

#### The Medicare Public Option Act of 2020

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Medicare will now be available in the health insurance exchanges to every US citizen, regardless of age or income. Current budgeting methods used for Medicare shall continue to be used to fund the plan in part or in whole.

**SECTION 2**. The following definitions will be applied:

A. "Medicare" shall be defined as the national federal health insurance program available to those above the age of 65 and to anyone with disability status.

B. "Current budgeting methods" is defined as the premiums paid by those enrolled in Medicare.

**SECTION 3.** The Department of Health and Human Services will oversee the funding implementation of this legislation.

A. \$2 Billion in Congressional funds shall be allocated for any start-up costs.

**SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect January 1, 2021.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

- 4 SECTION 2. The Peninsula Shield Force is defined as the military arm of the Gulf
- 5 Cooperation Council.
- 6 **SECTION 3.** All enforcement for this legislation will come through the Department of
- Defense and the Department of State as to the executive branch. No
- funding is necessary for the passage of this bill.
- 9 **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect immediately upon passage
- SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

5	WHEREAS,	The Incirlik Air Base is only a few hundred miles from Syrian borders and
6		is highly vulnerable; and
7	WHEREAS,	Incirlik Air Base is currently the largest U.S nuclear weapons storage
8		facility in Europe; and
9	WHEREAS,	The State and Energy Department shall oversee the removal of these B-
10		61 Gravity Nuclear Bombs; now, therefore, be it
11	RESOLVED,	By the Congress here assembled that the United States remove all B-61
12		Gravity Nuclear Bombs from the Republic of Turkey.

10	WHEREAS,	The United States has gained considerable economic benefit from oil
11		from the Middle East, including a boost in transportation availability due
12		to lowered gas prices and inexpensive public transportation, as well as
13		improvement in the US economy overall; now, therefore, be it
14	RESOLVED,	The United States should increase fracking operations throughout the
15		Middle East to boost oil production and gain benefits of trade with Saudi
16		Arabia.

- 5 **SECTION 2**. Biodegradable plastic shall be defined as capable of being broken down
- 6 into harmless products.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Interior and the Environmental Protection Agency will
- 8 oversee the research.
- 9 **SECTION 4.** This bill shall take effect January 1, 2021.
- SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
