The Fourth Annual Trojan Classic

WHEN: Saturday, October 26, 2019

WHERE: Midlothian High School, 401 Charter Colony Parkway, Midlothian, VA 23114

EVENTS:

- 1. Debate Lincoln-Douglas and Public Forum
 - Novice and Open divisions Students entering in the Novice division must be in their first year of competitive debate; if there are not enough entries to operate separate Novice/Open brackets, the two will be combined, but top novice awards will still be given.
 - Four rounds Tentatively, the first two rounds will be randomly paired, and the last two rounds will be power paired (high–low).
 - September/October NSDA resolutions (LD 'Resolved: In the United States, college and universities ought not consider standardized tests in undergraduate admissions decisions'; PF 'Resolved: The European Union should join the Belt and Road initiative').
 - The NSDA novice resolution about civil disobedience **WILL NOT** be used.
- 2. Student Congress -
 - Two 2-hour sessions
 - Each student should submit a bill/resolution by 5:00 PM on Friday, October 18. Schools should coordinate to have their students divide legislation up among the following categories: domestic, international, economic, Virginia.
 - Topics:
 - Domestic: Red Flag Laws; Vaping
 - International: Brexit: Greenland
 - Economic: Trade with China; Universal Basic Income
 - Virginia: Casinos; Hands-Free Driving
 - The legislation packet will be available on tabroom.com shortly after the deadline.
- 3. <u>Forensics/Speech/IE</u> Extemp, Impromptu, OO, Storytelling, Prose, Poetry, DI, HI, serious duo, humorous duo, duo improv, original spoken word poetry (OSW)
 - Three rounds
 - Students may double-enter in speech categories.
 - Since this tournament is so early in the year, manuscripts will be allowed in <u>ALL</u> events, even storytelling, DI, HI, and duo. Otherwise, VHSL rules will be followed in all VHSL events.
 - Extemp topics:
 - Round 1: 2020 Democratic Presidential Race
 - Round 2: U.S. Immigration
 - Round 3: Europe
 - For OSW, a student's piece will consist of a work or compilation written by the student, delivered in the style of spoken word/slam poetry. Students must submit

- a printed copy of their piece to the judge in each round. Other OSW rules will follow VHSL poetry rules.
- For duo improv, each pair of students will draw three topics/scenarios and will have seven minutes to prepare and perform an improvised piece based on one of the three drawn topics. Preparation is limited to three minutes maximum.

JUDGES: Each school is responsible for providing their own judges according to the following quotas:

1 judge for...

- ...every 2 Lincoln-Douglas entries (or fraction thereof)
- ...every 2 Public Forum entries (or fraction thereof)
- ...every 5 Student Congress and Speech entries (or fraction thereof)

As this is an early-season invitational, judges need not have a wealth of experience; however, we expect coaches to have gone over the various events and basic judging procedures with judges before the tournament.

COSTS: Each school entered will incur a \$20 registration fee. There is also an individual entry fee of \$15 per student per event. These costs include lunch for competitors, judges, and coaches. Please bring a check payable to Midlothian High School.

DROPS: Drops (for any reason) are permitted before 9:00 AM on October 24 with no penalty. Drops after this deadline require the school to honor entry fees **AND** honor fulfill the original judging quota. If the judging quota is not met upon registration, students may not be able to compete.

AWARDS: Trophies or medals will be given to the top three finishers in each category. Sweepstakes and runner-up sweepstakes trophies will be given to the schools with the most points across all categories. As the host school, Midlothian High School will be ineligible for sweepstakes trophies.
