Please be sure that judges are present for instructions at the designated times. Rounds will begin at the designated start time *or earlier*; so judges and students should arrive approximately 20 minutes *before* the start time.

From the time the speaking commences the session should last 80 minutes.

PRESIDING OFFICERS: Please make every effort to bring *at least one presiding officer for every eight students you have entered in Congress.* Without POs, students' speaking time will be affected since time from the session will need to be spent electing a PO.

ENTRY FEES: \$10.00 per competitor. Please pay fees to the WBFL Treasurer at registration.

JUDGING REQUIREMENT: Each school is required to have 1 judge per 10 entries. Coaches cannot serve as judge for their school . Failure to provide the required number of judges may result in your team being dropped from the tournament, in whole or in part, per tournament director's discretion.

Judges must be high school graduates or older. WBFL alumni must be two years out of high school in order to judge. Judges should be able to read, write, and speak English with relative ease. Please provide legislation to your judges prior to the tournament if possible.
