A Bill to Instill a Maximum Cost of College Attendance

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. All public colleges will institute a ceiling on the cost of attendance of \$30,000
- ger year.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** Cost of attendance includes, tuition, fees, room and board.
- 5 **SECTION 3**. The Department of Education will oversee the implementation of this bill.
- 6 A. Schools which fail to adhere to this ceiling shall not receive Federal loans
- 7 or grants.
- 8 **SECTION 4**. Implementation of the bill will begin at the commencement of the 2018-19
- 9 academic year.
- 10 **SECTION 5**. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Eliminate the Pink Tax to Establish Economic Gender Equality

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2	SECTION 1 . It shall be unlawful to sell any two consumer products from the same manufacturer
3	or service-provider that are substantially similar if such products are priced
4	differently based only on the gender of the individuals for whose use the products
5	are intended or marketed.
6	SECTION 2 . The following definitions shall apply:
7	A. Consumer products shall include any product or service for sale.
8	B. Intended gender for consumers of products can be determined through use of
9	"for her, for women, for girls" or similar phrases in marketing and/or by the
10	pink color of a product.
11	SECTION 3. The Federal Trade Commission shall ensure compliance with this bill.
12	A. Any manufacturer or service provider that fails to comply with this bill will be
13	fined 1 million dollars for each product in non-compliance.
14	B. 50% of all monies collected through fines will be donated to charities for
15	women and girls; the FTC will determine the specific charities on a yearly basis.
16	C. Any fined manufacturer or service provider will be required to undergo specific
17	training programs at their own expense; the FTC will determine the appropriate
18	programs.
19	SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented upon passage.
20	SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

A Resolution Condemning all Forms of Anti-Asian Sentiment as Related to Covid-19

1 WHEREAS,	23,000,000 Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders account for 7 percent of the
2	Nation's population in the United States; and
3 WHEREAS,	over 2,000,000 Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders are working on the
4	frontlines of this COVID-19 pandemic in health care, law enforcement, first
5	responders, transportation, supermarkets, and other service industries; and
6 WHEREAS,	the use of anti-Asian terminology and rhetoric related to COVID-19, such as the
7	Chinese Virus, Wuhan Virus, and Kung-flu have perpetuated anti-Asian stigma;
8	and
9 WHEREAS,	since January 2020, there has been a dramatic increase in reports of hate crimes
10	and incidents against those of Asian descent; and
11 WHEREAS,	the increased use of anti-Asian rhetoric has also resulted in Asian-American
12	businesses being targeted for vandalism; and
13 WHEREAS,	in 2015, the WHO issued guidance calling on media outlets, scientists, and
14	national authorities to avoid naming infectious diseases for locations to avoid
15	stigmatizing groups of people; and
16 WHEREAS,	the Secretary General of the United Nations called for international solidarity
17	and an end to any ill-founded discrimination of the outbreak's victims; now,
18	therefore, be it
19 RESOLVED ,	By the Congress here assembled that all public officials should condemn and
20	denounce any and all anti-Asian sentiment in any form, condemn all
21	manifestations of expressions of racism, xenophobia, discrimination, anti-Asian
22	sentiment, scapegoating, and ethnic or religious intolerance, and recommit to
23	building more inclusive, diverse, and tolerant societies

A Bill to Reform the Federal Judiciary to Reflect Gender Equality

2 SECT	ΓΙΟΝ 1.	A. 28 U.S.C. §1 be amended to state: "the Supreme Court of the United States shall consist
3		of a Chief Justice of the United States and eight associate justices, five of whom shall be
4		women, and any six of whom shall constitute a quorum."
5		B. A Gender Equality Bench Protocol be implemented to guide the federal judiciary in
6		adjudication.
7 SECT	ΓΙΟΝ 2.	The Gender Equality Bench Protocol will promote awareness of ways in which gender
8		intersects with other social statuses to affect the justice system, provide tools to help
9		judicial officers achieve gender-sensitive adjudication, and will be modeled after
10		comparable protocols in place around the world, such as Belize's "Justice Through a Gender
11		Lens: Gender Equality Protocol for Judicial Officers" and Mexico's "Judicial Decision-Making
12		with a Fender Perspective: A Protocol."
13 SEC	CTION 3.	. The United States House Judiciary Committee and Department of Justice will be tasked
14		with developing, implementing, and monitoring the progress of the Gender Equality Bench
15		Protocol.
16 SEC	CTION 4.	. This legislation will go into effect immediately. The Supreme Court will have until
17		December 31, 2030 to meet parity requirements.

18 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Marijuana Opportunity Reinvestment and Expungement Act

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1 . Not later than 180 days after passage of this Act, the Attorney General shall finalize		
3	rulemaking under 21 U.S.C. 812 §201(a)(2) removing marihuana and	
4	tetrahydrocannabinols from schedules of controlled substance, so that manufacturing,	
5	distribution, or possession of such substances no longer warrants criminal penalties. Such	
6	rulemaking shall apply to purposes of any offense committed, case pending, or conviction	
7	entered before, on, or after the date of enactment of this Act.	
8 SECTION 2. A	All statutory references of "marijuana" and "marihuana" shall be replaced with	
9 "	cannabis."	
10 SECTION 3.	Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (26 USC), §5701, is amended to establish a 5% tax to be	
11	collected on cannabis products in the same manner as certain tobacco products, and	
12	deposited in a trust fund, the Opportunity Trust Fund, herewith established to support	
13	programs and services for individuals and business in communities impacted by the war	
14	on drugs.	
15 SECTION 4.	The Small Business Administration shall establish loans and services for entities that are	
16	cannabis-related legitimate businesses or service providers.	
17 SECTION 5.	Federal public benefits, as well as persecutions under immigration laws, shall be	
18	prohibited on the basis of cannabis-related conduct or conviction.	
19 SECTION 6. A process shall be established to expunge convictions and conduct sentencing review		
20	hearings related to federal cannabis offenses.	
21 SECTION 7.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Institute a Sugar Tax

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 **SECTION 1**. A tax will be implemented on all beverages containing 5 or more grams of sugar per 100 milliliters
- 4 **SECTION 2.** The following definitions will apply:
- A. A sugar tax will be defined as \$.25 per liter of beverage containing sugar.
- B. The revenue from the tax will be allocated to address obesity, diabetes, and
- 7 related health conditions.
- 8 **SECTION 3.** The Food and Drug Administration and the Internal Revenue Service will
- 9 oversee the enforcement of this legislation.
- 10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect immediately upon passage.
- 11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Disarm Patrol Officers

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1 .	This bill shall prohibit patrol officers from carrying and/or using a firearm.
3 SECTION 2.	"Patrol officers" shall be defined as police officers that are assigned to a
4	specific geographic area, also known as a "beat cop". "Firearm" is
5	defined as a rifle, pistol or any other portable gun.
6 SECTION 3.	The enforcement will be through the Department of Justice
7	A. If a state or local law enforcement agency does not abide by this
8	law, they will lose all federal funding for law enforcement.

- 9 **SECTION 4**. This legislation shall be implemented immediately.
- 10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Require Cultural Competence Training for Medical Schools

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1	1. All medical schools receiving federal funding will be required to provide		
3	cultural competence training to all students. This training must occur at		
4	least once during a medical program. All training must be reviewed by		
5	the Department of Health and Human Services to ensure compliance.		
6 SECTION 2	2. Cultural competence training will cover implicit bias and communication		
7	strategies designed to provide all medical students with an understanding		
8	of how to better serve those from all ethnic and racial backgrounds.		
9 SECTION 3 . The Department of Health and Human Services will work with the			
10	Department of Education to implement this legislation.		
11	A. The Department of Health and Human Services will ensure the		
12	content of the training is effective.		
13	B. The Department of Education will oversee the implementation and		
14	evaluation of the program. Any school found not in compliance may		
15	lose access to federal funding until such time as they become		
16	compliant with Section 1.		
17 SECTION	4. This legislation will go into effect two years after passage.		

18 **SECTION 5**. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
