

A Bill to Provide Development Aid to the Northern Triangle

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. The United States Agency for International Development
3 (USAID) shall distribute one billion dollars of development aid
4 to non-governmental organizations (NGOs) operating within
5 the Northern Triangle to stabilize the region and improve the
6 lives of local people.

7 SECTION 2. The Northern Triangle shall be defined as the following
8 countries: Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador. Development
9 aid shall be defined as agricultural, economic, educational, and
10 medical aid.

11 SECTION 3. USAID shall be charged with implementation of this legislation.
12 USAID shall create a proposal process for NGOs and award
13 grants based on past performance, technical approach,
14 personnel, corporate capability, and management plans.

15 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
16 null and void.

A Bill to Ban Assault Weapons

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. The United States Federal Government shall ban the import,
3 sale, manufacturing, transfer, or possession of a
4 semiautomatic assault weapon (SAW) or large capacity
5 ammunition feeding device (LCAFD) except those related to
6 certain law enforcement efforts, or authorized tests or
7 experiments;

6 SECTION 2. The prohibition does not apply to a firearm that is (1)
7 manually operated by bolt, pump, lever, or slide action; (2)
8 permanently inoperable; (3) an antique; or (4) a rifle or
9 shotgun specifically identified by make and model..

11 SECTION 3. The bill permits continued possession, sale, or transfer of a
12 grandfathered SAW, which must be securely stored. A licensed
13 gun dealer must conduct a background check prior to the sale
14 or transfer of a grandfathered SAW between private parties.

15 SECTION 4. The bill permits continued possession of, but prohibits sale or
16 transfer of, a grandfathered LCAFD. Newly manufactured
17 LCAFDs must display serial number identification. Newly
18 manufactured SAWs and LCAFDs must display the date of
19 manufacture.

20 SECTION 5 The bill also allows a state or local government to use Edward
21 Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program funds to
22 compensate individuals who surrender a SAW or LCAFD under
23 a buy-back program.

24 SECTION 6 The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives shall
25 oversee and implement this legislation.

26 SECTION 7. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
27 null and void.

A Resolution to Rejoin Iran Nuclear Deal

1 WHEREAS, President Trump’s decision to pull out of the Iran Nuclear deal
2 has increased tensions with Iranian President Hassan Rouhani
3 and surrounding Middle Easter states; and
4 WHEREAS, The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) reported last
5 year that Iran has complied with the Iran Nuclear Deal and
6 continues to work towards non-proliferation; and
7 WHEREAS, The large number of US allies remain a part of the Iran Nuclear
8 Deal; and Iran’s renewed partnership with Russia increases the
9 likelihood of regional violence; now, therefore, be it
10 RESOLVED, By the Congress here assembled encourages President Trump
11 to rejoin the Iran Nuclear Deal in order to advocate for
12 non-proliferation of nuclear weapons and regain the trust of
13 Iran.

A Resolution to Pardon Nonviolent Drug Offenders

1 WHEREAS, Prisons are overcrowded with nonviolent drug offenders; and
2 WHEREAS, Many nonviolent offenders are subject to mandatory
3 minimums; and
4 WHEREAS, A criminal record makes finding a job much harder; and
5 WHEREAS, Minority communities have been targeted by draconian drug
6 laws; now, therefore, be it
7 RESOLVED By the Congress here assembled that the President pardon
8 all federal nonviolent drug offenders; and, be it
9 FURTHER RESOLVED, That all governors pardon all their respective state's
10 nonviolent drug offenders.

A Resolution to Establish a Green New Deal

1 WHEREAS, In October 2018, the United Nations international climate
2 science panel released an alarming report. It found that the
3 effects of global warming could become irreversible by 2030
4 without rapid action; and
5 WHEREAS, At least 100 million people would die from increased heat
6 waves, drought, and infectious diseases. The heat would also
7 kill off 90% of the world's coral reefs; now, therefore, be it
8 RESOLVED, By the Congress here assembled that the US Federal
9 Government mandate national net-zero carbon emissions by
10 2050 and require the transition of all U.S. energy grid,
11 buildings, industries and transportation to 100% "clean
12 energy".
