

**A Bill to Reform the Postal Service’s Allocation of Retiree Health Benefits**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States Postal Service (USPS) shall invest 15% of its Retiree Health  
3 Benefits Fund (RHBF) into index funds and another 15% using high frequency  
4 trading (HFT). The money from these investments shall go to the RHBF.

5 **SECTION 2.** A. The RHBF of the United States Postal Service is defined as the fund that pays  
6 for the retiree health benefits of USPS postal workers. The RHBF is currently  
7 only allowed to be invested in U.S. Treasury securities.

8 B. High Frequency Trading is defined as using algorithmic systems in computers  
9 to transact large numbers of orders in the market at high speeds.

10 C. An index fund is defined as a type of mutual fund whose holdings track a  
11 particular market index.

12 **SECTION 3.** A. The United States Postal Service shall be responsible for enforcing the  
13 provisions of this bill.

14 B. The USPS Office of Inspector General shall perform quarterly audits on the  
15 investments made with the RHBF fund.

16 **SECTION 4.** The provisions of this bill shall take effect on October 1, 2021.

17 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Reform Health Care in Public Prisons**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States government shall allocate \$5 million to inmate health care in  
3 federally owned prisons.

4 **SECTION 2.** Inmate health care is considered as any treatments, medications, and immediate  
5 care necessary for ill or injured inmates.

6 **SECTION 3.** A. The Department of Justice and the Department of Health and Human Services  
7 shall be responsible for enforcing the provisions of this bill.

8 B. The Federal Bureau of Prisons shall be responsible for overseeing and enacting  
9 the changes.

10 **SECTION 4.** The provisions of this bill shall take effect six months after passage.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Abolish Privatized Prisons**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Privatized prisons affecting interstate commerce shall be required to halt and  
3 abolish their facilities.

4 **SECTION 2.** A. Prisoners will be reassigned to public prisons operated by the United States  
5 and state governments.

6 B. Stipends will be redirected towards funding for public prisons on the state and  
7 federal level.

8 **SECTION 3.** A. The Department of Justice shall be responsible for enforcing the provisions of  
9 this bill.

10 B. The Department of Justice shall deny federal funds to states that fail to carry  
11 out the abolishment of privatized prisons.

12 **SECTION 4.** The provisions of this bill shall take effect immediately upon passage.

13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Resolution to Impeach Donald Trump for High Crimes and Misdemeanors**

12 John Trump for high crimes and misdemeanors; and be it

13 **FURTHER RESOLVED**, that Donald John Trump be disqualified from holding and enjoying

14 any office of honor, trust, or profit under the United States.

Adoption of the resolution, i.e., conviction, shall require a **two-thirds vote**. If the resolution is adopted, a **majority vote** shall be taken on the following question: “**Shall Donald John Trump be disqualified from holding and enjoying and office of honor, trust, or profit under the United States?**”

**A Bill to Limit Financial Compensation Awarded in Civil Cases**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Compensation awarded to a civil plaintiff shall not exceed eighty percent of the  
3 yearly earnings of the defendant.

4 **SECTION 2.** A. In tort cases against individual defendants, awarded compensation will be  
5 limited to seventy-five percent of the annual income of the annual income of the  
6 defendant.

7 B. In tort cases against corporate defendants, awarded compensation will be  
8 limited to eighty percent of the corporation's annual revenue.

9 **SECTION 3.** The federal courts shall have jurisdiction over all cases and controversies arising  
10 under the provisions of this bill, subject to the limitations of Article III, Section 2  
11 of the Constitution of the United States.

12 **SECTION 4.** The provisions of this bill shall take effect on January 1, 2022.

13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

3 from Uranium mining.

4 **SECTION 2.** All future mining endeavors will be prohibited under this legislation.

5 **SECTION 3.** The Department of the Interior shall be responsible for enforcing the provisions of  
6 this bill.

7 **SECTION 4.** The provisions of this bill shall take effect one year after passage.

8 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Reduce Military Spending**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall reduce military spending by nine percent.

3 **SECTION 2.** “Military spending” shall be defined as the amount of financial resources  
4 dedicated by the United States to raising and maintaining the armed forces or  
5 other entities essential for defense purposes.

6 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Defense shall be responsible for enforcing the provisions of  
7 this bill.

8 **SECTION 4.** The provisions of this bill shall take effect immediately upon passage.

9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Resolution to Replace the Gas Tax with a Mileage Tax**

8 Fund unable to fulfill its duties; and

9 **WHEREAS,** A nationwide mileage tax based upon the number of miles driven would not only  
10 be sustainable but also apply to every single car on the road; now, therefore be it

11 **RESOLVED,** That the Student Congress here assembled calls for the creation of a nationwide  
12 mileage tax and the removal of the nationwide gas tax.

**A Resolution to Combat Tech Monopolies**

1 **WHEREAS,** Companies in the tech industry such as Amazon, Google, and Facebook routinely  
2 act in a manner that stifles competition; and

3 **WHEREAS,** Such companies both provide a platform for commerce and participate on their  
4 own platforms; and

5 **WHEREAS,** These companies frequently fail to manage their platforms in a fair, reasonable,  
6 and nondiscriminatory way; and

7 **WHEREAS,** Tech companies' market share give them and their leadership outsized influence  
8 over public behavior and opinion; and

9 **WHEREAS,** Such monopolistic behavior is antithetical to both the free market and the  
10 marketplace of ideas; now, therefore, be it

11 **RESOLVED,** That the Student Congress here assembled demands that "platform utilities,"  
12 companies that offer to the public an online marketplace, an exchange, or a  
13 platform for connecting third parties, be closely regulated for fairness and  
14 nondiscrimination; and be it

15 **FURTHER RESOLVED,** That large platform utilities with annual gross revenue of \$25 million  
16 or more be broken up or otherwise prohibited from both owning and participating  
17 on their respective platforms.

**A Bill to Establish an Alternative Minimum Corporate Income Tax**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Publicly traded corporations shall be obligated to pay a minimum corporate  
3 income tax of 7 percent of publicly reported profits.

4 **SECTION 2.** A. As used herein, “publicly reported profits” are any profit figures reported to  
5 the Securities and Exchange Commission, used to obtain credit, or used for  
6 determining executive compensation, bonuses, or dividends. If multiple such  
7 figures exist, the highest of those amounts shall serve as the tax base.

8 B. If a corporation’s income tax obligation under existing law exceeds 7 percent  
9 of publicly reported profits, it shall be exempt from the minimum tax.

10 **SECTION 3.** A. The Department of the Treasury shall be responsible for enforcing the  
11 provisions of this bill.

12 B. A corporation that fails to report profits for purposes of evading the obligations  
13 of this bill shall be subject to a penalty equal to three times the tax owed.

14 C. The provisions of this bill shall apply retroactively to income on or after  
15 January 1, 2021.

16 **SECTION 4.** The provisions of this bill shall take effect immediately upon passage.

17 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
