A Bill to Provide Bat Housing in Housing Communities

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:					
2	SECTION 1.	The State of California shall require all new housing developments to install				
3		one bat house for every 45 new housing units (or one for every new housing				
4		development of less than 45 units), unless the developer can prove that bats				
5		are living in a cave or bridge less than 1 mile from the center of such new				
6		development.				
7	SECTION 2.	The California Environmental Protection Agency (CalEPA) shall set up a				
8		committee to create regulations on the design and placement of bat houses				
9		before the effective date of this legislation. The regulations should aim to				
10		increase bat populations in California without harming or inhibiting the				
11		human population in a housing development				
12	SECTION 3.	The inspection requirements for this bill shall be added to the CalEPA				
13		Guidance Document for Inspection and Enforcement and shall be inspected				
14		by Unified Program Agencies (UPA's).				
15		A. If the housing developer is required to build and place a bat house a UPA				
16		inspector shall inspect it according to the regulations set by the CalEPA				
17		committee.				
18		B. If the housing developer claims bats are living under a bridge or a cave				
19		less than one mile from the center of the housing development the UPA				
20		inspector must have evidence of said bats or bat droppings and provide				
21		such evidence to their superiors.				
22		C. If the UPA inspector finds that bat housing is not up to code or the				
23		developer does not provide evidence of bats living nearby mentioned in				
24		section 3B, then the UPA must notify the local permitting authority that				
25		it may not issue a Certificate of Occupancy for all houses in said				
26		development.				
27	SECTION 4.	A \$6.50 per acre development tax shall be added to all development plans				
28		submitted in the state until this law takes effect. The proceeds from the tax				
29		shall be allotted to the California Environmental Protection Agency for				
30		research and salaries until this law takes effect.				
31	SECTION 5.	This law shall take effect on January 1st, 2023.				
32	SECTION 6.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Revising Gun Laws in the Event of a Zombie Apocalypse

1	Whereas extraordina	ary circumstances	often	necessitate	exceptions t	o and/or	suspension	of

some laws in order to protect the safety of the public, and

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- Whereas in extraordinary circumstances people may need to protect themselves because
- 4 police officers may be overwhelmed or unavailable, therefore,
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
 - SECTION 1. California Penal Code section 25850 (carrying a loaded firearm in a vehicle or public place), and California Penal Code section 25400 (carrying a concealed firearm without a proper permit), may be temporarily suspended upon declaration of the Governor for designated areas of the state or the state as a whole in the event of widespread civil unrest, loss of public utilities and/or public services due to natural disasters, or zombie apocalypse.
 - **SECTION 2.** In any circumstance listed above that results in a general loss of communication such that no notification could have been made, a person may reasonably assume that a temporary suspension of firearms restrictions exists.
 - **SECTION 3.** This law shall be in effect immediately upon passage.

A Bill to Permit the Sale of Live-Donor Organs

- Whereas there is a shortage of kidneys available for those in need of a transplant, and
- Whereas laws prohibit individuals from profiting from the sale of their own organs, and
- Whereas allowing financial compensation would increase the number of kidneys available,
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** The National Organ Transplant Act of 1984 (NOTA) shall be amended to eliminate the federal ban on the sale of live-donor organs.
- 7 **SECTION 2.** This change shall be in effect immediately upon passage
- 8 **SECTION 3.** All laws in conflict are hereby declared null and void.
