### LOCATIONS

Tournament Headquarters and Tab Room will be in the executive Board Room, Building 200.

**Postings** will be digital as well as posted in the cafeteria.

**Extemp Prep** will be in Room 405 in the 400 building

**Parking** is available in both parking lots (see campus map), although Lot B is the closest to tab and the cafeteria. You will need to buy a parking permit or you will be ticketed. I have no control over this. Permit machines are located in the various parking lots. Parking permits are \$3 per day and is enforced 24/7.

**Food:** We will provide a light breakfast both days. Lunch is on your own. The school cafeteria (2300 building) has a variety of options and will be open on Friday until the early afternoon. There are also a number of fast and not-so-fast food options directly across the street from campus (walking distance), and even more within a short driving distance.

### **DIVISIONS OF COMPETITION**

Registration will be taken for two divisions of competition: Novice and Open.

- a) Individual Events: If entries do not warrant separate divisions in an event, the Tournament Director reserves the right to combine divisions prior to the start of the competition.
- b) Debate: The tournament will follow NPDA rules for their respective debate events regarding breaks and collapsing of divisions with the following stipulations:
  - a) NPDA will break to a full quarters so long as it does not exceed half the field. In the event that a division does not reach 16 teams, half the field will be broken. Brackets will be broken in NPDA per NPDA guidelines. Mavericks will NOT be allowed, however 3 person teams will be allowed at the director's discretion. We encourage you to seek out a hybrid with another school in the event that you have an extra debater.
  - b) We will use the following tie-breaks: win/loss, total speaker points, adjusted speaker points, judge variance, opp record.

**Eligibility:** Any student that meets AFA and NPDA requirements for their respective event is eligible. Novice and JV eligibility are as follows:

### **Debate Novice Eligibility:** To be classified as a novice:

- a. The student should have no high school debate experience.
- b. The student should be in the first two semesters of collegiate debate.
- c. Once the student has advanced to elimination rounds 2 times in that form of debate, the student should be advanced to the junior or open division.

# In the event that we have enough students to make a JV division, the following are eligibility rules to be classified as junior varsity:

- a) The student should be in the first four semesters of intercollegiate debate.
- b) The student should not have advanced to elimination rounds 3 times in junior or open division.
- c) The student should not have advanced to elimination rounds in a debate event at ANY national competition (NFA, NPDA, PKD, Phi Rho Pi, etc.).

### **Individual Events Novice Eligibility:**

For novice division, contestants must be in their first year of competition in event area in either high school or college. Students may be novice for new event areas, even if they are open in others (example: a student did interp in high school but no limited prep. They can go novice in the limited prep, but the must go open in the interp).

### **Sweepstakes Divisions:**

There will be two Sweepstakes Divisions: University and Community College. Plaques will be given to the first, second, and third place schools in each division.

### **Sweepstakes Points**

Sweepstakes points will be awarded on the following basis:

Individual Events ("single weight" events):

First Place	10 points
Second Place	7.5 points
Third Place	.5 points
Finalist	3 points

Debate: (top 4 teams in each division per school):

3 points for each prelim win plus 2 points for each team/debater that clears.

### JUDGING

Judging commitment will be based on the following formulas: every 5 individual events <u>entries</u> requires one round of judging and every judge covers 2 NPDA or NFA-LD debate entries. Judges are expected to judge one round beyond the point their students are eliminated from competition.

It is vital that judges are present during the critical elimination rounds. Because of the difficulty of finding enough qualified debate judges, **we will allow schools only TWO uncovered debate entries.** These, as usual, will assess uncovered fees as well as the entry fee.

If you anticipate problems meeting your commitment, please let us know in advance and we will make efforts to assist you. Hired judges will be compensated. IE and Parli judges will be paid \$10/round, while NFA judges will be paid \$15 per double flighted round. Judges/coaches who do miss ballots without notifying the director of judges and without having had a previous ballot which may have delayed them may be charged the appropriate nuisance fee to compensate the judge/coach who did replace them.

### **QUALIFIED JUDGE**

We will follow NPDA and NIET guidelines for qualified judges. Other judges may be approved at the tournament director's discretion.
