	A Bill to Fo	rgive All Student Loan Debt to Boost the American Workforce
1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	All Americans with incurred student loan debts, federal or private,
3		will be forgiven by the federal government for their loan.
4	SECTION 2.	A student loan is a type of loan designed to help students pay for
5		post-secondary education and the associated fees, such as tuition,
6		books and supplies, and living expenses.
7	SECTION 3.	The Department of Education will implement this legislation.
8	A.	The Secretary of Education will forgive the outstanding balances on
9		all federal student loans. For private student loans, the Secretary of
10		Education will pay the unpaid principal, accrued unpaid interest, and
11		any late charges owed to a private student lender. The Department
12		of Education will open loan forgiveness applications which
13		borrowers can apply to for up to 6 months after implementation of
14		this legislation.
15	B.	This legislation shall be funded by taxing stock trades at 0.5 percent
16		bond trades at 0.1 percent, and derivative transactions at 0.005
17		percent.
18	SECTION 4.	This bill will be implemented at the start of fiscal year 2021.
19	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
20		void.

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to End Partisan Gerrymandering		
1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	RESOLVED,	By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following
3		article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the
4		United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as
5		part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of
6		three-fourths of the several states:
7		ARTICLE
8	SECTION 1.	Each contested state shall be required to establish an independent,
9		non-partisan commission to determine congressional district
10		boundaries.
11	SECTION 2.	A contested state shall be defined as a state with more than one
12		representative to the United States House of Representatives.
13	SECTION 3.	Any state who does not maintain compliance shall be prohibited
14		from having voting members in the United States House of
15		Representatives or United States Senate until compliance is met.
16		Members of these delegations may continue to carry out their other
17		duties of office, but may not vote on any matter before the United
18		States House of Representative or United States Senate until
19		compliance is met.
20	SECTION 4.	Each state's commission shall also meet one of the following
21		requirements:
22	A.	The commission is made up of random citizens selected in a similar
23		manner to a jury selection; or
24	B.	The commission is made up of independent, non-partisan
25		redistricting experts; or
26	C.	The commission is made up of a combination of citizens and experts
27		discussed in subsections "A" and "B" respectively.
28	SECTION 5.	The Congress shall have the power to enforce this article by
29		appropriate legislation

## SF3 A Bill to Ban Forced Arbitration

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: 1 **SECTION 1**. Predispute arbitration agreements are hereby prohibited from being 2 3 valid or enforceable if it requires arbitration of an employment, consumer, antitrust, or civil rights dispute. 4 SECTION 2. "Predispute arbitration agreements" is defined as an agreement 5 6 made by parties in a contract before any issues or problems arise. 7 The agreement mandates that any disputes that the parties have will be handled not in a court system, but through binding 8 9 arbitration. 10 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Labor and the Department of Justice shall 11 enforce this legislation. 12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage. 13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. 14
