## A BILL TO CHANGE THE OBSERVANCE OF HALLOWEEN TO SATURDAY

- 1. To reduce disruption to schools and make it more convenient for the food service, event management, and entertainment industries;
- 2. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 3. <u>Section 1:</u> Halloween is hereby designated as a federal holiday.
- 4. <u>Section 2:</u> Beginning in 2020 and continuing ever year thereafter Halloween will be
- 5. observed on the last Saturday in October.
- 6. <u>Section 3</u>: Federal buildings and services, the post office, and banks will be closed in
- 7. observance.

## A RESOLUTION DENOUNCING PERSECUTION OF ALLEGED WITCHES

- 1. WHEREAS, in many countries around the world the practice of witchcraft has resulted in
- 2. serious physical attacks and other violations of human rights, and
- 3. **WHEREAS**, there has been little or no support from the international community to protect
- 4. people accused of witchcraft, therefore
- 5. **BE IT RESOLVED** by the student congress here assembled,
- 6. This body urges the President and the United States Ambassador to the United Nations to lead
- 7. the effort to protect the human rights of people accused of witchcraft by:
- 8. **Section 1)** Pressuring the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights to establish a
- 9. list of countries where witches or those accused of witchcraft are facing violations of their
- 10. human rights and to report the list to the United Nations by January 1, 2019.
- 11. Section 2) Urging the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights to notify these
- 12. countries that significant improvement must be made or the United Nations will take up a vote
- 13. for economic sanctions.

## A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION TO REFORM THE US SUPREME COURT

- 1. **RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following is
- 2. proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 3. intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths
- 4. of the several states within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:
- 5 \*\*\*
- 6. **SECTION 1**: Before March 1 of each odd-numbered year the President shall appoint a Justice
- 7. of the Supreme Court who shall, upon confirmation by the Senate, replace the longest serving
- 8. member of the Court. The new Justice shall be seated before the Court's session begins in
- 9. October. It is the intention of this amendment that a rotation of Justices be established so that each serves, as near as possible, an eighteen year term.
- 10. **SECTION 2**: In the event that a vacancy on the court occurs before the scheduled time of a new
- 11. replacement, the president shall appoint a justice to replace the vacant seat and skip the next
- 12. scheduled replacement. No President may appoint more than two Justices during a four year
- 13. term of office
- 14. **SECTION 3**: The Chief Justice shall be chosen by a vote of the nine justices after the seating of
- 15. a new Justice, and shall serve a two-year renewable term.
