Robinson has led ASU to three straight winning seasons for the first time since ASU had five straight from 2010-2015.

- 2023, 2024 ASU's defense has ranked 1st or 2nd in the SWAC and in the top 5 in the FCS in scoring defense, total defense, rush defense and pass defense.
- 2024 - The Alabama State defense was the top defense in the SWAC, ranking first or second in the SWAC in nine categories and the top 10 in the FCS in 10 categories. Sacks (SWAC/FCS) 3.25/gm (1/3) | Total Defense 265.0 (1/3) | Rush Defense 105.9 (1/9) | Scoring 16.7 (1/5) | Interceptions 15 (1/9) | Fumbles Forced 16 (1) | Turnovers Gained 27 (1/7) | Fewest First Downs 180 (1/6) | Turnover Margin .75 (1/5) | Sacks 39 (1) | Tackles for Loss 7.3/gm (2/8) | Passing Yards Allowed 159.1 (2/7) | Fumbles Recovered 10 (3/12).
- 2024 defense did not allow a touchdown over the last 9 quarters of the season
- Special Teams led the SWAC ranked in the top 5 in FCS in blocked kicks three straight seasons. ASU has blocked 16 kicks total in 2023-24.
- 2024 ASU offensive line - The offensive line paved the way for 2,028 rushing yards this season, becoming the first team to rush for 2000 yards since 2019. The Hogs paved the way for four 200-yard rushing games, including a season-high 308 at Bethune-Cookman. ASU rushed for 211 yards against Florida A&M, 203 against North Carolina Central, and 204 against Alabama A&M. Alabama State rushed for 100 yards in 10-of-12 games, missing the 100-yard mark Alcorn State and Grambling State. The Hornets outrushed 9-of-12 opponents, and the 18 sacks tied for second in fewest sacks allowed.

Robinson along with Alabama State University teammates Rickey Jones, Reggie Barlow and Reggie Brown were inducted into the 2022 Alabama State University Sports Hall of Fame Class. A native of Louisiana, Robinson was born and raised in New Orleans. He attended Brother Martin High School, graduating in 1988. He furthered his education attending Alabama State on an academic scholarship. He earned a Bachelor's degree in chemistry in 1994.

He lettered in football all four years and earned All-SWAC honors and SWAC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1990 and 1991, Sheridan Broadcasting Network All-America honors in 1990 and 1991, as well as Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1991 as a linebacker for the Hornets. Robinson also achieved academic All-Conference honors and was recognized as The Toyota Leadership Award recipient in 1990. In 1998, he became the youngest individual to be inducted into the SWAC Hall of Fame at 28 years old, and in 2012 he was recognized as a MEAC/SWAC Challenge Legend. He was a stalwart in the community during his 11-year NFL career, playing with the Houston Oilers (1992-1995), Jacksonville Jaguars (1996-1997), Tennessee Titans (1998-2001) and Buffalo Bills (2002); appearing in Super Bowl XXXIV with the Titans in 2000. He finished his career with 850 tackles, 23 sacks and six interceptions. Robinson received the Titans Unsung Hero award for the Tennessee Titans during his career. He was the ultimate professional and obtained the nickname "Steady Eddie" for his methodical preparation and on field knowledge of the game.

He is a stellar ASU alumnus and a man of vision who has a proven record of success. He assisted ASU in establishing its Football Hall of Fame and has been a consistent supporter of ASU athletic programs financially and by supporting athletic administrations and coaches. He is the father of three sons who participate in high school and college athletics.

Cedric Thomas enters his second season as the head coach of Alcorn State Football. Thomas is the 22nd head coach in program history.

Thomas led the football program to a 6-6 record in his first season with wins over Grambling State, Texas Southern and Prairie View A&M just to name a few. The team 2024 team finished 2nd in the Southwestern Athletic Conference Western Division. The Braves finished with six student-athlete receiving All-SWAC postseason honors, including three first team selections.

A seasoned leader, Coach Thomas rejoined the Alcorn State football staff in March of 2022 as the defensive coordinator. The Cleveland, Mississippi native takes the reigns of the program after a prior stint as the defensive back coach from 2012-2015 and the defensive coordinator in 2016 and 2017.

During his previous eight seasons with the Braves, Alcorn won four straight SWAC Eastern Division titles, including back-to-back SWAC titles in 2014 and 2015, and participated in the inaugural Celebration Bowl.

Before returning to Alcorn, Thomas spent the 2021 season as the head football coach of his junior college alma mater Mississippi Delta Community College. He led the Trojans to a 5-4 season with three student athletes receiving Mississippi Association of Community Colleges Conference All-Conference awards.

Thomas spent the 2020 season as the defensive back coach at the University of Southern Mississippi after a two-year stint as the head football coach at the University of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, his undergraduate alma mater.

During his two years in Pine Bluff, Thomas helped lead the Golden Lions to a four-win improvement, as UAPB tripled their win total from two wins to six wins from 2018 to 2019. He coached 14 All-SWAC honorees, including nine first-team selections.

Thomas served as the running backs coach at the University of Tennessee-Martin in 2002 before coming to MDCC in 2003, where he also spent the 2004 season. After a two-year term at Itawamba Community College in 2005 and 2006, he returned to MDCC for the 2007-2011 seasons.

The former MDCC and UAPB standout earned an Associate of Arts degree from MDCC in 1998, a bachelor's degree in recreation in 2001 from UAPB, and a master's degree in administration from Alcorn State University in 2015.

The former East Side High School graduate is married to Kelunda, and the couple has one daughter, Loegan. Thomas also has a son, Cedric Jr.

RAYMOND WOODIE JR., HEAD COACH

Bethune-Cookman University Director of Athletics Reggie Theus announced on February 6, 2023, the appointment of Raymond Woodie Jr. as Head Football Coach. Woodie, 49, became the 16th head coach of Bethune-Cookman Football. Woodie, a four-year letterwinner as a linebacker and 1996 graduate of Bethune-Cookman College, took the helm of Wildcats Football following an impressive career as an assistant coach at numerous Power 5 schools including Florida Atlantic University (2020-22), Florida State University (2018-19), the University of Oregon (2017) and the University of South Florida (2013-16).

Woodie has been recognized as one of the premier recruiters in college football, serving as an assistant under Head Coach Willie Taggart across multiple coaching stops. He has recruited seven players that were eventually selected in the NFL Draft. In his first season at the helm of B-CU football, Woodie orchestrated a defensive turnaround for the Wildcats. Led by All-SWAC first team corner Omari Hill-Robinson, the team finished the season second in all of FCS football in tackles for loss per game at 7.8. The Wildcats concluded the season as the most disciplined B-CU team in program history, averaging only 49 total penalties for an average of 35 penalty yards per game. Those marks shattered the previous program record of 64 total penalties and 53.5 penalty yards per game, set in 1988. Woodie's Wildcats finished the 2023 season 3-1 at home.

Prior to joining B-CU, Woodie previously served as Associate Head Coach at Florida Atlantic from 2020-2022, where he worked primarily with special teams and oversaw all aspects of recruiting in the role of recruiting coordinator for the Owls.

At FAU, Woodie tutored a linebacking corps that was part of a defense ranking among the top of NCAA and C-USA leaderboards in 2020. Under his guidance, the Owls totaled 25 sacks in just nine games, the most in C-USA and the 30th highest among all 2020 FBS teams. The unit allowed only 17.4 points per game, which was second in the league and 10th in the NCAA that season. In the conference, the 2020 Owls ranked fourth in total defense and fifth in both rushing defense and passing defense. Following his success, Woodie was promoted to associate head coach and added special teams responsibilities in the offseason ahead of the 2021 season. During the 2022 season, Woodie worked with a defense that ended the year ranked No. 8 in third-down conversion percentage, holding opponents

to a mere 32 percent. His efforts with special teams also saw punter Matt Hayball flourish, posting an average of 45.7 yards per kick, which ranked the junior No. 16 nationally.

Woodie served on the Florida State staff from 2018-2019, primarily working with the linebackers. In 2018, Woodie faced the challenge of a position group with only seven total starts among the entire linebacker corps. The group was led by Dontavious Jackson, who ranked second on the team with 75 tackles and became the first Seminole since 2001 to have multiple games with at least 14 tackles in the same season. Jackson, redshirt freshman DeCalon Brooks, sophomore Leonard Warner, and true freshman Jaiden Woodbey, who earned Freshman All-America honors while starting all 12 games at the STAR position, all displayed versatility. This quartet filled the stat sheet with a combined 217 tackles, including 16.0 for loss, one interception, 14 pass breakups, 10 quarterback hurries, three forced fumbles, and one fumble recovery.

The Seminoles ranked second in the ACC and 20th in the NCAA, holding opponents to only 3.52 yards per rush. The run defense held nine of 12 opponents under their season yards-per-carry average, kept three teams from reaching 100 yards on the ground, and allowed only 16 rushing touchdowns, the fourth-lowest total in the conference. Additionally, the Seminoles ranked second in the ACC and 17th in the NCAA in fourth-down defense. They also ranked fifth in the conference in rushing defense, third-down defense, and passes intercepted. During the 2017 season, Woodie served as the outside linebackers coach and special teams coordinator for the Oregon Ducks. During that season, he orchestrated a nearly perfect kicking game, with Oregon finishing the season 63-of-63 on PAT attempts and 9-of-12 on field goals. Additionally, the team's average of 22.73 yards per kickoff return ranked third in the Pac-12. Under Woodie's guidance, long snapper Tanner Carew earned First Team All-America honors from Phil Steele and was invited to the Senior Bowl, while freshman Brenden Schooler was a First Team All-Pac-12 selection as an all-purpose/special teams player. Kicker Adrian Schneider broke Oregon's school record with 51 career made field goals

On defense, Woodie's outside linebackers made significant contributions to a unit that ranked 23rd in the country with 25 turnovers forced, 22nd with an average of 7.2 tackles for loss per game, and 24th in rushing defense, allowing just 128.5 yards per game on the ground. The team's total defense improved its national ranking from 126th in 2016 to 46th in 2017. During his time with Oregon, Woodie was named the No. 1 recruiter in the PAC-12, as well as No. 13 in the nation by 247 Sports. Woodie led the way in signing the American Athletic Conference's top-ranked classes in 2014 and 2015, in addition to the top class in the Sun Belt Conference in 2010 and 2011. Woodie was named AAC Top Recruiter by Rivals in 2014, and Sun Belt Recruiter of the Year by Scout/FoxSports.com in 2012.

Prior to his time at Oregon, Woodie held the title of assistant head coach for two seasons as USF, including coordinating the Bulls' defense during their record-breaking 2016 season. That year, the Bulls won a school-record 11 games, while the defense forced 26 turnovers to rank 18th in the country and returned three for touchdowns, tied for the 19th-highest total in the nation. He also oversaw the linebackers at USF, coaching two players to All-Conference recognition. In 2014, Nigel Harris led the country and broke a school record with six forced fumbles under Woodie's guidance. He also tutored Reshard Cliett, the Houston Texans' sixth-round selection in the 2015 NFL Draft, and helped DeDe Lattimore and Harris reach the NFL.

In 2015, Woodie was responsible for the Bulls' special teams and coached the sixth-best kickoff return unit in the country, with USF finishing the year with a program-record average of 26.66 yards per return. Kickoff returner Rodney Adams was a Second Team All-Conference selection after leading the American Athletic Conference and ranking sixth in the NCAA with an average of 29.1 yards per return. Adams was selected in the fifth round of the 2017 NFL Draft by the Minnesota Vikings. Woodie's first foray into college coaching came at Western Kentucky from 2012-2012. Woodie served two seasons as defensive ends coach, before he was promoted to linebackers coach for the 2012 season.

With WKU, he recruited Venice, Florida, native Forrest Lamp and Lakeland, Florida, native Andrew Jackson to Bowling Green. Lamp was a second-round pick by the Los Angeles Chargers in the 2017 NFL Draft and Jackson was selected in the sixth round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts. They are two of seven Hilltoppers recruited by Woodie to play in the NFL.

Before entering college coaching, Woodie was a high school head coach in South Florida for 13 seasons. He was the head coach at Palmetto High School from 2007-09 and led the Tigers to a district title in 2008. From 1997-2006, Woodie was the head coach at Bayshore High School (following one season as the team's defensive coordinator) and led the Bruins to the state playoffs seven times. When he took over as head coach he was only 23 years old, making him the youngest head coach in the state at the time. In his time as a student-athlete at Bethune-Cookman, Woodie was a two-time Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) First Team Defense selection, as well as a two-time Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) All-America selection. He was also the first Bethune-Cookman student-athlete to be named a GTE Academic All-American and have \$25,000 donated to the University in his name.

JAMES COLZIE III, HEAD COACH

James Colzie III the 19th head football coach at Florida A&M University and was named to the role on January 27, 2024. Colzie has worked and played for some of the best coaches in the business, including Bobby Bowden, Mickey Andrews, Romeo Crennel, Emmitt Thomas, Blake Nill, and Kevin Steele. His career has included stops at elite Division I, Division II, U-Sport, and NJCAA football programs around the Southeast, Midwest, and Canada. As a collegiate player and coach, he has been a part of four national championships and seven conference titles.

Colzie was elevated to head coach after serving as the interim head coach following the departure of Willie Simmons. Colzie joined Florida A&M ahead of the 2022 season, where he led the cornerbacks and contributed to a defense that ranked in the top 25 in six categories.

After the 2022 campaign, Colzie was promoted to assistant head coach while coaching the cornerbacks again. Leading the cornerbacks, the Rattlers saw two selected to the All-SWAC teams, Kendall Bohler and Eric Smith. Colzie was again part of one of the nation's best defenses, ranking top 25 in 12 categories. Colzie was also part of a historic Rattlers team that won its first-ever SWAC Championship and Celebration Bowl with a 12-1 record.

Before FAMU

In 2022, Colzie left his post as the head football coach at Saint Mary's University (Canada) with an overall record of 23-19. Saint Mary's played for two AUS Championships (2018 and 2019) and posted a conference-best 7-1 record during the 2018 season. In total, Colzie posted six All-Canadians (defensive back DeAndre Smith (2016), defensive back Antoine Lyte-Myers (2019), defensive back Justin Julien (2021), returner

Johnny King, returner Justin Julien (2021), defensive end Jadarius Caesar (2017), and linebacker Brad Herbst (2018)). He developed and coached four CFL draft picks, starting in 2018 with defensive lineman Tresor Mafuta (4th round to Saskatchewan), in 2021 with linebacker Jarek Richards (4th round to Hamilton) and offensive lineman Peter Kourtis (5th round to Edmonton), and defensive back Adrian Greene (4th round to BC). During Colzie's time at Saint Mary's, he also had four Player of the Year's (two being Defensive Player of the Year) and a final total of twenty All-Conference players while serving as the head football coach.

Before becoming head coach at Saint Mary's, Colzie spent two seasons at the University of British Columbia as their defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach. In 2015, Colzie helped the Thunderbirds win their first Vanier Cup Championship since 1997. The Thunderbirds' defense finished ranked 2nd in the Canada West Conference in rushing defense, pass defense, and scoring defense.

Before the University of British Columbia, Colzie spent one season at Coffeyville. He coached 2nd Team All-American cornerback Jamarcus King, three 1st Team All-Jayhawk selections at both cornerback positions in Jalen Roundtree, King, and punt returner Darnell Walker Jr. He coached 2nd Team All-Conference safety Mikal Cromartie and two honorable selections in safety Devonte Foster and kicker Michael Pursley. The defense at Coffeyville finished 1st in the nation with seven interceptions for touchdowns and 1st in the nation with ten total defensive touchdowns and 3rd down percentage (22%).

In 2013, Colzie was the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach at Simon Fraser University. There, he took over a defense that had finished dead last in all major conference defensive categories during the 2012 season, and under his defense, they finished second in pass defense, second in opponent's 1st down, third in third down, and fourth down conversions. Colzie had three 1st Team All-Conference players and an All-Region player.

From 2007 to 2012, Colzie had success in multiple Division II football programs where he coached six All-Americans and ten All-Conference players. In three of those years, his special teams were ranked first in the nation in punt return yards and touchdowns. In 2012, Colzie was the recruiting coordinator, special team's coordinator, and defensive backs coach at Southern Arkansas, where he coached All-American Don Unamba at boundary corner. From 2008 to 2011, Colzie coached at the University of West Georgia and held numerous titles such as assistant head coach, defensive coordinator, special team's coordinator, and defensive backs coach while developing nine All Gulf-South Conference Players and one All-American at punt returner in 2012. In 2007, Coach Colzie was the special team's coordinator and defensive backs coach at Valdosta State University, where the team won the Division II National Championship. That same year, the defense led the nation in interceptions, and his special teams led the nation in touchdowns. During that year, Colzie had two All-Americans and three All-Conference selections.

During the 2004-2006 seasons, Coach Colzie worked as a Defensive Graduate Assistant at Florida State, where he coached cornerbacks that included first-round picks Antonio Cromartie (2006), Patrick Robinson (2010), and second-round pick Bryant McFadden (2005).

James Colzie III began his coaching career in 2000 at Florida International University, where he coached the cornerbacks and was also the co-special team's coordinator working with returners. Before Florida International, in his playing days, he enjoyed the success of being a two-sport athlete at Florida State University. He played from 1993-1997 on the football team and lettered on the baseball team in 1994. Colzie was part of the Florida State 1993 National Championship team and three ACC Championship teams.

MICKY JOSEPH, HEAD COACH

Grambling State University named Mickey Joseph as the 15th head football coach, announced by Vice-President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Dr. Trayvean Scott. Joseph brings a wealth of coaching experience spanning three decades to Grambling. His most recent stop was at the University of Nebraska, his alma mater, where he served as associate head coach, wide receivers coach and passing game coordinator during the 2022 season. He completed the 2022 campaign as interim head coach for the Cornhuskers.

Prior to NU, he spent five seasons on staff at LSU. In 2017, he joined the Tigers as wide receivers coach. He was elevated to associate head coach in 2020. Joseph was a key member of LSU's 2019 national championship staff. His receivers set an FBS record with 60 touchdown receptions and helping Joe Burrow claim a Heisman Trophy amassing 5,671 passing yards.

In 2019, LSU assembled the best group of receivers in SEC history. The Tigers' three starters—Ja'Marr Chase, Justin Jefferson and Terrace Marshall—combined for 241 receptions for 3,991 yards and 51 touchdowns. His reputation and for recruiting and developing wide receivers were highlighted at LSU when he was recognized as a Rivals Top 25 recruiter. had four wide receivers selected in the first three rounds of the 2020 and 2021 NFL Drafts (2020 and 2021). That includes Chase, who was the 2021 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year after being selected with the No. 5 overall pick in the 2021 Draft and Jefferson, the 22nd pick in the 2020 NFL Draft.

The Marrero, La. native was part of an offensive staff that helped LSU set several SEC records in 2019, including passing yards (6,024), passing TDs (61) and total offense per game (568.4) en route to a 15-0 season and national championship. Joseph also helped LSU post a 10-3 record in 2018 and a 9-4 mark in 2017. In 2016, Joseph worked as running backs coach at neighboring Louisiana Tech. He helped the Bulldogs to a 9-5 record and win in the Armed Forces Bowl. The Bulldogs ranked No. 2 in the nation in scoring in 2016, averaging 44.3 points per game. Tech averaged 514.9 total yards game, which included 363.4 passing and 151.6 on the ground.

Joseph is no stranger to Grambling State. From 2014 to 2015 he served as wide receivers coach and special teams coach for the G-Men. When he arrived, the Tigers were coming off a 1-10 record in 2013. In the two years he spent with the G-Men, Grambling finished 7-5 (2014) and 9-3 with a SWAC West Championship in 2015. In 2015, Joseph's receivers totaled 2,250 receiving yards and 25 touchdowns as Grambling's scoring offense ranked 4th and passing offense ranked 21st among all FCS programs nationally.

Prior to Grambling, he was the special teams coordinator and wide receivers coach at Alcorn State in 2013, helping the school to a 9-3 record, its most wins in 30 years. He spent five seasons at Langston University from 2008 to 2012, elevating to head coach in 2011. He led the Lions to 13-7 record in two seasons. Joseph got his first collegiate coaching job at Wayne State College in Nebraska in 1997, which he followed with a season at his high school alma mater Archbishop Shaw High School in New Orleans in 1998. From there, Joseph served as a graduate assistant at Tulane in 1999 and then coached receivers at Alabama State in 2000. He coached quarterbacks at Nicholls State for three years (2001-03) and then spent two seasons as the running backs coach at Central Oklahoma (2004-05).

Before his tenure at Langston, Joseph served as the head football coach and Director of Athletics for Desire Street Academy, a private school in the New Orleans' Ninth Ward area. His main goal was to help get young kids out of the underprivileged area to improve their overall quality of life through sports. At the time of Hurricane Katrina, Joseph was responsible of moving the private school to Florida along with relocating the student-athletes. That year, the team had a record of 1-3, however, in 2008 Joseph turned the team around to a 10-3 record. Seven out of 25 players were able to sign with NCAA Division I programs. During the summer of 2012 he also spent time with Houston Texans as part of an NFL minority internship. While in Houston, Joseph worked with the running backs and all aspects of the special teams units.

Joseph played quarterback at Nebraska from 1988-91. As a junior Joseph led the Cornhuskers to a 9-3 overall mark after accounting for 21 touchdowns (11 rushing, 10 passing). In his four years at Nebraska, the Cornhuskers posted a 39-9-1 overall mark and appeared in the Orange Bowl twice, the Citrus Bowl and the Fiesta Bowl. In four years with the Cornhuskers, Joseph played in 34 regular season games and accounted for 30 touchdowns (16 rushing, 14 passing). His best season came as a junior in 1990 when he played in all 12 games, throwing for 624 yards and 11 touchdowns to go along with 554 rushing yards and 10 TDs.

Joseph was the top recruit coming out of Archbishop Shaw High School in Marrero when he was recruited to the University of Nebraska. In 1987, he was awarded Gatorade Player of the Year and First-Team Parade All-American. The standout football player was also a two-time All-State MVP and three-time All-District MVP.

T.C. TAYLOR, HEAD COACH

One of the most accomplished players in Jackson State football history, T.C. Taylor has risen to lead his alma mater as the 22nd Head Coach of the Tigers. A former JSU quarterback and record-setting wide receiver, Taylor officially took over the program following the 2022 Celebration Bowl and has quickly cemented his legacy as a transformative leader.

Taylor has been an integral part of Jackson State's football resurgence since joining the staff in 2019. He coached tight ends and wide receivers during an era that saw the Tigers post a dominant 23-3 record from 2021-2022, including back-to-back Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) titles and undefeated regular seasons.

In his second season as head coach in 2024, Taylor led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and captured the HBCU National Championship with a commanding 28-7 win over South Carolina State in the Cricket Celebration Bowl. Under his leadership, JSU claimed the SWAC East Division and SWAC Championship titles, with running back Irv Mulligan earning SWAC Offensive Player of the Year honors. That season, the Tigers produced 32 All-Conference selections (SWAC and Phil Steele), 15 All-Americans, and 8 postseason all-star participants. Taylor was named HBCU Legends Coach of the Year and earned widespread postseason recognition for his accomplishments.

Taylor's teams have also stood out statistically. In 2024, JSU ranked top 10 nationally in several NCAA categories including red zone offense (2nd), team defense (4th), scoring offense (5th), and scoring defense (6th). The Tigers finished the season ranked in over 30 key statistical categories, demonstrating elite performance on both sides of the ball.

In his debut season as head coach (2023), Taylor guided Jackson State to a second-place finish in the SWAC East Division. The Tigers led the conference in total offense (389.4 ypg) and finished top three in both rushing and passing, while also ranking among the SWAC's best in total defense and scoring.

As an assistant coach, Taylor played a pivotal role in developing one of the most explosive wide receiver units in the conference. From 2021-2022, he coached standouts such as Malachi Wideman, Keith Corbin, Dallas Daniels, and Shane Hooks—several of whom earned All-SWAC and All-American honors. During the abbreviated Spring 2021 season, Daylen Baldwin led the SWAC in receiving yards (540) and touchdowns (7). Prior to the 2022 season, Taylor was selected for the prestigious NFL Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship with the Tennessee Titans.

A native of McComb, Mississippi, Taylor enjoyed a stellar playing career at Jackson State from 1998 to 2001. After beginning as a quarterback, he transitioned to wide receiver, where he set the JSU single-season record with 84 receptions for 1,234 yards and 11 touchdowns in 2001. He earned NCAA Division I-AA Third-Team All-America honors from The Sports Network and First-Team Black College All-America recognition from Sheridan Broadcasting. He was also the runner-up for the 2001 Conerly Trophy, awarded to Mississippi's top college football player, finishing behind Eli Manning.

Following his playing career at JSU, Taylor signed with the New England Patriots as a rookie free agent in 2002. He went on to win a World Bowl championship with the Frankfurt Galaxy in NFL Europe and participated in the 2003 preseason with the Detroit Lions before an injury ended his pro playing career.

Before returning to Jackson State, Taylor built a strong coaching résumé, including successful stints at:

- **North Carolina Central (2014-2018)** — Offensive Coordinator/QBs Coach. Guided the Eagles to three MEAC championships and the 2016 Celebration Bowl. Coached 28 All-MEAC players, five All-Americans, and helped QB Malcolm Bell become a finalist for Black College Football Player of the Year.
- **Texas Southern (2012-2013)** — Wide Receivers Coach & Recruiting Coordinator.
- **Coahoma Community College (2005-2011)** — Offensive Coordinator. His offenses consistently ranked in the top five among Mississippi JUCOs.

Taylor earned his bachelor's degree in Health, Physical Education, and Recreation from Jackson State in 2005. He is married to his wife, Dawn, and they are the proud parents of two sons, Tre and Tylan.

TERRELL BUCKLEY, HEAD COACH

Terrell Buckley is a former NFL cornerback and current head football coach at Mississippi Valley State University. Born and raised in Mississippi, Buckley has had a distinguished career both on and off the field.

Buckley attended Pascagoula High School, where he led the team to a state championship and an undefeated season in 1987. He then played college football at Florida State University from 1989 to 1991. During his time with the Seminoles, Buckley set multiple records, including 21 career interceptions and 501 interception return yards which is still an NCAA record. In 1991, he won the Jim Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back and was a unanimous All-American. His No. 27 jersey was retired by Florida State in 2011 and he was inducted into the college football Hall of Fame in 2019.

Buckley was selected by the Green Bay Packers as the fifth overall pick in the 1992 NFL Draft. He played 14 seasons in the NFL, with notable tenures at the Miami Dolphins, and New England Patriots where he was part of the Patriots' Super Bowl XXXVI-winning team in 2001. Buckley also recorded 50 interceptions, including six returned for touchdowns during his NFL career.

After retiring from professional football in 2005, Buckley returned to Florida State to complete his degree. He began his coaching career at FSU, serving in various roles from 2007 to 2011. He later coached cornerbacks at Akron (2012–2013), Louisville (2014–2015), Mississippi State (2016–2019), and Ole Miss (2020–2021). In 2023, he became the head coach of the Orlando Guardians in the XFL before taking his most recent position as the Head Football Coach at MVSU.

Buckley's most cherished work resides off the field where he is deeply committed to his faith, family and the community. He is a proud husband, father of 5, and grandfather. In his free time, he enjoys spending time with family and perfecting his golf game.

TREMAINE JACKSON, HEAD COACH

Tremaine Jackson was named head coach of the Prairie View A&M University football program on January 1, 2025, bringing with him a proven track record of success, leadership, and commitment to excellence both on and off the field.

Prior to his arrival at PVAMU, Jackson served as head coach at Valdosta State University, where he was named the AFCA National Division II Coach of the Year, becoming just the third coach in program history to receive the prestigious honor. Under his guidance, the Blazers reached the NCAA Division II National Championship Game and posted a perfect 13-0 season in 2024, capturing their 11th Gulf South Conference (GSC) title. He was also named GSC Co-Coach of the Year that same season.

Jackson compiled an impressive 40-11 overall record as a collegiate head coach, including a 30-8 mark at Valdosta State. In 2023, he made history as the first Black head coach to win the GSC title and the only non-HBCU Black coach to do so. His high-powered offense consistently ranked among the nation's best, and

quarterback Sammy Edwards was named a finalist for the prestigious Harlon Hill Trophy.

Beyond the gridiron, Jackson emphasized academic achievement and community engagement. In 2023, the Blazers recorded a program-high team GPA of 2.84, with 54 players earning a 3.0 or higher. His teams also gave back through service projects with Habitat for Humanity and environmental initiatives.

Nationally recognized for his impact on the sport, Jackson was named to ESPN's "45 Minority Coaches Under 45 to Watch" and FootballScoop's 2022 Minority Watch List. He is a two-time recipient of the NFL's Bill Walsh Minority Coaching Fellowship, with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Jacksonville Jaguars.

Jackson began his head coaching career at Colorado Mesa University, where he led the team to a 10-3 record and engineered a landmark upset over a nationally ranked opponent. His coaching journey also includes impactful roles at Texas State, Abilene Christian, and the University of Sioux Falls.

A former collegiate defensive lineman, Jackson played at Texas Southern and the University of Louisiana-Monroe before earning his degree in interdisciplinary studies from the University of Houston in 2006.

A passionate advocate for diversity in coaching, Jackson serves as Vice President of the Minority Coaches Advancement Association and is a recipient of the 2022 Harry Butler Community Service Award for his dedication to service and equity.

A native of Houston, Texas, Coach Jackson is the proud father of one daughter, Harmony.

TERRENCE GRAVES, HEAD COACH

Terrence Graves is a 31-year veteran in the collegiate football and is entering his fourth season at Southern University and second season as the Jaguars Head Coach. He guided the Jaguars to an 8-5 overall record and 7-1 SWAC record during the 2024 season. Capturing the 2024 SWAC Western Division Championship and SU's ninth appearance in the SWAC Football Championship game.

During the 2023 season Coach Graves made history becoming the first head coach to win the annual bayou classic as the interim head coach for both schools. Before being named the Interim Head Coach, Graves was the Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator and linebackers coach for the past two season on the bluff.

Before Southern Graves was a member of the football staff at Grambling State University as the linebackers and special teams coordinator and most recently the Interim Head Coach leading the Tigers to a Bayou Classic Victory of the Jaguars. Prior to his arrival at Grambling, Graves spent four years at Mississippi Valley State University as the Assistant Head Coach and Linebackers Coach. The Norfolk, Va., native later became the Pass Defensive Coordinator in 2012- 2014. In 2013, Graves would later serve as the Interim Head Football Coach at the end of the season. During his stint at MVSU, Graves was instrumental in constructing some of the best defenses in the SWAC and NCAA. MVSU was ranked No. 1 SWAC and No. 4 nationally in total defense. They also led the SWAC and NCAA in tackles for loss. In 2013, MVSU led the SWAC in interceptions and finished eighth the NCAA.

Prior to his time at MVSU, Graves spent 15 years at Southern University under the legendary Coach Pete Richardson. During his time with the Jaguars, he assisted the team with three SWAC Championships and four HBCU National Championships. He was the Co-Defensive Coordinator from 2000-2002. In 2001, Southern led the SWAC in total defense and scoring defense and led the NCAA in turnovers. The football program also finished eighth nationally in total defense. From 2005- 2009, Graves served as the Defensive Coordinator at Southern. In 2009, the Jaguars' defense led the SWAC in turnover margin and ranked number No. 2 nationally. In 2007, Graves led Southern to a NCAA Top 25 Defense, which led the SWAC in pass defense efficiency.

In 2003, Graves served as the Defensive Coordinator and Linebackers Coach at Norfolk State, where he coached All-MEAC 1st Team and FCS All-American linebacker Kevin Talley. Talley still holds the NCAA record in tackles in a single season (195). That same year, Graves' defense led the MEAC in pass defense and was ranked No. 2 in the NCAA.

Graves played as a true freshman at Wake Forest University before transferring to Winston-Salem State University, where he was a part of two CIAA Conference Championships (1990 and 1991). He was an HBCU Pre-season All-American and a 1st Team All-CIAA Defensive Back in 1992. He finished No. 2 in the conference and No. 5 nationally in interceptions. Graves finished his career with 12 interceptions. Graves is a 1994 graduate of Winston-Salem State University. He earned a degree in Political Science/History and is currently finishing his master's degree in social science at Grambling State. He has been a member of the American Football Coaches Association since 1995. He is also a member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. Graves is a proud father to China, his daughter, and a grandfather of two grandchildren.

CRIS DISHMAN, HEAD COACH

Cris Dishman, the 18th head football coach in the history of Texas Southern football, begins his second season at the helm.

Dishman's first season at Texas Southern concluded with a two-game improvement in the win column from the previous season as he was seconds away in a pair of contests from achieving the program's most wins since 2000. He guided the return of the annual Durley-Nicks Trophy back to the TSU campus after achieving TSU's first win over Prairie View A&M in the annual Labor Day Classic since 2014. Also, the Tigers won consecutive games to close out the 2024 season which marked the first time that has happened since 1979. Dishman also had to quickly adjust his lineup at key positions early in the season due to several season-ending injuries.

As a team, TSU's defensive unit finished three spots higher than the previous season in the SWAC while also showing signs of disciplined play as they were the second-least penalized team in the league. Individually, a pair of newcomers earned All-SWAC honors for the Tigers in cornerback MJ Hinson (1st Team) and defensive end

Keelan Cox (2nd Team). Hinson led the SWAC in interceptions while Cox was sixth in the SWAC in sacks. The Tigers also had a pair of top-10 tacklers in the SWAC in defensive back Javius Williams (86) and linebacker Umar Yaro (70).

A two-time NFL Pro-Bowl selection, Dishman comes to TSU after 13 successful years in the NFL and 19 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and professional levels. After earning a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Purdue University, he was drafted by the Houston Oilers in 1988. Dishman played spent eight years with the Oilers, two years with the Washington Commanders and Kansas City Chiefs, his final season with the Minnesota Vikings.

Dishman came to TSU after spending the last two seasons as Defensive Coordinator of the XFL's Las Vegas Vipers. Prior to joining the Vipers, he spent the 2022 season as the Defensive Coordinator for the United States Football League's New Jersey Generals. During his lone season with the Generals, the team boasted the top rushing defense in the USFL. His team also ranked second in rushing defense and interceptions, and third in scoring defense.

He has coached defenses at the professional, collegiate, and prep levels. He entered coaching as the Defensive Back Coach for the NFL Europe's Berlin Thunder. He was a Defensive Back Intern for the Oakland Raiders (2005 and 2007), the Miami Dolphins (2006), and Arizona Cardinals (2017). From 2006-2008, he served as the Defensive Coordinator (Secondary) at Menlo College (NCAA Division III). He also served as the Assistant Defensive Back Coach for the San Diego Chargers (2008-2013). During his time with the Chargers, the passing defense improved from 31st in the NFL to 1st. He spent the 2015-2016 season as Safeties Coach at Baylor University. Dishman spent a season as the Defensive Back Coach of the Montreal Alouettes (CFL) before returning to the college ranks as Defensive Back Coach at McNeese State University. He was also the Defensive Back Coach of the XFL's New York Guardians (2019-2020), and he coached some of the top high school prospects as Defensive Coordinator of prep powerhouse IMG Academy.

Dishman and his wife Jennifer have four adult children.

ALONZO HAMPTON, HEAD COACH

The University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff Director of Athletics Chris Robinson announced Thursday afternoon that Alonzo Hampton has been named the Golden Lions 22nd head football coach, bringing him back to his home state. The Warren, Ark., native will return to one of his previous coaching stops, having been with the Golden Lions five seasons from 2006 to 2010. A name highly recognized throughout Arkansas and around the nation in college football, Hampton comes to UAPB after serving as the Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator under Terry Bowden at the University of Louisiana Monroe.

"I am extremely excited about this new era for the Golden Lion football program and Golden Lion nation and all that it will bring," said Robinson. I am excited for the student-athletes, student body, university, alumni and the community as we all come together to re-establish our brand. Coach Hampton has a heart for the student athletes and a strong drive to have his team succeed on the field and especially in the classroom. He will bring a positive contagious energy to the University."

Hampton, a four-year letterman as a defensive back at ULM 1993-96, returned to his alma mater to serve as assistant head coach on Bowden's staff. After working with the safeties in 2021, Hampton took over the responsibilities as special team's coordinator, heading into his second season. Under Hampton's guidance in 2022, ULM special team (punting) was ranked 29th in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision and second in the Sun Belt Conference averaging 43.9 yards per punt (Devyn McCormick). In 2021, three of his safeties ranked among ULM's Top 10 in tackles, including Jabari Johnson, who recorded a career-high 58 tackles while making seven starts.

"I'm excited to be named 22nd head football coach at the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff. This institution gave me my first opportunity to coach college football in 2006," said Hampton. "This is a special day for my family and we are grateful as we look forward to pushing this program to new heights. Also, it means more to come back to your home state. I've already reached out to all my friends throughout the state and told them to go purchase their season tickets and come support the Golden Lions. Again, I can't wait to get there and start building something special that our administration, faculty, staff, alumni and former players will be proud of for years to come."

Hampton worked as a defensive analyst for Chad Morris at Arkansas in 2019. He served as special teams coordinator for Willie Taggart at Florida State in 2018. It marked the fourth different time in Hampton's career that he had joined one of Taggart's coaching staffs, including previous stops at Oregon, South Florida and Western Kentucky. Under Hampton's guidance, FSU's D.J. Matthews emerged as one of the nation's most dangerous punt returners in 2018, finishing sixth in the NCAA FBS with his 13.5-yard average (19 returns for 257 yards). Matthews returned five punts for a career-high 145 yards at No. 17 Miami, including a 74-yard return for a touchdown. His 145 punt return yards were the most amassed by an NCAA FBS player in 2018 as well as the third-highest single-game total in Seminole history. His 74-yard punt return marked the longest of his career and also tied for the second-longest punt return in an ACC game during the 2018 season.

During the 2017 season, he served as a defensive analyst at Oregon after spending two years (2015-16) as defensive backs coach at South Florida, where he also oversaw special teams in 2016. USF won a school-record 11 games and finished No. 19 in the final Associated Press Poll, thanks in large part to a defensive unit that forced 26 turnovers, the 18th-highest total in the NCAA FBS, and scored three defensive touchdowns. During his two-year tenure at USF, Hampton coached two-time All-American Athletic Conference cornerback Deatrick Nichols, who recorded four interceptions each in 2015 and '16 and finished with 11 career picks (tied for third on the school's all-time list). The Bulls were ranked 14th in the NCAA FBS with 17 interceptions in 2015, including 13 by the defensive backs. He also helped mentor D'Ernest Johnson, who earned second-team all-conference honors as a return specialist in 2016 including an 83-yard punt return for a touchdown — the second longest in USF history.

A 19-year coaching veteran, Hampton also experienced successful stints as a high school coach in Arkansas and Georgia. Prior to reuniting with Taggart in Tampa, he spent two years (2013-14) as defensive backs coach at Tift County High School, where he helped lead the Blue Devils to a 7-4 record in 2014 and secured a spot in the Class 6A playoff bracket. Hampton first connected with Taggart at Western Kentucky, serving as defensive backs coach for two years (2011-12) and helping the Hilltoppers post back-to-back 7-win seasons, including the program's first postseason bowl appearance in the 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl (against Central Michigan). WKU ranked among the NCAA FBS leaders in total defense (No. 26 at 348.2 yards per game) and pass defense (No. 34 at 209.8 ypg.) in 2012. In addition, the Hilltoppers led the Sun Belt Conference in rushing defense (138.4 ypg.), pass efficiency defense (131.0 rating) and total defense. WKU's secondary was anchored by future NFL Draft selection Jonathan Dowling (2014: seventh round by the Oakland Raiders).

A native of Warren, Ark., Hampton previously spent five seasons (2006-10) at Arkansas-Pine Bluff where he was part of the 2006 SWAC Western Division title and served in a variety of roles, including defensive backs coach and eventually defensive coordinator in 2009-10. Hampton began his coaching career in the high school ranks in Arkansas, first as defensive coordinator at Warren High School for four years (2000-03) then as head coach at Dumas High School for two seasons (2004-05). During his tenure at Warren, he helped the Lumberjacks to a combined record of 48-12, including back-to-back Class AAA state championships in 2001-02, while also serving as the head track and field coach. While leading the Dumas program, Hampton also completed a minority internship with the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles.

The former ULM cornerback played his first year (1993) for Dave Roberts and the next three seasons (1994-96) for Ed Zaunbrecher. A two-time All-Louisiana Second-Team selection by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association, Hampton finished his career with 201 tackles, three interceptions and 16 pass break-ups. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from ULM in May 1996 and a Master of Arts in teaching from the University of Arkansas at Monticello in August 2002. Following his collegiate career, Hampton played professionally for the Seattle Seahawks and Jacksonville Jaguars as well as NFL Europe's Frankfurt Galaxy. Hampton and his wife Yolanda have five children, including four sons: Aaron, Rashad, A.J., a fifth-year defensive back at Northwestern, and Ashton; and one daughter, Kenya.
