

The Khashoggi Act of 2018

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The United States will hereby annul all arms deals with the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

SECTION 2. The United States will impose economic sanctions onto the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

SECTION 3. The Department of Commerce and the Department of State will oversee the enforcement of this legislation.

SECTION 4. This legislation will go into effect on December 1st, 2018.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A BILL TO PROHIBIT INTERVENTION OF THE UNITED STATES IN FOREIGN
COUNTRIES**

1 BE ENACTED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA HIGH SCHOOL SPEECH LEAGUE
2 STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

3 **Section 1.** The sovereignty of the United States of America, free country and independent
4 of all foreign power, is inviolable, and the principle of non-intervention is an invariable
5 norm of the American international politics.

6 **Section 2.** The United States of America will agree to respect the sovereignty of all foreign
7 countries.

8 **Section 3.** “Intervention” shall be defined as the interference with the government of a
9 foreign nation.

10 **Section 4.** This bill will be enforced by the United States Department of Justice and United
11 States Department of Defense.

12 **Section 5.** Without prejudice to the provisions of this law:

13 1) Any intervention, sanction or other decisions that the government has made before
14 the issuance of this law will not be affected by it.

15 2) The United States shall only intervene in those nations whose own sovereignty is
16 threatened.

17 **Section 6.** This bill will be in force immediately upon passage.

**A BILL TO IMPLEMENT TAX BREAKS FOR CITIZENS WHO ATTEND
AN ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION CLASS**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

ARTICLE 1. Due to the economic and environmental benefits of small, sustainable actions, and the lack of awareness by the American public, American citizens will be given the opportunity to enroll in a federally endorsed and federally run environmental education class. This class will teach the fundamentals of conserving energy and resources, as well as an overall lesson on how to apply conservation techniques into day to day life. These lessons will include easy, sustainable changes that average citizens can make.

ARTICLE 2. The class will be spread out into three 2-hour sessions. The educator conducting each class will be a professional in the field of environmental studies who will receive a tax break of \$400 for the same period of time noted in Article 4. Information presented will be factual and nonbiased, discussing both the environmental savings and applicable budgetary savings. Congress will appoint a panel of experts to develop the curriculum, including a pass/fail exam to determine understanding of the material. Passing will be required to receive the tax incentive.

ARTICLE 3. This tax break will be issued in the form of tax credits.

ARTICLE 4. Classes will be held in all federal courthouses nationally. For those willing to attend a face-to-face class, tax credit will be issued at \$250 for those who pass with honors (receiving a grade of 85 or higher) and at \$150 for those who pass (receiving a 70 to 85 on the exam). Online classes will be available as well, with the same tax credit issued based on grade. This must be renewed after a five-year period if continuous benefit is expected and the class will be updated and retaken if a citizen reapplies after said five-year period. A satisfaction survey will be administered after two and a half years to determine necessary changes to curriculum and assess the efficacy of the program.

A Bill to Subsidize Free College for All Americans

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The Department of Education will pay for any tuition costs for full time or
2 part time degree seeking students at public colleges in the United States.

3 **SECTION 2.** Public colleges maintain the right to conduct merit-based admissions.

4 **SECTION 3.** Funding for this initiative will be provided for by a marginal wealth tax.

5 A. Wealth of individual citizens above \$50 million will be taxed by 2 percent annually.

6 B. Wealth of individual citizens above \$1 billion will be taxed by 3% annually.

7 C. Excess revenue obtained through the tax outlined in Section (3A) and Section (3B)
8 will be deposited into the general fund.

9 **SECTION 4.** The Department of Education and the Department of the Treasury will
10 oversee the implementation and enforcement of this bill.

11 **SECTION 5.** This bill will take effect immediately upon passage.

12 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO REQUIRE CRUELTY FREE MEANS OF TESTING FOR ALL COSMETIC PRODUCTS

BE IT ENABLED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **Section 1:** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration will no longer accept experimentation on
2 animals as proof of cosmetic product's efficiency and safety.

3 **Section 2:** "Cruelty free" shall be defined as manufactured or developed by methods that do not
4 involve experimentation on animals. "Cosmetic products" shall be defined as "articles intended
5 to be rubbed, poured, sprinkled, sprayed on, introduced into, or otherwise applied to the human
6 body for cleansing, beautifying, promoting attractiveness, or altering the appearance."

7 **Section 3:** This bill will be enforced by The U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

8 **Section 4:** This legislation will go into effect immediately after passage.

9 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Implement Body Cameras in Police Officers

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All United States Police Officers shall be required to wear body cameras.

3 **SECTION 2.** For the purposes of this legislation:

4 1. "Police Officers" shall be defined as a warranted law employee of a
5 police force.

6 2. "Body Cameras" shall be defined as a small video camera worn on the
7 body, in order to record arrests and evidence from crime scenes.

8 **SECTION 3.** The United States Department of Justice will oversee this bill.

9 A. \$1 billion dollars will be used to fund this legislation.

10 B. States not in minimum compliance with this change will face a 10%
11 reduction in federal transportation and infrastructure funding.

12 **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2020

13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Implement Congressional Term Limits

1. **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2. **RESOLVED:** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is
3. proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which
4. shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
5. ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven
6. years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

7. **SECTION 1.** The members of the United States House of Representatives and Senate will
8. have term limits imposed upon them. Henceforth, the House will have a
9. maximum of six terms and the Senate will have a maximum of three terms.

10. **SECTION 2.** Term limits shall be defined as a restriction upon the number of times one can
11. hold office in either the United States House of Representatives and the
12. Senate.

13. a.) Any person who has acted as Senator for equal to or more than three years
14. shall be unable to be elected more than two times.

15. b.) Any person who has acted as Representative for more than one full year shall be
16. unable to be elected more than five times.

17. **SECTION 3.** This shall will effect as of the 2020 election process. All current
18. Representatives and Senators that supersede the proposed limits will retain
19. their office until they to up for re-election.

20. **SECTION 4.** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate
21. legislation.

A Bill to Amend the Constitution to Eliminate Lifetime Tenure on the Supreme Court

1 **RESOLVED**, By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is
2 proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which
3 shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
4 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven
5 years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

ARTICLE --

7 **SECTION 1**: Supreme Court Justices will serve a single nonrenewable
8 term of 15 years.

9 **SECTION 2**: The term shall begin on the day the Justice is sworn in.

10 **SECTION 3**: The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by
11 appropriate legislation.

A Bill to Upgrade Driving Violations Regarding School Buses to a Misdemeanor

1 Whereas 480,000 school busses carry up near 25 million children each day in the United

2 States,

3 Whereas 40 percent of school bus injuries are caused by vehicular misconduct,

4 Whereas on average, 80,000 violations occur EACH DAY,

5 Whereas no states currently recognize these crimes as a misdemeanor,

6 Whereas these injuries are on the rise and it is our duty to protect the safety of American

7 Children,

8 Be it resolved that traffic violations regarding passing a school bus, or ignoring any other

9 posted sign or traffic law regarding the transport of school children be no longer a moving

10 violation, but a misdemeanor.
