Speech Event Registration

Deadline For Speech Adds: Wednesday, January 8, 2020 at 5:00 pm. You may enter your own name changes and drops in the system until Thursday, January 9, 2020 at 5:00 pm.

Please remember to register your novices in both their main event and the Novice OI Final event.

PFD Registration

All entries in PFD will initially be placed on the wait list. There is an overall limit of 120 PFD teams.

- We will make an initial sweep of the wait list on Thursday evening, December 12, 2019.
- If we have space, we will do a second sweep of the waitlist on December 20, 2019. As of December 20, 2019, all additional PFD entries will go to the waitlist and we will only accept teams to fill spaces if other teams drop.
- The registration deadline for new <u>additions</u> is Thursday, January 2 at 5:00 PM.
- The registration deadline for <u>drops</u> is Friday, January 3 at 5:00 PM.
- PFD drops made after Friday, January 3 at 5:00 PM will incur a \$10 fine (in addition to the registration fee.)
- On the evening of January 3, we will do a final sweep of the wait list.
 We assume that any teams still on the wait list at that time will participate at the tournament and that schools will cover their judging obligation for those teams.

REGISTRATION Fees

Individual Speech events, Congress & Multiple: \$6 per entry

DUO Interp & Big Questions Debate: \$12

PFD: \$15 per team

Registration fees may be paid by cash or check.

Checks should be made out to "Newton South High School"

Please note that if you have late changes that incur fees, you will be expected to pay those fees when you register even if you bring a check that was made out for the original registration amount.

DROPS & NAME CHANGES

Drops that occur after 5:00 pm on Thursday, January 9 should be emailed to <u>Lisa.Honeyman@gmail.com</u> or called in on Saturday morning between 7:00-7:45 am.

JUIDGES

You are required to bring one judge for every five entries or fraction thereof in speech events, one judge for every two entries, or fraction thereof, in Big Questions and one judge for every two entries, or fraction thereof, in PFD. Judges must be available to judge all preliminary rounds *and* finals. If one of your judges must leave early, please arrange for a replacement judge to take their place. Because we are running semi-finals in some events, judging will be tight and we need everyone to be available. There will be a \$100 fine for each missing judge. This fee is not to be used in lieu of providing required judges.

Please note that all judges must have graduated from high school and must have filed CORI/SORI background checks with the school that brings them to the tournament.

Judging requirements are finalized on Thursday at 5:00 pm. If you have drops after that time, it does not change the number of judges you are required to bring.


If you have brand new speech judges who would benefit from an extended judge training in the morning, please note that on your registration. We will try our best to keep them out of round 1 so that they can attend a one-hour workshop. We will have an experienced coach available to answer questions and go over ballots with our new judges throughout the morning.

We will be using online balloting for both Speech and Debate. All judges must bring an electronic device, preferably a laptop computer, in order to complete balloting.

A limited number of <u>Public Forum Debate judges</u> will be available for hire for \$75 per judge. Please write to Joshua Cohen (<u>jcohen1964@gmail.com</u>) for more information.

All judge names must be finalized by Thursday, January 9, 2020 at 5:00 pm.

Coaches should remember to provide their speech students and speech judges with their code numbers in advance of the tournament. This is particularly important for experienced judges who may be arriving separately from the team.



EVENT SPECIFIC INFORMATION

Group Discussion Topic: Human Rights in China

Rounds will focus on issues of censorship, surveillance, worker rights, treatment of ethnic minorities, and Hong Kong.

Extemporaneous Speaking:

Questions will focus on topics of national, international and economic interest. The final round will be questions focusing on **China**.

Public Forum Debate:

We will use the January NSDA PFD topic: Resolved: The United States should end its economic sanctions against Venezuela.

Congress:

If you have any judges that are particularly interested in judging congressional debate, or in being a parliamentarian, please let us know.


A Note about Multiple:

If there are 5 or fewer Multiples competing at the tournament, there will be no final round held in that event. If there are more than 5 multiples, then between 3 and 4 will break to finals. The goal will be to make a clean break and the number that will advance will be determined by the tournament director.

Semi-Finals:

If an official MSDL event has 40 or more entries after drops, we will run a semi-final round, in addition to the three preliminary rounds. (This will not apply to Congress or Debate.) We can do this as long as we do not have more than 3 events that reach the 40+ entry level. If more than 3 events are this large, we will only run semi-finals in the 3 largest events.

Students must be accompanied by an adult, approved by their school administration, who will be responsible for them during the entire time they are present at the "Winter Festival" Tournament. The coach, or designated responsible adult, is expected to be physically present at the tournament site at all times when students from their school are there. Schools are responsible for making sure all adults that they bring to the tournament have passed the CORI/SORI checks, required by Massachusetts State Law. In order to be able to host tournaments, we rely upon the generosity and good will of the faculty and staff at Newton South. Please be respectful of their classroom spaces, as well as their belongings. No one, including judges, should sit at or touch anything on a teacher's desk. If you discover that something is amiss, please report it to the TAB room as soon as possible so that we can address the issue before Monday morning. Students found in parts of the building that have been designated as off limits - including, but not limited to, the field house or the roof - may be disqualified from the tournament and asked to leave. Standard rules of professionalism and etiquette must be abided by at all times.
