L	I MIVATE STACEFLIGHT COMPANIES
2	BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
3	SECTION 1. NASA's space exploration and operations budget, along with the duties
4	associated with that budget, shall be given to private companies in order to
5	increase efficiency
5	SECTION 2. NASA's space exploration budget funds exploration research, systems
7	development (e.g. Orion and SLS projects), and Commercial Spaceflight.
3	NASA's space operations budget funds the ISS along with Space and
9	Flight Support. Private companies are any spaceflight capable companies
10	(e.g. SpaceX or Blue Horizon).
11	SECTION 3. NASA shall oversee the transfer of funds. When implemented, 10% of
12	NASA's Space Exploration and Operations budget shall be delegated to
13	private companies. After one year the cost efficiency of the private sector
14	will be compared to that of the public sector by a congressional panel. If
15	the private sector is deemed more cost-efficient twenty percent of NASA's
16	remaining space exploration and operations budget shall be transferred
17	every two years to the private sector.
18	A. The private companies chosen to receive the funding will be decided

20	B. Any companies chosen by NASA to fulfil its tasks must be approved
21	by Congress.
