A Resolution That Provides Assistance to Vietnam with the Aftermath of Agent Orange/Bioxsine

Whereas, United States assistance to Vietnam for the environmental and health damage attributed to a dioxin contained in Agent Orange and other herbicides sprayed over much of the southern portion of the country during the Vietnam War remains a major bilateral issue; and

Whereas, Most of the appropriated funds have been used by USAID for the environmental cleanup of Danang airport, one of the major air bases used for storing and spraying the herbicides between 1961 and 1971. A lesser amount of the appropriated funds have been used by USAID for assistance to Vietnam's persons with disabilities, generally, but not always in the vicinity of Danang or other dioxin-contaminated areas; and,

Whereas, Dioxin is a highly persistent chemical compound that lasts for many years in the environment is universally known to be a carcinogen and is highly toxic for wildlife and humans. Exposure to Bioxsine has numerous long term and short term effects. dioxin is linked to type 2 diabetes, immune system dysfunction, nerve disorders, muscular dysfunction, hormone disruption, and heart disease. Developing fetuses are particularly sensitive to dioxin, which is also linked to miscarriages, spina bifida and other problems with fetal brain and nervous system development. All of these impacts are under-compensated by the United States Federal Government; therefore, be it

Whereas,By this congress, that: The United States offers significant economic assistance For both the environment and health damages attributed to Bioxsine.

A Bill to Privatize Public Roads

Bidding begins effective immediately, closing on January 1 2020 at 12 a.m. PST. Unsold vehicles will be given to orphanages across the U.S. that can demonstrate a need for the vehicles. Remaining vehicles will be dumped into the Pacific Ocean. To increase the effectiveness of the Tesla Motors Cyber trucks, armor and weapons will be added at the discretion of the DoD.

Section 4 The bill takes effect immediately. The United States DoD will have complete control of the execution of the plan.

Section 5 All laws and policies in conflict with this bill are declared null and void.

A Bill to Abolish Life Sentences Without Possibility of Parole

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. No person shall be given a prison sentence of life without possibility of parole.

Section 2. All prison sentences shall have the possibility of parole after a period of no more than 15 years for nonviolent crimes and 30 years for violent crimes.

Section 3. The implementation of this bill shall be overseen by the Judicial Conference of the United States and the U.S. Probation and Pretrial Services System.

SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented by February 23, 2021.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill To Eliminate Daylight Savings Time

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. Daylight Savings Time shall be abolished across the United States. Daylight Savings Time shall be defined as a period of time in which all

Section 2.clocks are changed forward one hour for a period of 34 weeks from the second Sunday of March to the first Sunday of November.

Section 3.The Department of Transportation shall oversee the enforcement of this bill by mandating that once states transfer back over in November, standard time will be accepted indefinitely.

Section 4. This bill shall be implemented by the end of 2020.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Establish Chromosomal Identity Conformity in Sports

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. **SECTION 1**Be it enacted by this student congress that athletes wishing to compete in a sport must be put in the appropriate division according to their chromosomal identity.
- 4. **SECTION 2** Chromosomal identity is defined as the identity that is found through sequencing a person's DNA.
- 6. **SECTION 3** The Department of Education will oversee collegiate athletics, while the Department of Labor will oversee professional and international athletics. All athletes will need to submit their medical records and have DNA sequencing performed. If a person does not have this done or submit proof of this having been done, they will not be able to participate in any sport. If a person has a Y chromosome, they can only participate on an XY team, or in more familiar terms, a "men's" team. If they are without a Y chromosome, they can only participate on an XX team, or in more familiar terms, a "women's" team. Any violators of this law shall be fined \$1,000, blacklisted from competing in any sports, and up to 30 days of jail time.
- 18. **SECTION 4** This policy will be implemented starting July 1st, 2020, affecting All college, professional, and international sports teams and competitions.
- 21. **SECTION 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
