A Bill to Secure Vampire Burial Space in Cemeteries

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- SECTION 1. The United States federal government shall require all existing cemeteries with remaining burial space to set aside 10% of that remaining space for green vampire burials.

A Bill to Add Warning Labels to Products Containing Artificial Sweeteners

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** Due to the potential health risks of artificial sweeteners, including exacerbating the
- 3. very health problems they were intended to resolve, the U.S. Food and Drug
- 4. Administration is directed to require warning labels on all food and drink products
- 5. sold in the United States that
- 6. contain synthetic sweeteners, similar to the warning labels on tobacco products.
- 7. **SECTION 2.** "Synthetic sweetener" is defined as any product not occurring in natural plant substances, specifically any created through chemical processes, that is intended
- 9. replace sugar in food products for human consumption.
- 10. **SECTION 3.** This process will be carried out by the Food and Drug Administration in accordance with its role and duties as designated by Congress.
- 12. **SECTION 4.** Any additional funding necessary should be included in the FDA's budget request for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2020.
- 14. **SECTION 5.** This law shall go into effect for products sold on or after January 1, 2021.
- 15. **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with the provisions of this law are null and void.



A Bill to End the Abuse of "Trick or Treating"

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** The State of California shall institute the following restrictions on "Trick or Treating":
 - **A.** "Trick or treating" in the State of California shall be limited to the hours of 5:30-8:30 p.m. on October 31 of each year.
 - **B.** "Trick or treating" shall be limited to children in the eighth grade or under.
- 7. **SECTION 2.** "Trick or treating" is defined as door to door solicitation of gifts, food, candy, or
 8. money, as is customarily and commonly known as "trick or treat" in celebration of
 9. Halloween.
- 10. **SECTION 3.** Enforcement of this law shall be the responsibility of local law enforcement agencies.
- 12. **SECTION 4.** Funding and fines shall be as follows:

- **A.** No additional funds shall be granted to local law enforcement.
 - **B.** Each violation of this law shall be a misdemeanor subject to a civil fine of \$150 per person engaged in trick or treating.
 - **C.** Fines shall be assessed to the parent or legal guardian of minors, or the violator if 18 years of age or older.
 - **D.** All revenue from fines assessed will go to local United Way agencies providing free or reduced-fee dental care.
- 20. **SECTION 4.** This law shall go into effect on October 1, 2020.
- 21. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with the provisions of this law are null and void
