Wolfpack Invitational Legislation 2019

A Bill to Impeach the President

- 1. WHEREAS, President Donald J. Trump, in violation of his constitutional oath of
- 2. office, has prevented, obstructed and impeded the administration of justice during a
- 3. federal investigation and,
- 4. WHEREAS, Mr. Trump has violated campaign finance laws by being instrumental in
- 5. arranging illegal payments to effectively quiet women with whom he was involved in
- 6. extra-marital affairs and,
- 7. WHEREAS, Mr. Trump has colluded with foreign agents to influence the outcome of
- 8. The 2016 presidential election.
- 9. THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE
- 10. ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 11. Donald John Trump, President of the United States, is impeached for high crimes and
- 12. misdemeanors and that these articles of impeachment be conveyed to the United States
- 13. Senate.

A Bill to Raise the Federal Minimum Wage

- 1. WHEREAS: The last time the Federal Minimum Wage was increased was in 2009,
- 2. during the Great Recession and,
- 3. WHEREAS: A year of full time work under the current Federal Minimum Wage
- 4. amounts to just over \$15,000, forcing many to turn to other means, such as
- 5. government assistance, to support themselves or their families and,
- 6. WHEREAS: The current Federal Minimum Wage has caused both a drop in
- 7. national median income and the size of the middle class to shrink and,
- 8. WHEREAS: Many companies, cities, and states across the nation have already
- 9. begun to raise the hourly minimum wage,
- 10.BE IT ENACTED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:
- 11. **SECTION 1:** The Federal Minimum Wage will be raised to \$10.00 per hour.
- 12. **SECTION 2:** All employers in violation shall be fined \$10,000 per worker earning
- 13. under the minimum wage
- 14. **SECTION 3:** The Department of Labor will be responsible for the implementation
- 15. and enforcement of this legislation.
- 16.**SECTION 4:** This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2020.
- 17. **SECTION 5:** All other pieces of legislation in conflict with this bill are hereby
- 18. declared null and void.

A Bill to Restrict Domestic Data Collection

- 1. WHEREAS: Warrantless domestic data collection remains a significant and
- 2. controversial problem in the United States; and,
- 3. **WHEREAS:** Hundreds of millions of phone calls, text messages, emails, and other
- 4. communications from both American citizens and foreign citizens have been gathered under
- 5. the authority of Section 702 of the Foreign Intelligence Siurveillance Act; and,
- 6. WHEREAS: Section 702 allows warrantless surveillance of people inside and outside of
- 7. the United States; and,
- 8. **WHEREAS:** There is evidence that Section 702 has been abused by U.S. intelligence
- 9. agencies; and
- 10. WHEREAS: there are no measures that prevent Section 702 from being used agains
- 11. political critics, social activists or communities of color,
- 12. THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:
- 13.**SECTION 1:** Section 702 of the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act is hereby 14.repealed.
- 15. **SECTION 2:** FISA will undergo a complete audit of protocols and norms to insure that
- 16. domestic privacy rights are not being violated.
- 17. **SECTION 3:** The implementation of this legislation and the proposed audit shall be
- 18. overseen by the Department of Justice.
- 19. **SECTION 4:** This legislation shall go into effect immediately on its passage.
- 20. **SECTION 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
- 21. Null and void.

A Resolution to Terminate Military Aid to Saudi Arabia

- 1. WHEREAS, the Crown Prince of Saudi Arabia has been fueling a corrupt
- 2. government and using violence against his political opponents and,
- 3. WHEREAS, the murder of Jamal Khashoggi is a clear violation of human rights
- 4. And a violation of American's humanitarian standards, signaling a turning point in the
- 5. relationship between the U.S. and Saudi Arabia and,
- 6. WHEREAS, Saudi Arabia has used U.S. military aid to fuel jihadist attacks in
- 7. surrounding countries causing mass destruction and death, destabilizing the region.
- 8. BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:
- 9. All U.S. military aid to Saudi Arabia cease, including any unfunded pledges of military support.

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Reform the U.S. Supreme Court

1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

- 2. that the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United
- 3. States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution
- 4. when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven
- 5. years from the date of its submission by the Congress:
- 6. **SECTION 1**: Before March 1 of each odd-numbered year the President shall
- 7. appoint a Justice of the Supreme Court who shall, upon confirmation by the Senate,
- 8. replace the longest serving member of the Court. The new Justice shall be seated
- 9. before the Court's session begins in October. It is the intention of this amendment
- 10. that a rotation of Justices be established so that each serves, as near as possible, an
- 11. eighteen year term.
- 12. **SECTION 2**: In the event that a vacancy on the court occurs before the scheduled
- 13. time of a new replacement, the president shall appoint and Senate confirm a Justice to
- 14. replace the vacant seat and skip the next scheduled replacement. No President may
- 15. appoint more than two Justices during a four year term of office
- 16. **SECTION 3**: The Chief Justice shall be chosen by a vote of the nine justices after
- 17. the seating of a new Justice, and shall serve a two-year renewable term.

A Resolution to Produce Protection for Borders and Dreamers

- 1. **WHEREAS:** After the repeal of the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals
- 2. (DACA), Democrats made it a priority on their agenda to reinstate a program to
- 3. help those affected and,
- 4. WHEREAS: President Trump has threatened to shut down the government if he
- 5. does not receive funding for his proposed border wall and,
- 6. WHEREAS: President Trump and numerous Congressmen and women have
- 7. proposed a deal to establish both funding for the border wall and the DACA
- 8. program and,
- 9. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED

10.**THAT**:

- 11. The Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program is to be reinstituted while \$2
- 12. billion will be deferred from the Department of Defense to a new budget to pay for
- 13. President Trump's proposed border wall.

A Resolution to Reduce Income Inequality

- 1. WHEREAS: income inequality in the United States is growing more severe with
- 2. each passing year; and,
- 3. WHEREAS, the top 1% of earners in the United States average over 40 times as
- 4. much income as the bottom 90%; and,
- 5. **WHEREAS,** in the year 2017, the average CEO salary was \$13,940,000, an income
- 6. 361 times greater than the average worker; and,
- 7. WHEREAS, the average CEO salary have grown by 1000% since the 1950s; and,
- 8. **WHEREAS**, 39.7 million people lived in poverty in 2017
- 9. BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:
- 10. Any corporate CEO salary may not exceed 50 times the amount of the lowest salary for a
- 11. full-time employee of the corporation.
