### **Congressional Revolving Door Ban Act**

2	SECTION 1.	No individual serving as a Member of Congress on or after the date of
3		enactment of this Act shall, upon the completion of the Member's term
4		of office, accept compensation for offering any advice or engaging in
5		written or oral communication with regard to— (1) formulation,
6		modification, or adoption of Federal legislation (including legislative
7		proposals); (2) formulation, modification, or adoption of a Federal rule,
8		regulation, Executive order, or any other program, policy, or position of
9		the United States Government; (3) administration or execution of a
10		Federal program or policy (including the negotiation, award, or
11		administration of a Federal contract, grant, loan, permit, or license); (4)
12		nomination or confirmation of an individual for a position subject to
13		confirmation by the Senate; or (5) representation of any party in a
14		pending matter involving the Federal Government before a Federal court
15		or in a Federal administrative proceeding.
16	SECTION 2.	Exception: §1 shall not apply to full-time employment by or elected
17		service in Federal, State, or local government, unless the activities
18		described in that subsection constitute a primary responsibility of
19		employment.
20	SECTION 3.	Penalty: Whoever violates this section shall be fined the greater of not
21		greater than \$1,000,000 or the value of the compensation received by
22		the individual, imprisoned for not more than 5 years, or both.
23	SECTION 4.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### A Bill to Reform the Census

All questions on the 2020 Census shall be reviewed by an independent SECTION 1. 2 commission to determine if each question is both relevant to the mission 3 of the census and will encourage, rather than discourage, participation in 4 the census. Any question which does not meet both requirements shall 5 be discarded from the Census form. 6 SECTION 2. The independent commission shall be compromised of individuals 7 appointed by members of the Senate and House Appropriations 8 Committees. 9 The United States Census Bureau will receive the results of the 10 SECTION 3. independent commission's report and shall adjust the 2020 Census as 11 deemed necessary. In the event that the USCB cannot adequately 12 change the questions on the census prior to September 1, 2019, the 13 decennial census shall be delayed until 2021. 14 SECTION 4. This shall take effect immediately upon passage. 15 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. SECTION 5. 16
