COLORADO'S OLDEST FRIDAY A

### A bill to Ban and Buyback Semiautomatic Assault Weapons

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** 18 U.S. Code § 2332ga and Section 922 of Title 18 banning civilian
- 3. ownership of military weapons shall be expanded to include assault weapons. It shall be
- 4. unlawful for any <u>person</u> to knowingly produce, construct, otherwise acquire, transfer
- 5. directly or indirectly, receive, possess, import, export, or use, or possess and threaten to
- 6. use an explosive or incendiary rocket or missile that is guided by any system designed to
- 7. enable the rocket or missile to seek or proceed toward energy radiated or reflected
- 8. from an <u>aircraft</u> or toward an image locating an <u>aircraft</u>; for any <u>person</u> to manufacture or
- 9. import <u>armor piercing ammunition</u> or knowingly import, sell, or manufacture, transfer, or
- 10. possess a semiautomatic assault weapon (SAW) or large capacity ammunition feeding device of
- 11. more than 10 rounds of ammunition without requiring manual reloading
- 12. **SECTION 2**. The United States Federal Government shall by February 15, 2020 offer to
- 13. buy any such privately owned weapons and pay the owner twice the retail price at time
- 14. of manufacture of said weapon regardless of lack of proof of purchase.
- 15. **SECTION 3**. Criminal Penalties. Any person who violates, or attempts or conspires to
- 16. violate section one after January 1, 2021 shall be fined not more than \$2,000,000 and
- 17. shall be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not less than 25 years or to imprisonment
- 18. for life.
- 19. **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect one month after passage.
- 20. **SECTION 5**. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Resolution to Protect the Kurdish People

- 1 WHEREAS, the Kurdish people have historically served as valuable allies to the United States; and
- 2 WHEREAS, the Kurdish people have historically been the victims of oppression; and
- 3 WHEREAS, the United States has a moral obligation to protect its allies; and
- 4 WHEREAS, countries have a legitimate right to use force to quell terrorist activity; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) has consistently acted in a manner
- 6 becoming of a terrorist organization; and
- 7 WHEREAS, it is inaccurate and immoral to conflate the Kurdish people with the PKK; now, therefore, be it 8 RESOLVED, By the Congress here assembled that the United States hereby recognizes
- 9 the Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) as a Foreign Terrorist Organization; and10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the United States hereby recognizes the Kurdish people as a nation
- distinct from the PKK; and 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President of the United States is hereby
- 12 empowered and encouraged to use military force to defend the Kurdish
- people when their safety is threatened by outside forces.

# The Refugee Placement Act of 2019

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. The Executive Branch of the United States shall have the authority to place accepted refugees in any
- 3. location under the jurisdiction of the United States.
- 4. SECTION 2. No state or local government shall have the authority to reject or protest refugees placed within their
- 5. jurisdictions as a result of this Act.
- 6. SECTION 3. The Department of Homeland Security shall be tasked with ensuring that all accepted refugees are
- 7. properly vetted. SECTION 4. This Act shall be enforced by the Department of Justice, which shall have
- 8. the authority to determine and assign penalties for violations.
- 9. SECTION 5. This Act will take effect immediately upon passage.
- 10. SECTION 6. All laws and executive acts in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# The Volunteer Army Act of 2019

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. The Selective Service System (SSS) is hereby abolished.
- 3. SECTION 2. No military draft of any kind may be implemented by the United States Federal Government.
- 4. SECTION 3. This legislation shall go into effect immediately upon passage.
- 5. SECTION 4. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### The Education Fulfillment Act of 2019

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. Starting at the beginning of their next applicable school year, all states must increase the salaries of
- 3. all public school teachers by 5%.
- 4. SECTION 2. The United States Department of the Treasury shall provide grants to each state equal to the funds
- 5. necessary to fund the mandate listed in Section 1.
- 6. A. States will be responsible for distributing the appropriate grant funds 8 in Section 2 to their
- 7. respective school districts.
- 8. SECTION 3. Funding for this legislation will be derived from the U.S. Department of Education's budget for the
- 9. Fiscal Year 2021.
- 10. SECTION 4. This legislation will go into effect starting in the Fiscal Year 2021.
- 11. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# The Biodegradable Materials Act of 2019

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. The sale of non-biodegradable products that have a known biodegradable alternative is hereby
- 3. prohibited in the United States.
- 4. SECTION 2. This legislation shall be implemented by the Environmental Protection 5 Agency (EPA).
- 5. A. The EPA shall independently define the terms "Biodegradable" and "Non-biodegradable" as it relates
- 6. to this legislation.
- 7. B. The EPA shall independently determine which products have a biodegradable alternative.
- 8. SECTION 3. Companies or individuals found in violation of this legislation shall be issued a penalty of \$20,000 for
- 9. the first offense, \$100,000 for the second offense, and \$500,000 for each offense thereafter.
- 10. SECTION 4. This legislation shall go into effect on January 1, 2022.
- 11. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### A Resolution to Reduce the Nuclear Arsenal of the United States

- 1. WHEREAS, the current stockpile of nuclear weapons is unnecessary; and
- 2. WHEREAS, the United States, or any other country, does not have a realistic foreign threat of nuclear war; and
- 3. WHEREAS, the likelihood of ever having to use the nuclear weapons held by the United States is basically zero;
- 4. and
- 5. WHEREAS, no current conflict involving the United State could/should be resolved/addressed using nuclear
- 6. weapons; and
- 7. WHEREAS, storing and guarding these weapons is a financial burden on the United States economy; now,
- 8. therefore, be it
- 9. RESOLVED, By the Congress here assembled that the United States should start reducing its nuclear arsenal.
