

Castle Classic - Debate Topics & Ballot Checklist

- 1. Double check that the **CODES** and **NAMES** of the competitors on each individual ballot comment section and your final rankings/decision match the correct entry.
- 2. Many students (in non-debate events) are double/triple entered each round. Please allow for those double/triple entered students to leave before all competitors have performed and/or enter late without penalty. DO NOT wait for all competitors that appear on your list to arrive before you start the performances. Start as soon as you arrive.
- 3. Double check that you rank/score each competitor under their correct code and name before you submit your ballot.
- 4. **RANK** the competitors in ALL rounds 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7. This is how you think the students placed in the round (best performer/speaker gets the 1, 2nd best the 2, etc)
- 5. You will also need to assign each entry a **SCORE** which will be points ranging from **20** (*yikes, that was a pretty rough performance*) to **50** (*WOW you totally nailed it*). Do not tie points, and the highest rank needs to have the most points assigned, 2nd place, the next highest points, etc.
- 6. **Please write comments on the ballot AS YOU GO**. Trying to save all of your comments until the end of the round is not very kind to your brain and will slow the tournament to a crawl. You aren't going to offend the students if you are sometimes not looking at them because you are writing comments **DURING** the performance/debate/speech.
- 7. Please submit your completed ballots within 5 minutes of the completion of the last performer/debater/speaker.
- 8. ALL JUDGES, please write a **Reason For Decision (RFD)**, as well as individual comments. Whether debate, duo or anything in-between, it is discouraging to get comments like "good, great, awesome" then be ranked last in the round with nothing to show why you lost the round.
- 9. **NO ORAL CRITIQUES**. Please do NOT offer oral critiques. It slows tournaments to a crawl and upsets some coaches as they are not privy to comments.
- 10. Grab some grub and/or something to drink and off you go to the next exciting round of competition. Tabroom should send you an email and/or text message as soon as you have another ballot. As soon as you get the electronic notification that means the next round is posted and ready to start. I will also have my GCHS students announcing when rounds start so you can check your electronic device.

Current Debate Topics:

Policy/Cross Examination Debate (5 minute rebuttals)

Resolved: The United States federal government should substantially reduce Direct Commercial Sales and/or Foreign Military Sales of arms from the United States.

Lincoln-Douglas Debate

Resolved: The United States ought to eliminate subsidies for fossil fuels.

Public Forum Debate

Resolved: The benefits of the United States federal government's use of offensive cyber operations outweigh the harms.

- "Flashing" (sharing arguments/evidence via flash drive) during prep DOES COUNT as prep time.
- Please remember, you are judging this round based on how well the debaters construct and communicate their arguments, NOT what you personally believe.
- Please leave a reason for decision so the debaters and their coaches understand what arguments swayed you to vote a certain way.
- In Lincoln-Douglas and Cross-Examination Debates, no debater may be tied in points and the winner must get more points.
