

A Bill to Aid Colombia

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. A. The U.S. will provide \$250 million in humanitarian aid to Colombia in order to assist with the Venezuelan refugee crisis.

B. The U.S. will provide \$250 million in developmental aid to help integrate refugees in Colombia.

Section 2. A. Humanitarian aid shall be defined as aid used for medicine, food and water, etc.

B. Developmental aid shall be defined as aid used to support the economic and social development, such as developing infrastructure.

Section 3. USAID will oversee the enforcement of the bill.

Section 4. This legislation will be implemented immediately following passage.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Implement an Universal Basic Income (UBI)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. The U.S. government will establish a guaranteed payment of \$1000 to all adult U.S. citizens each month.

Section 2. Adults will be defined as U.S. citizens over the age of 18.

Section 3. The Internal Revenue System (IRS) will oversee the enforcement of the bill.

A. The UBI will be paid for through a financial transaction tax. This tax would include a tax of .5% on stock trades, .1% of bond trades and .005% on derivative transactions.

Section 4. This legislation will be implemented Fiscal Year 2021.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
