## A Bill to Incentivize Domestic Manufacturing

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. The United States shall provide a 6 percent corporate income
- 3. tax reduction to companies in the manufacturing sector. In order to be
- 4. eligible for the incentive, all components of the product must be
- 5. manufactured in the United States.
- 6. SECTION 2. The "manufacturing sector" shall be defined as the sector
- 7. that comprises establishments engaged in the mechanical, physical, or
- 8. chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new
- 9. products.
- 10. SECTION 3. The Internal Revenue Service and Department of Commerce
- 11. shall be responsible for implementing this legislation.
- 12. SECTION 4. This legislation shall be implemented beginning in 2020
- 13. calendar tax year.
- 14. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
- 15. null and void

## A Resolution to Strengthen Trade Relations with the United Kingdom

- 1. WHEREAS, The United Kingdom's exit from the European Union has
- 2. created an international trade fiasco; and
- 3. WHEREAS, The eventual end of free trade between the United Kingdom
- 4. and the European Union has presented an opportunity for free trade between
- 5. the United States and the United Kingdom; and
- 6. WHEREAS, Pursuing closer economic relations with the United Kingdom
- 7. can boost both the global economy and diplomatic relations independently
- 8. of the European Union; and
- 9. WHEREAS, A free trade agreement would reaffirm the alliance between
- 10. the United States and the United Kingdom; now, therefore, be it
- 11. RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled begin negotiations with
- 12. the United Kingdom to establish a free trade agreement between our two
- 13. nations.

# A Bill to Combat Climate Change through State Governments

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. A.) The federal government shall annually subsidize 50% of the cost of renewable
- 3. energy projects undertaken by state governments.
- 4. B.) States who fail to undertake a renewable energy project shall lose 10% of their
- 5. federal highway funding for the following year. States whose majority of power
- 6. usage already comes from renewable energy shall not be subject to this penalty.
- 7. C.) Subsidies and penalties from Sections 1 and 2 do not compound.
- 8. SECTION 2. Renewable energy is defined as sources of power that do not deplete the natural
- 9. environment.
- 10. SECTION 3. The Department of Energy will oversee the administration of subsidies and
- 11. project monitoring. The Department of Transportation will oversee the
- 12. administration of state highway funding.
- 13. SECTION 4. This legislation shall go into effect one year after passage.
- 14. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### A Bill to Set an Ultimatum on Saudi Arabia

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. All Oil and Petroleum imports from The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia shall be
- 3. embargoed until the Saudi Government officially accepts and implements the
- 4. United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
- 5. SECTION 2. Implementing the Declaration shall be defined as fully abiding by its contents.
- 6. SECTION 3. The US Department of Treasury shall enforce this embargo and oversee its
- 7. implementation.
- 8. SECTION 4. This bill shall be enacted March 1st, 2019.
- 9. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Legalize Physician Assisted Suicide

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. Doctors be permitted to administer assisted suicide, or euthanasia, to their
- 3. terminally ill patients, with their consent, in order to painlessly end their lives for
- 4. the sake of eliminating unnecessary pain and suffering.
- 5. A request to administer or receive euthanasia must be approved by
- 6. a trained physician and a legal guardian
- 7. SECTION 2. A terminally ill patient is defined as a patient that has been diagnosed with an
- 8. incurable or irreversible illness.
- 9. SECTION 3. The implementation of this bill shall be overseen by the United States Department
- 10. of Health and Human Services (USDHHS)
- 11. SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented at the start of the 2020 fiscal year.
- 12. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### A Bill to Create an Opt-Out Organ Donation System

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. The National Organ Transplant Act of 1984 shall be amended to require states to
- 3. have an opt-out organ donor system for Americans born in or after the year 2018.
- 4. SECTION 2. The Health Resources and Services Administration of the United States
- Department of Health and Human Services will oversee the implementation of
- 6. this bill.
- 7. A. Opt outs will be submitted to the states in the same manner as opt-ins are
- 8. currently submitted.
- 9. B. No existing Child Health and Human Development Extramural Research
- 10. grants shall be renewed, nor any new grants be funded for any state not in
- 11. compliance with this mandate.
- 12. SECTION 3. The implementation of this bill shall be overseen by the United States Department
- 13. of Health and Human Services (USDHHS).
- 14. SECTION 4. This bill will be implemented eight months after passage.
- 15. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
