REMINDERS

- 1. All extemporaneous speaking competitors must report to the prep room 30 minutes prior to each round. We will strictly adhere to the draw times, and no extra time will be given to tardy competitors. Extemp speakers may not talk and/or collaborate during preparation of their speeches and must remain in the prep room until dismissed by the chairperson. Failure to follow these rules may result in disqualification from the tournament.
- 2. SPEECH: The first speaker in the round must write the codes in the correct speaking order on the board in the classroom. ALL COMPETITORS, however, must check the posting sheets to ensure accuracy. The last speaker should erase the boards.
- 3. DEBATE: It is the responsibility of the First Affirmative speaker(s) in the round to write the codes, on the correct side, on the board in the classroom. Any deviation from the posting sheets will result in an automatic loss of the round for BOTH teams. The last Negative speaker should erase the boards.
- 4. We will be using two (2) judges for each room at this tournament. Students should wait **outside** of the rooms until at least one judge is present. They should not begin the round until <u>BOTH</u> judges are present.
- 5. ALL contestants entered in Public Forum and Lincoln-Douglas Debates must check in with the judges prior to the beginning of each round. The second panel of debaters should wait outside the room or return to the student lounge until the first panel has completed the debate. The first panel must vacate the room after competing.
- 6. Competitors in LD and Policy debate will be pre-scheduled into at least one Affirmative and one Negative round. In the remaining round the competitors will flip for sides.
- 7. A debate contestant (Policy) that has a bye may not watch a debate in their category. A debate contestant (LD or PFD) that has an asterisk after their code will debate twice in that round.
- 8. You should never debate the same competitor twice within a single tournament.
- 9. We appreciate any timekeepers your school can provide. Rounds should begin, even if no timekeeper is available. Competitors can keep time for themselves and/or one another.
- 10. Absolutely no food or drink other than capped water bottles is allowed in the classrooms. Do not use any trashcan in the classrooms.
- 11. Don't leave valuables unattended.
- 12. Observers are allowed and encouraged to watch. Observers may flow debates until Jan. 1. Please be supportive of all competitors.
- 13. The "coach-in-charge" should be present on the campus at all times.

 Resolved: "The benefits of the United States federal government's use of offensive cyber operations outweigh the harms."
- <u>LINCOLN-DOUGLAS DEBATE (NOVICE and CHAMPIONSHIP)</u>: **NSDA 2019 November/December LD Topic** "Resolved: *The United States ought to eliminate subsidies for fossil fuels.*"
- <u>POLICY DEBATE (JUNIOR VARSITY and VARSITY)</u>: **NSDA 2019-2020 Topic**—"Resolved: *The United States federal government should substantially reduce Direct Commercial Sales and/or Foreign Military Sales of arms from the United States.*"
- 15. Certificates will be presented to participants in speech events who earn three or more superiors, in debate events who earn wins from more than half of their judges, and to the top congressional debaters. Two team trophies will be awarded in speech events: one to the school with the largest number of superiors and the other to the school with the highest percentage of superiors. Two team trophies will be awarded in debate events: one to the school with the largest number of wins and the other to school with the highest percentage of wins. Teams must have at least five (5) entries in speech and/or debate to qualify for the team trophies.
- 16. Please maintain the cleanliness of your area. We are guests of this school and if we want to return, you must assist in keeping the campus clean. To facilitate this, every coach should bring trash bags and cleaning supplies to the tournament. Please put your rubbish in your own trash bag and place in the nearest dumpster at the end of the tournament so as not to overload existing trash cans. At the end of the tournament wipe down the tables you used.

CLEANING ASSIGNMENTS: In an effort to leave the school campus in the same shape as when we arrived, we have assigned each school a few competition rooms to be in charge of.
