BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Article I: All Affirmative Action laws, policies, guidelines, and administrative

practices in the United States shall hereby be abolished.

Article II: This bill shall be enacted thirty (30) days following the passage of this bill.

and void.

A BILL TO CHARGE AN EXIT TAX ON OFFSHORING COMPANIES

BE IT ENACTED by the PHSSL State Student Congress here assembled that:

Section 1: The United States of America will impose an exit tax on companies that wish to offshore labor to other countries.

Section 2: Offshoring is defined as "the practice of basing some of a company's processes or services overseas, so as to take advantage of lower costs" by Oxford Dictionary. Thus, any companies that move any labor to any country besides the United States is committing the act of offshoring.

Section 3: Offshoring is detrimental to the United States economy because it allows companies to avoid paying taxes every year that they should be paying. According to *International Business Times*, businesses avoid paying about \$2.5 million in taxes. Every country that offshores is obligated to report what the hypothetical tax amount they would have paid if had they not offshored. However, many do not. The 58 of the 298 Fortune 500 businesses that had reported, however, had a total amount of about \$212 billion in taxes that could have been paid to the United States government.

Section 4: The Department of Commerce will oversee the enactment of this bill.

Section 5: This will take effect on January 1, 2020

Section 6: All laws in conflict with the legislation are hereby declared null and void.

SECTION 1. LSD will be legalized for use as a prescription drug to help with a variety 2 3 of mental disorders while the patient is under the care of a doctor. This prescription would be administered in microdoses. 4 **SECTION 2.** LSD is defined as lysergic acid diethylamide, a psychedelic drug found to 5 alleviate and/or remove symptoms of certain mental disorders. 6 7 <u>Prescription drug</u> is defined as a drug that can be obtained only by means 8 of a physician's prescription. Microdose is defined as a very small amount 9 of a drug used to test or benefit from its physiological action while minimizing undesirable side effects. 10 SECTION 3. The US Food & Drug Administration (FDA) will oversee the 11 12 implementation of this legislation. 13 A. This legislation will be directly delegated to the FDA's Center for 14 Drug Evaluation and Research (CDER). **SECTION 4.** This bill will take effect January 1, 2021. 15 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. 16

A Bill to Revoke the Declaration to Withdraw from the Paris Climate Accords

Be it enacted by the Student Congress here assembled that:

- **SECTION 1.** The United States of America must remain with the rest of the world in abiding by the Paris Climate Accords and become compliant with all terms mentioned in said agreement. Additionally, the Environmental Protection Agency shall receive \$75.8 billion annually in addition to their annual budget. The Department of the Interior shall receive an additional \$63.87 billion annually in addition to their annual budget.
- SECTION 2. The terms Paris Climate Accords, Paris Agreement, or Paris Climate Agreement shall be considered synonymous. The Paris Climate Accords refers to the international agreement on greenhouse gas emissions mitigation, the supporting of climate action to reduce emissions and build the resilience to climate change effects in developing nations, supporting humanity's ability to deal with the impacts of climate change, and ultimately keeping the increase of global average temperatures to well below two degrees celsius above pre-industrial levels.
- **SECTION 3.** The Environmental Protection Agency shall work in conjunction with the Department of the Interior in the effective enforcement of the guidelines set in the accord.
 - **A.** For the delegation of responsibilities in regards to species protection within the Department of the Interior, shall be defined as found in the United States Endangered Species Act of 1973.
 - **B.** All other environmental issues shall be delegated to the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect upon passage.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
