It is important to note the changes in the format of debate from preliminary to semi-final to final round debate. In a nut shell, preliminary debate is "standard" congress, the semi-final round involves impromptu committee work, and the final round hinges upon a scenario. All the details of these three formats are outlined in the Rules/Schedule Packet. In several days, we will release potential scenario topics for the final round and the semi-final legislation topics.
