

A Bill to Prevent Individuals Charged with DUI from Purchasing Alcohol
(Red Card Bill)

Be it enacted by this Congress

SECT 1. people charged with driving under the influence of alcohol or other narcotics from will be prohibited from purchasing any more products containing alcohol with the percentage of 0.05 or higher.

SECT 2. After an individual has been charged with a DUI (Driving under the influence), after the proper sentencing, a new state identification will be administered. The Red Card is defined as being similar to the previous card but there will be a bright vertical red line, with a barcode on the back, that will not meet the requirements of purchasing alcohol, regardless of age.

SECT 3. Red Card holders will be subject to house inspections at the discretion of the local police force, with probable cause. Red Card holders found possessing any alcohol, excluding rubbing alcohol with purpose of medical aid, will be charged at the discretion of the local or state government depending on who conducts the search. After 1 year of being alcohol free, the red card will become invalid and a new, regular, state identification will be administered.

SECT 4. The new regulations will be mandated by the state governments and overseen by the ATF (Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms).

SECT 5. This bill will come into effect January 1st 2019.

SECT 6. All bills in conflict with this legislature are hereby declared null and void.
