6	SECTION 3.	The United States Department of Commerce shall oversee the	
7		implementation of this bill.	
8		A. Companies found not in compliance with this policy will receive an	
9		increase of 5% on their yearly income tax.	
10		B. For every month that passes without improvement in data diversity, the	
11		tax will increase an additional 5%.	
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall go into effect January 1st, 2020.	
13	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
