A Bill to Protect our Kurdish Allies

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 SECTION 1. \$250 million of military aid will be given to the Syrian Kurds for the purpose of
2 defense against Turkish aggression with a no-fly zone being established in conjunction.

3 SECTION 2.

4 A. "Military Aid" shall be defined as money to be used for weapons and equipment.

5 B. A "No Fly Zone" shall be defined as an area in which aircraft may not fly.

6 SECTION 3. The Department of State will oversee the implementation and enforcement of this
7 legislation in conjunction with USAID and the Department of Defense.

8 A. The Department of State shall work in conjunction with the Department of Defense and the
9 Syrian Kurds to establish a command structure and exit strategy.

10 B. The No-Fly zone shall be established for up to 5 years, or when Turkish aggression ceases.

11 SECTION 4. This legislation shall be implemented immediately upon passage.

12 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Department of Immigration Act of 2020

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** Congress is establishing a Department of Immigration. Under this
2 legislation the sub agencies under the Department of Homeland Security that are involved
3 with immigrants and the process of immigration will be under the new department. Said
4 departments will continue upholding their current administrative agenda and the
5 Immigration and Nationality Act. Congress will have a fiscal year to create a committee
6 in charge of drafting the budget for this department and to oversee the transfer of
7 sub agencies.

8 **SECTION 2.** “Sub Agencies under the Department of Immigration” is currently defined
9 as the following sub agencies: USCIS, ICE, and CBP.

10 **SECTION 3.** Congress will be in charge of overseeing this legislation.

11 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect when passed.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation is hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to establish procedures for Impeachment

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article
 2 is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States,
 3 which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution
 4 when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states
 5 within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

ARTICLE 28

6 **SECTION 1.** The following procedures must be added in addition to pre-existing rules
 7 and regulations regarding impeachment trials conducted in the Senate.

- 8 A. Any witness or evidence deemed relevant to the trial by a simple majority of the
 9 Senate must be available for cross-examination by the Senate.
- 10 B. The President may not bar any witness from testifying in the Senate
- 11 C. A two-thirds majority of the senate must agree to vote on acquittal or
 12 impeachment before such a vote can be taken.

13 **SECTION 2.** The Congress shall have the power to enforce this article by appropriate
 14 legislation.

A Bill to Nationally Legalize Marijuana

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** it shall be deemed lawful for any persons over the age of 18 to
2 purchase and use any marijuana product, provided the seller has
3 proper licensees, including business and dispensary licenses.
4 Furthermore, all states within the nation will take Colorado's
5 marijuana possession and growing laws. all counties within states
6 have the same opportunities to legalize marijuana.

8 **SECTION 2.** National being all states currently owned by the United States of
9 America
10

11 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Justice, has complete command and control over
12 the further implementation and oversight of this bill.

- 13 A. legalizing marijuana on the federal level will remove it from
14 Schedule 1 of the Controlled Substances Act.
15 B. All persons that have misdemeanor possession charges for
16 marijuana within the previous 5 years of the start date (as their
17 only charge) will have charges dropped along with jail time.

19 **SECTION 4.** This law will be put into effect on April 20th, 2020

20 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
21 void.

1 WHEREAS, 90% of the sea turtle population has died out in the past 30 year, and 4% of all ocean
2 trash are plastic straws; and,

5 therefore,

6 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

7 **SECTION 1.** A 75% wholesale tax shall be imposed on all manufactures and imports of plastic
8 straws to the United States.

9 **SECTION 2.** A plastic straw shall be defined as “a small tube made of plastic and used as a drinking
10 implement
11 ”

12 **SECTION 3.** All revenue gained from this act shall be used at the discretion of the Environmental
13 Protection Agency (EPA) to fund the restoration of sea turtle habitats, to ensure public
14 education about the dangers of plastic straws, as well as to conduct new research for
15 sea
16 turtle welfare.

17 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect as of Jan 1st,
18 2021.

19 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Require Vaccines for all Children Attending School

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Seeing the danger that resurfacing illnesses have posed in the recent past with Measles outbreaks being reported in 22 different states within the last year. This Congress moves to require vaccines for all children attending school in the best interest of public safety.

SECTION 2. All Children living in the US and attending a Public or Private school will be required to have up to date vaccinations up until said child has reached the age of 18.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of this bill the following characteristics are to be outlined

1. Vaccines will be defined as a substance used to stimulate the production of antibodies and provide immunity against one or several diseases, prepared from the causative agent of a disease, its products, or a synthetic substitute, treated to act as an antigen without inducing the disease.
 2. Any child that attends school and does not have up to date vaccines will be suspended by the school district and not be allowed to be admitted back in until the students vaccines are up to date.
 3. At the start of every school year school district's will do a mandatory check on every registered student for up to date vaccinations
 4. Private schools will be defined as a school supported by a private organization or private individuals rather than by the government.
 5. Public schools will be defined as any school supported by US Government funding

SECTION 4. This bill will be implemented to its full intent at the start of the 2020-2021 school year.

SECTION 5. This bill will be implemented by the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Education, and enforceable by law under US Law.

A Bill to Reform Stock Buybacks

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 SECTION 1. That the text of the "Stock Buyback Reform and Worker Dividend Act of 2019" (S.
2 2391) shall be implemented in full in pursuit of the following:

3 A. Restraining the ability to purchase stock buybacks

4 B. Establishing a worker dividend from acquired buybacks

5 SECTION 2.

6 A. "Stock buyback" shall be defined as an organized re-acquisition of a company's own stock

7 B. "Worker dividend" shall be defined as an annual payment given to each employee equivalent
8 to the sum of repurchased stocks divided by one million

9 SECTION 3. The Securities Exchange Commission shall be in charge of regulating the
10 guidelines of this

11 legislation.

12 SECTION 4. This legislation shall be implemented on January 1, 2021.

A Bill to Reduce Factory Farms

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** Seeing as sustainable, ethical farming has become near impossible because
2 of big corporations, subsidies to all factory farms and Concentrated Animal Feed
3 Operations (CAFO) will be eliminated.

4 **SECTION 2.** Factory farms and CAFO are defined as a system of rearing livestock
5 using intensive methods, by which poultry, pigs, or cattle are confined indoors under
6 strictly controlled conditions.

7 **SECTION 3.** This bill will be overseen and implemented by the Department of
8 Agriculture.

9 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect with the new fiscal year.

10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation is hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to regulate Compounding Pharmacies

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 SECTION 1. The following regulations will be applied to all Compounding Pharmacies
2 operating under the jurisdiction of the United States.

3 SECTION 2. "Compounding Pharmacies" shall be defined as any pharmacy that makes
4 medicines on-site as opposed to producing already manufactured drugs.

5 SECTION 3. The Food and Drug Administration will oversee the enforcement of this
6 legislation.

7 A. FDA approval must be granted to any drugs distributed by
8 Compounding Pharmacies.

9 B. Drugs must be submitted to the FDA for approval before distribution
10 to other medical facilities.

11 C. Drugs must have below a 2% failure rate in order to be sold or
12 otherwise distributed.

13 D. Safety inspections must be conducted by the FDA every 3 months to
14 ensure facilities are up to sanitary standards.

15 SECTION 4. This legislation will go into effect at the start of the Fiscal Year 2021.

16 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

- 11 **WHEREAS,** There is no way of knowing the long term affects of JUULs on those
12 using it due to JUUL only being 5 years old; now, therefore, be it
- 13 **RESOLVED,** By the Congress here assembled that the US government should
14 completely stop JUUL from advertising

1 **WHEREAS,** the Government of the Islamic Republic of Iran has taken military action
 2 against the People of the United States in retaliation of the execution of an
 3 Iranian Military Executive considered to be a terrorist by the Government
 4 and the People of the United States of America: Therefore be it
 5 **RESOLVED,** by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of
 6 America in Congress assembled, That the state of war between the United
 7 States and the Government of the Islamic Republic of Iran which has thus
 8 been thrust upon the United States is hereby formally declared; and the

 12 and, to bring the conflict to a successful termination, all of the resources of
 13 the country are hereby pledged by the Congress of the United States.

2 is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States,

Article 28:

- 6 **SECTION 1.** Senators will serve no more than three terms in office.
7 **SECTION 2.** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

A Bill to Eliminate Zoos

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall eliminate all zoos.

2 **SECTION 2.** ZOOS IS DEFINED AS A FACILITY WITH USUALLY INDOOR AND OUTDOOR SETTINGS WHERE LIVING,
3 TYPICALLY WILD ANIMALS ARE KEPT ESPECIALLY FOR PUBLIC EXHIBITION

4 **SECTION 3.** The United States Department of Agriculture in association with the
5 United States Department of Fish and Wildlife shall oversee and enforce
6 this legislation through a series of checks once a month to ensure zoos
7 are working towards elimination, and shall continue these checks until
8 the elimination of zoos is complete

9
10 A. All zoos will be given 2 years from the time of passage to fully close all
11 operations.

12 B. 4 billion dollars shall be reallocated from the department of defense
13 to fund the checks, and other costs associated with this legislation.

14 C. Zoos who do not meet the monthly requirements, and/or have not
15 ceased operations by the designated time shall be fined \$500,000 per
each offense.

16 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect January 1st 2021

17 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Invest in Affordable Higher Education

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** \$200 Billion will be invested over the next ten years to establish
2 free-to-attend community colleges throughout the United States
- 3 **SECTION 2.** All publically owned and operated community colleges in the United
4 States will be required to lift all costs from the students. Those who fail to
5 do so will no longer receive federal funding
- 6 **SECTION 3.** The Federal Department of Education, in cooperation with state
7 Departments of Education, shall be responsible for building and
8 maintaining these institutions. The federal Department of Education shall
9 provide annual stipends to State governments based on the quantity and
10 impact of the state's institutions.
- 11 A. Funding for this bill reallocated from the defense budget
- 12 **SECTION 4.** The provisions of this bill will take effect immediately upon passage.
- 13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Add Women to Selective Service

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** A. As we move towards a more equal society, we hereby require women to
2 register for selective service when they come of age.

3 B. All women between 18-35 will have six months to register. All women
4 who turned 18-35 before the legislation is enacted have six months to register.

5 **SECTION 2.** People affected are all female United States citizens and all attempting to
6 be citizens.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Selective Service System will oversee and implement this bill. After
8 the implementation of this bill, women will have equal Selective Service requirements
9 to men.

10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect May of 2020.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation is hereby declared null and void.
