Dear United States of America Senators,

We have called this emergency session of Congress into order on November 10th to discuss the developments in the intense Pakistan and India situation. The Pakistani government has assassinated the Indian prime minister, Narendra Modi. Out of retaliation, the Indian government has admitted to killing the Pakistani prime minister, Imran Khan. As a result, the Pakistani government has declared war on India. In addition, the Pakistani government has suspended the rules of succession and appointed prominent political figure Hina Rabbani Khar to become the new prime minister. India has taken control of Pakistani territory, while Pakistan has also taken control of Indian territory. The first day of fighting has been plagued by bloodshed on both sides. India's military has killed 961 Pakistani soldiers. On the other hand, Pakistan's military killed 947 Indian soldiers. My administration has decided to submit legislation, attached to this briefing, in order to quell the violence and support our ally, India. It is imperative that all of you carefully consider the situation and debate the legislation. My administration will continue to provide briefings as the situation escalates. Make wise decisions; the fate of the world hangs in the balance.

A Bill to Aid India

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. A. The U.S. will provide \$75 million in military aid to India.

B. The U.S. shall implement selective and targeted sanctions on Pakistan.

C. The U.S. shall deploy 1000 troops to Pakistan.

Section 2. A. Military Aid shall be defined as expanding their air force, providing military advisors, weapons, intelligence, etc.

B. Sanctions shall include stopping all trade to and from Pakistan (selective) and freezing all foreign assets of prominent Pakistani political figures (targeted).

Section 3. USAID will oversee the enforcement of the bill.

Section 4. This legislation will be implemented immediately following passage.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
