- 1. **SECTION 1**. There will be a nationwide ban on abortions for fetuses older
- 2. than twenty-eight weeks.
- 3. SECTION 2. Fetuses can be defined as a developing human from usually two
- 4. months after conception to birth.
- 5. **SECTION 3.** The American Medical Association will be in charge of
- 6. overseeing the prohibition of abortions after twenty-eight weeks and it will be
- 7. funded by the medical expenditures budget.
- 8. Any doctor caught violating this bill will be fined and can risk losing his/her licensure to practice medicine.
- 9. **SECTION 4.** This will be implemented January 2022.
- 10. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
- 11. void.

A Bill to Reduced Deaths Caused by Cigarette Products

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1**. There will be a nationwide ban on the selling of flavored electronic
- 3. cigarette products.
- 4. **SECTION 2**. Electronic Cigarette Products shall be defined as any electronic
- 5. nicotine systems that help inhale aerosols that contain nicotine flavorings and
- 6. other chemicals. National Institute on Drug Abuse
- 7. **SECTION 3.** The National Institute on Drug Abuse will be responsible for enforcing
- 8. this bill. It will be funded from the medical expenditures budget.
- 9. Any store that violates this ban will be fined \$10,000 per violation and risk losing their retail license.
- 10. **SECTION 4.** This legislation will go into effect January 1st, 2020.
- 11. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
- 12. and void.
